News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

It is fantastic to see that some restrictions are soon being eased in line with COVID-19 and these come into place for schools on Monday 1st November. These are summarised in this edition of the newsletter, but it is important to remember that visitors to school premises are still limited to essential school services and operations. Continue to do the right thing and abide by the restrictions that we are faced with – hopefully more will continue to be eased in the near future.

Last week, Karen made contact with some families in regard to some attendance which we were trying to follow up. Thanks to those families who were able to put through specific notifications on Skool Loop – please do this as soon as possible if you haven't had time to do so yet. Your support with this matter would be appreciated.

In this edition of the newsletter, there are some important items relating to some excursions which we are hoping to organise before the end of the year. 

- a description of the areas of the Victorian Curriculum taught
- for English, Mathematics and all other curriculum areas taught:
 - o student achievement information represented on a continuum of learning;
 - o progress made since the last time these curriculum areas were reported on;
 - o a five-point scale.

Parents/carers are welcome to contact class teachers via Class Dojo to arrange a time to discuss your child's report in greater detail, subject to any relevant restrictions.

Thank you for your continued support during the transition between remote and flexible learning and onsite learning.



Three Vs: Ventilation, Vaccination and Vital COVIDSafe Steps



There is a Late Arrivals/Early Departures book at the office, which needs to be signed for late arriving or early departing students. This needs to be signed by parents (or whoever is dropping off or picking up your child). There is also a Visitor's Book to be signed by all visitors to the school (this includes parents who stay for Parents' Club activities, etc). This will aid our emergency management of the school.

Supervision - before and after school hours

Parents are reminded that grounds supervision does not begin until 8.30am so please do not send students early to school for the sake of it or to play. This is documented in our staff supervision policy.

Fairleys Supa IGA Community Rewards Program

Mobile Phone Policy Reminder

1. Easing of Restrictions

The Victorian Government has announced the easing of restrictions given the early achievement of the 80 per cent vaccination target, from 6pm Friday 29 October. All schools will be able to recommence a range of activities, consistent with community settings and school vaccination requirements. This means that from Monday 1 November schools will be able to:

- 1. hold graduations and other assemblies consistent with community density limits
- 2. travel across Victoria for camps and excursions
- 3. resume interschool activities such as sport and debating
- 4. deliver the full range of curriculum programs, including music and performing arts
- 5. conduct transition programs for kinder students beginning Prep in 2022 and Grade 6 students transitioning to Year 7 in 2022 (further detail will be included in the updated School Operations Guide on Tuesday 26 October)
- 6. have a range of visitors onsite, including photographers, guest speakers and MPs (further detail will be included in the updated School Operations Guide on Tuesday 26 October).
- It is imperative that as schools return to onsite learning, the requirements that have been put in place to minimise
 the risk of COVID-19 transmission in schools are strictly followed, with a focus on the three Vs of Vaccination,
 Ventilation and Vital COVIDSafe steps.
- These are detailed in the current School Operations Guide and will be reflected in the updated School Operations Guide that will be available from Tuesday 26 October. They include:
 - 1. ensuring any workers and visitors onsite meet the current vaccination requirements
 - 2. taking all steps possible to maximise external air flow and good ventilation
 - 3. following the COVIDSafe steps of
 - wearing face masks
 - implementing staggered start, finish and break times to reduce congestion and mixing of student cohorts
 - maintaining physical distancing between staff and, where possible, students
 - maintaining strong hygiene practices.

2. Sailing – Grade 5/6

Sailing has been confirmed with Kate Nichols for Wednesday, 10th November from 9.30am to 11am this year for grade 5/6 students. Cost will be approximately \$35-40 per student which may include transport by bus. We will be aiming to get permission forms out to families by the end of the week if possible and an expression of interest via Skool Loop today to confirm numbers ASAP. This program would be conducted at the Shepparton Lake.

3. Melbourne Trip - Grade 5/6

We had hoped to have a trip to Melbourne (Tuesday 23rd November) for Grade 5/6 students to cover some specific themes which we were unable to look at because of the cancellation of the Canberra Camp. This is looking unlikely at the moment because of the risk of going into Melbourne plus State Parliament is closed until at least the end of November for all school visits. We will be guided by advice from the DET operational guidelines plus the interest from our grade 5/6 families and make a decision as soon as possible.

4. Rescheduled Dates – Orientation Day

We are in the process of scheduling some new dates for this program for new Foundation students who will be coming to Tallygaroopna Primary School in 2022. With the easing of restrictions beginning on Monday 1st November, we will be aiming to reschedule cancelled dates so far to enable a smooth transition for the 12 new children coming to our school in 2022. Stay tuned for more details.

5. End of Year Dates

The end of the year is fast approaching and it is worthwhile for families to pencil in these specific dates for end of year festivities. These include the following which we hope to confirm this week:

Christmas Concert – Tuesday 14th December

Graduation Night – Wednesday 15th December

6. Class Structures - 2022

We are currently discussing staffing and grade structures for 2022. This takes some time and we will be aiming to announce this by the middle of Term 4.

7. Tutoring Program - 2022

The Victorian Government is investing an additional \$230 million to extend the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) into the 2022 school year. The additional funding will provide all Victorian government schools with targeted learning support to address the continued impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. To ensure every school can participate effectively in the program, each school will receive an increased minimum funding allocation to engage tutor support, with additional loadings reflecting levels of both enrolments and disadvantage.

We are currently planning on how this may look in the new year and we are aiming to contact specific families before the school year if possible in regard to student involvement in 2022. Stay tuned for more details.

8. Funfields Excursion

A final decision has not yet been made to run this excursion on Monday, 6th December. Organisation is proving difficult because the operational guidelines state that mixing of different cohorts of students should be minimised. This would mean that bus transport would be undesirable. If the excursion is to go ahead, then families would be responsible for transporting their own students to and from the venue. The cost would be \$27 per person. We plan to send out an expression of interest to all families soon to gauge the level of interest. If there is little interest, the excursion will be cancelled.

9. School Bus Travellers - 2022

Below is the current list for next year, if this is incorrect can you contact the school immediately please – alterations will be ongoing depending on family needs. We are still working on arrangements for the bus service for 2022, but we anticipate having 2 runs again. All families will be updated via Skool Loop on a regular basis.

10. Camps & Excursion Policy

Our Camps & Excursion policy is found here for parents to refer to if needed. Some key points are:

- Parents/carers will be notified if their child is in danger of losing the privilege to participate in an
 excursion or camp due to behaviour that does not meet the standards of behaviour set out in the school's
 Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy. The decision to exclude a student will be made by the
 Principal, in consultation with the Organising Teacher. Both the parent/carer and the student will be
 informed of this decision prior to the camp or excursion.
- 2. The cost of all camps and excursions are to be paid by parents/carers unless alternative arrangements have been agreed to by the Principal prior to the excursion. All families will be given sufficient time to make payments for all activities. Consent forms will have clearly stated payment amounts and payment finalisation dates.

11. Production

We are thinking of recording the production at the Outdoor Learning Space. As stated previously, we will need a few weeks to put this performance into a movie format and we hope to make this available to the school community before the end of the year if possible. We cannot have an audience this year, but we are still looking forward to seeing our kids shine and do their best. Stay tuned for more details.

12. Curriculum Days

Our last curriculum day for the year will be held on Monday 29th November (Report Writing – Semester 2). There will be no school, and also no OSH Care so families will need to make alternative arrangements.

13. Sharing of Food

The updated guidelines state that sharing of food is not permitted (ie: birthday cake), however pre-packaged food which doesn't require anyone to touch this food is ok (ie: lollipop). Please contact the Principal in regard to this, so that families can be informed (via Skool Loop / Dojo) and then make an informed decision in regard to participation.

14. School Uniform - reminder

A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. A reminder to all families to reinforce this please. From May until the end of August, school beanies and scarves are permitted to be worn outside – beanies can be purchased from school in line with our uniform policy as well – we would appreciate green or red beanies and scarves only.

CAN APPROPRIATE UNIFORMS BE REINFORCED PLEASE – BLACK SHORTS OR PANTS.

15. Absence Notes

Absence notes are a legal requirement for all absences. Please use the school absence note or submit an absence on Skool Loop. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about.

16. School Fees

Family reminder statements were sent home to some families last term. If you need any clarification, please contact Karen. More information regarding fees can be found in Parent Payment Arrangements for 2021 which was sent home to families late last year and are also available on the school website under Information < School Fees. These base school fees are summarised below:

Foundation - \$215 Grade 1/2 - \$150 Grade 3/4 - \$135 Grade 5/6 - \$140

These fees are now due and we would appreciate payment as soon as possible. If you would like to discuss a payment plan, please speak to Karen or David. As stated in the Parent Payment Arrangements forms, these fees do not include camps, excursions, swimming, uniforms or bus fees (if applicable).
