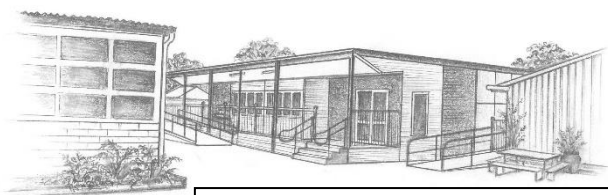

News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

We have had an extremely busy start to Term 4 and this is reflected in some of the programs, which are documented in this edition of the newsletter. We like to give our children as many learning opportunities as possible at school and away and it is fantastic to see that many of these programs are supported by families.

Today our Swimming Program began and it was great to see that many families have taken up this program again for 2019. We will be leaving school each day at about 12.20pm – if families would like to come with us on the bus let us know because there are some spare seats available. Swimming takes place each day from 1.00pm to 1.45pm for Group 1 and 1.45pm to 2.30pm for Group 2. We look forward to the week being a positive one – students are grouped based on their ability and specific needs. A huge pat on the back to all of the students who represented the school at the Division Athletics Carnival last Monday as well. It was great to see our school well represented and a big congratulation to Izzy and Jimmy who again represented the school at the Region Athletics Carnival at Albury on Friday. Obviously a very busy time for these families and I am sure that the kids are extremely grateful for being given such a terrific opportunity.

A reminder about the grade structures for next year - we have decided to split the Grade 1s in 2020. This will then allow us to have relative consistent and low class numbers across the whole school. In determining whether these children are in the F/1 or 1/2 class, many factors will be looked at. Among these will be the academic and social level of the students in this year level and we will endeavour to do what we think is best for this cohort of children. A big thank you to all of the families who attended the Cyber Safety Night last Wednesday also. This was an "eye opener" and a lot of relevant and at times confronting information was presented. I was pleased to hear that some of our kids had already taken some action in regard to this which will make them feel more comfortable into the future.

I would also like to thank all of our wonderful staff who assisted or stayed overnight at school on Friday night. From all accounts, everyone had a fun night and this experience will allow our kids to feel more comfortable next year when hopefully they will experience more camping opportunities away from home.

Unfortunately, Toni Marie is still out of action with OSH Care – so I will be stepping into this role again with some staff over the next few days. We hope that Toni Marie has a speedy recovery and we look forward to her returning in the not too distant future. **I look forward to catching up with parents throughout the week at School Council.**

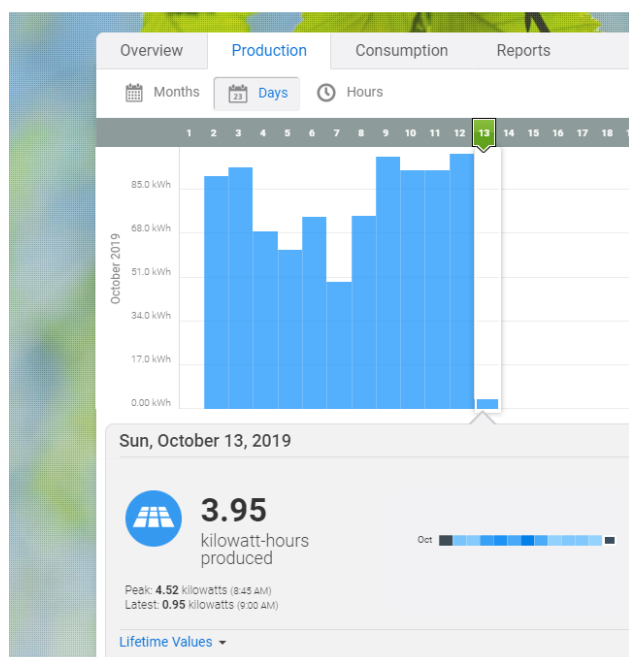

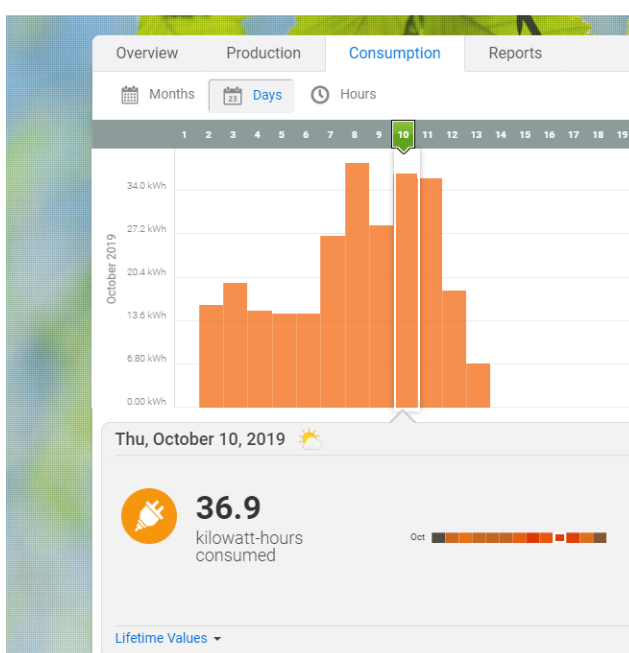

Tallygaroopna Occasional Care

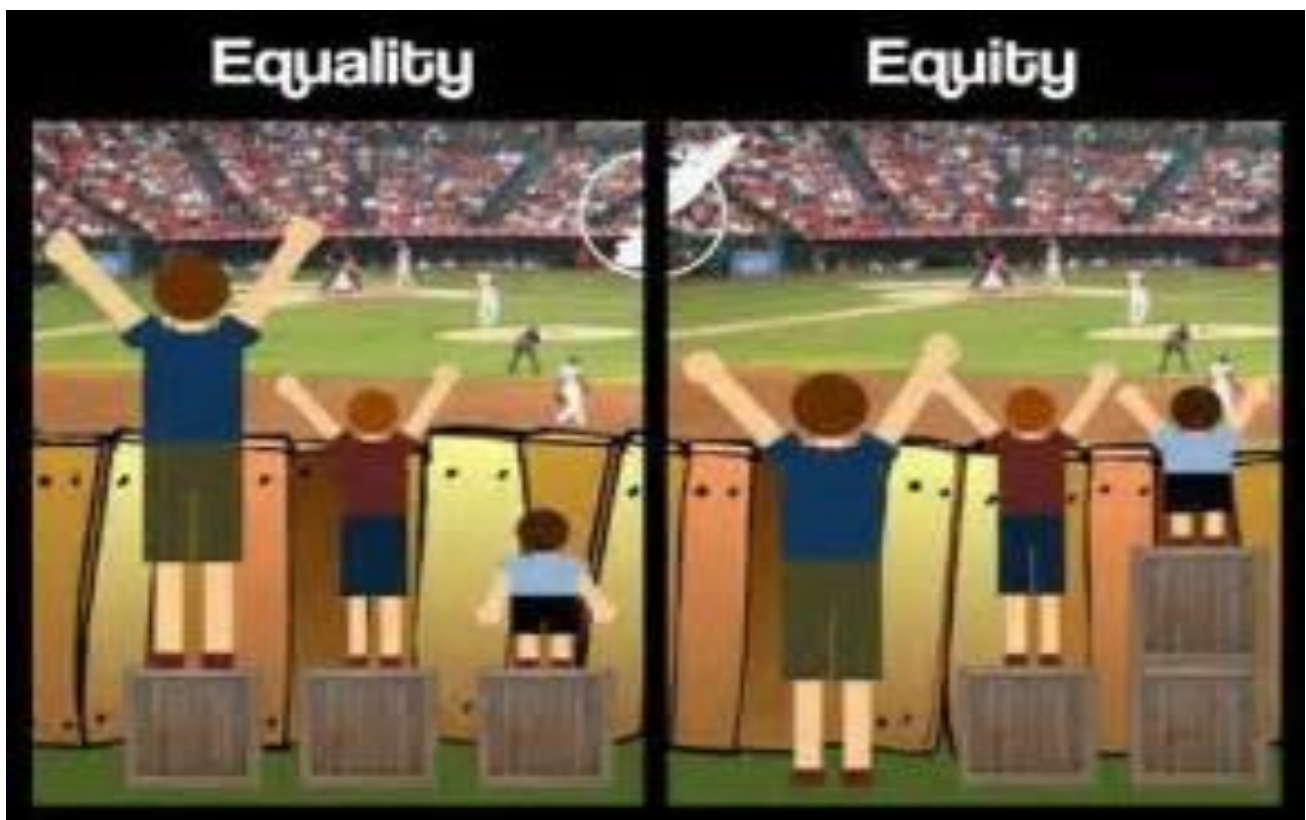

END OF YEAR EXCURSION – TALLYGAROPNA PS

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 6th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$25 per student and \$35 per parent / guardian (same price as 2018). This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$41.50 to \$49.50 per person

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment.** The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Flexibuzz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.

Uniform Voucher Process – Current Year 6 students (update from 9th Oct)

Greater Shepparton College (interim name) will be sending out Information Packs by the end of Week 2 Term 4 to all 2020 Year 7 Greater Shepparton College (interim name) students.

The form and information sheet about the uniform voucher will be included in this pack.

We will be asking current Year 6 parents/carers to please fill in the form indicating their choice of uniform retailer for each child (the uniform retailer options will be on the form), sign and return to McGuire College. Completed and signed forms for current Year 6 students need to be returned to McGuire College by **Wednesday 23 October 2019**.

Following receipt of the form, a voucher will be prepared for each child to the value of \$200 in the name of the requested uniform retailer, and distributed to students.

The voucher can then be redeemed from the nominated uniform retail shop.

Please ensure that you complete a form for your current Year 6 students if they will be attending the new school next year, so that your child can be included in the \$200 uniform voucher process.

If we do not receive a completed and signed form, we will not be able to factor your child's needs in or issue you with the uniform voucher.

1. Staffing Arrangements - 2020

I am currently going through the staffing process for 2020. This takes some time and I anticipate informing the community ASAP in regard to arrangements for the new year. Thanks for your patience with this matter. Mr Brodie.

It is pleasing to know that all of our Specialist programs will continue to be implemented next year with all of our current staff. We look forward to continuing to provide our children with a variety of learning opportunities across the curriculum.

2. School Payments

When making payment to the school bank account for multiple items, please make one direct deposit for the total amount with your family name listed and either email or FlexiBuzz a message to the office detailing the breakdown of the payment.

3. Enrolments / Grade Structures for 2020

At present, we look like beginning the new year with 83 students which continues to be positive for our school. Therefore, we will be having a 4th classroom again in 2020 and we are currently working on grade placements which we hope to confirm towards the end of the year. The grade structure for 2020 will be the following, but class numbers may change with any future alterations to enrolments.

Junior School

Foundation / Grade 1 – 18 students

Grade 1 / Grade 2 – 17 students

Senior School

Grade 3 / Grade 4 – 23 students

Grade 5 / Grade 6 – 25 students

We are pleased that we can again offer low classroom sizes across the whole school. This will obviously make our school an attractive learning environment for the future. If you would like to discuss grade placements for **Grade 1** students could you see Mr Brodie ASAP please. Placements for F/1 and 1/2 will be confirmed at the end of November and all families will receive a placement form with this information – stay tuned.

4. Swimming Program

Our Swimming Program began today and will continue daily until Friday 25th October. Students will swim for 45 minutes each day - there will be 2 specific groups to make the time in the water more effective – these will be from 1pm – 1.45pm and 1.45pm – 2.30pm . We will leave school at 12.20pm and return at approximately 3pm (lunch will be eaten at the normal time of 11.45am). **The cost for the program is \$55 per student, which covers bus costs and venue hire at Aquamoves in Shepparton. This fee is now due – thanks for being prompt with permission forms. Contact the school if you would like to know which group your child is swimming in.**

5. Grade 5/6 PowerPoints

The senior students will work on these over the next few weeks. We will utilise many photos that are on the school server, but students new to our school are encouraged to bring in any previous school photos that can be scanned and returned home. These PowerPoint presentations are an important component of the Grade 6 Graduation Night at the end of the year and reflect their time at primary school, not just TPS.

6. Yachting Program

Information will be sent home with the Grade 5/6 students this week and if students would like to participate could they please pay \$29 to the office by Wednesday 6th November. Permission forms will then be sent home to students who have paid for the program.

Date: Tuesday 12th November (1.15pm -2.45pm)

Venue: Shepparton Lake

Transport: To be confirmed (possibly parent helpers)

ASSEMBLY POINT: You will need to drive around the back of the lake on Tom Collins Drive to the green sheds.

Students need to bring: a pair of old sneakers to wear in the yacht and walking on land, bathers and towel, windproof jacket if cold, sunscreen, plastic bag for wet clothing, change of clothes and water bottle. Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's) will be supplied by Yachting Victoria.

7. Puberty Talks

Senior students in Grades 5/6 have an opportunity to participate in two puberty talks with a Sexual Health Nurse (Suzanne Wallis) from GV Health on Monday 11th November and Monday 18th November. Boys and girls will be separated during these sessions and Mr Brodie and Miss Lothian will accompany each group. The sessions begin at 2pm and conclude at 3.15pm. The boy's session will begin at 2pm with the girls program following at 2.40pm. Suzanne Wallis can be contacted by phoning 58323100 / 0427 564512 regarding the program if needed.

If you would prefer your child to not participate in this program contact the school please. This program is a component of the curriculum in the Victorian Curriculum. Specific information is provided below:

The Puberty Education information will be delivered over 2 sessions allowing for the opportunity for students to post anonymous questions or issues that they would like answered / addressed in the second session. The sessions are delivered to single gender groups to facilitate student comfort and participation.

Session 1

- What is puberty and why does it happen?
- Brainstorming activity on what changes occur, with discussion around the butcher's paper led by the students
- Viewing of YouTube educational cartoons on Puberty <https://www.youtube.com/user/watchwellcast>
- Distribute worksheets re: puberty to complete at home and hopefully stimulate conversations with parents

Session 2

- Review information delivered in Session 1
- Answer any questions / concerns / observations
- Menstruation / Pregnancy
- Be prepared kits (male & female)
- Where to get further information / resources / advice locally (If time permits touch on body image and media portrayal - photo-shop and true images)

8. Fruit Fly Program

All Grade 3/4 students from Miss Love's and Mrs Fitzpatrick's grades will participate in a Fruit Fly Program on Monday 28th October. This is being implemented by the Shepparton Lions Club free to our school and no equipment is needed. Students will make their own fruit fly traps and the Lions Club initiative, being resourced by the Goulburn Murray Valley Region Fruit Fly Project, aims to develop fruit fly awareness and trap making sessions for students in the region. The session will begin at midday and conclude at approximately 1.30pm and all are welcome.

9. Curriculum Day

Our last Curriculum Day for the year looks like being held on Monday 25th November. This will involve report writing, planning for 2020 and staff health & wellbeing. We hope to confirm this date at School Council this week. This is a pupil free day and families will need to make alternative arrangements – there will be no OSH Care on this day.

10. OSH Care this week

Toni Marie may still out of action this week unfortunately. Staff will be filling in again to ensure that our families continue to be supported with this program.

11. Essential Mathematics

Our school has received some funding to trial a new Assessment Program called Essential Mathematics. All students should now have specific passwords and usernames to access this resource online and families are encouraged to take a look at this program away from the school environment if possible. Feel free to contact the school if you need any help.

12. Cyber Safety Night – follow up

Thanks to the many families who attended this session last week and we hope that the information presented was useful. We have 5 presentations that are available to families to utilise as a follow up – these have been sent out to the whole school community via Flexibuzz.

13. Chaplaincy – 2020

We are still awaiting on specific information in regard to extending the Chaplaincy Program for a further 12 months. We hope to be able to do this is the next week or two and also confirm staffing arrangements for this program as well – stay tuned.

14. Camps for 2020

At school council last term, school council members agreed that in the future families will be asked to pay a non-refundable deposit rather than give an expression of interest. This will aid planning as the school has had to cover costs in the past with families withdrawing their expression of interest.

It was agreed that a deposit of \$100 was required to secure positions on future camps. This needed to be done by Friday 11th October. Obviously, camps for 2020 want a deposit from the school now and bookings are filling fast. After consulting with the Urban Camp last week – we are pleased to announce that the Grade 5/6 will go ahead. We are still awaiting to hear back from Camp Kookaburra in regard to the Grade 3/4 camp. If this does not go ahead – further arrangements may be made. If a Grade 3/4 camp does not go ahead – these families will receive a full refund.

Camps planned for 2020 are:

- Grade 3/4 Camp (Camp Curumbene - now Camp Kookaburra) - Monday 31st August to Wednesday 2nd September (Cost in 2018 was \$221)
- Grade 5/6 Camp (Urban Camp to Melbourne) - Monday 30th November to Wednesday 2nd December (Cost in 2018 was \$250)

Unfortunately our numbers have dropped and it would be terrific to see some new permanent or casual placements in this service, which operates from 3.25pm to 6pm, 5 days a week. **If you apply for the Child Care Subsidy, the cost can be a lot lower than you would anticipate.** This service to our families involves a large financial commitment by School Council and we will be discussing the sustainability of this program in the next couple of weeks. Our OSH Care service has been in operation since 2014 and as our school has grown we had hoped that enrolments in this service would continue to grow. We currently aim for 25 places filled each week. **A survey was distributed a few weeks ago to the eldest child in each family (also on Flexibuzz) – reply online please if possible.**
