Hi everyone

It was great to see some of our students and staff back last week after a difficult few days with the floods. This obviously resulted in our school closed from Monday to Wednesday and unfortunately some members of our school community have been impacted from this event. I can assure everyone that we are here to help, don't hesitate to contact me if you need some assistance – some support agencies are in this edition of the newsletter. Our bus still did not run today because of the uncertainty with local roads, but Dyson's Bus Lines are looking into this and we hope to have things back to normal soon. Our Swimming Program is cancelled for the foreseeable future but I will endeavour to contact Aquamoves when they have this venue operational again – I would anticipate no program for 2023 unfortunately.

We have had to alter some dates for our School Review because of the flooding situation as well. This won't begin now until November 8th and we have added an extra day at the end on November 24th. This review will allow our school to set some new goals and targets for the next few years and there will be opportunities for members of the school community to participate. In this edition of the newsletter there is a summary of results from the Parent / Carers Opinion Survey. 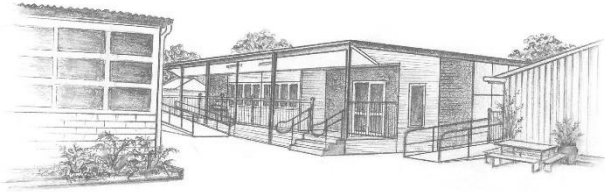


Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school.

Dear parents and carers

You may be aware that the Victorian Government has announced changes to the COVID-19 isolation requirements.

This means that from 11.59pm on Wednesday 12 October, the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 have ended and instead we move to health advice and recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms.

Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health **strongly recommends** that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community.

We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases.

Free rapid antigen tests are available at the school for those who need them.

Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school.

Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so.

To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures.

Thanks for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 16th December 2022. The Parents Club have kindly offered to pay for the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$29 per student and \$29 per parent / guardian. This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$48 to \$55 per person

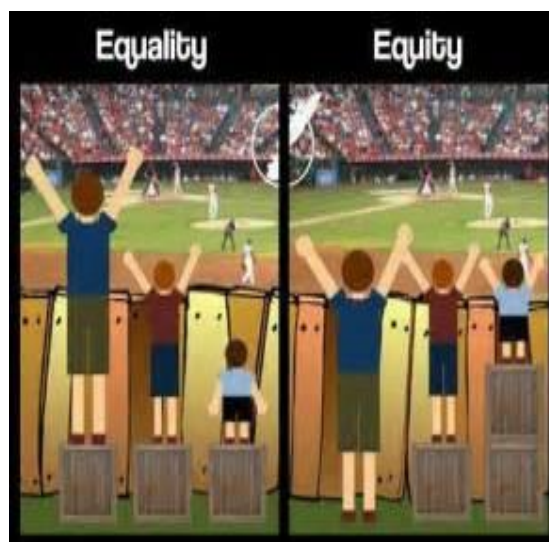

6. Tutoring Program - 2023

The State Government is extending its successful Tutor Learning Initiative in 2023, making sure Victorian students continue to get the individual support they need to thrive and succeed throughout their schooling. An independent evaluation by Deloitte found 88 per cent of primary school principals and 75 per cent of secondary school principals surveyed reported improvements in students' achievements they attributed to the tutors.

Tutors work in small groups to provide tailored support for identified students who need assistance to catch up – regardless of their circumstances or background. The Tutor Learning Initiative builds on the Government's investment of more than \$131 million in the *Victorian Budget 2022/23* to lift key literacy and numeracy outcomes, bringing more students into higher achievement bands – setting them up for success throughout their education and in life. This investment includes \$87.2 million for the Middle Years Literacy and Numeracy Strategy, identifying students who need more support to leave high school with the skills they need for work and study, and \$27.4 million to support the rollout of the Teaching Excellence Program across Melbourne and regional Victoria.

The extension of tutors in 2023 will also ensure teaching teams can continue to provide dedicated and individualised support for students who need help. Individual schools determine how tutoring support is implemented.
