We are focused on reinforcing the right message and always providing a safe, secure and happy environment for our children. We have always had these processes in place, we just haven't needed to activate them until now.

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT PLAN - LOGICAL CONSEQUENCES

Recently at our school, it has come to our attention that some negative incidents in the yard and in class have become more ongoing and are happening repeatedly at school. As a result of this, we have activated some of our processes which are in our Student Engagement Plan. This involves children being warned for behaviour which is inappropriate and as a consequence some children at school may be required to complete a reflection sheet which focuses on their behaviour and how it has affected others. Certain types of behaviour could involve 1, 2 or 3 strikes (ie: 1 strike would involve disrupting class activities or play outside whereas 3 strikes would involve swearing at a teacher or fighting). Obviously, 3 strikes is severe and no warmings are given. At Tallygaroopna PS, we have never condoned inappropriate behaviour and we are focused on providing a safe and secure environment for all of the students of the school. If your child incurs 3 strikes for inappropriate behaviour they will be given time inside to talk about their behaviour and support will be provided so that this doesn't occur again. Repeated occurrence of this will not be tolerated and if students complete 3 reflection sheets within a period leading up to an excursion, they will not be invited to an excursion. This consequence is in line with our Excursion Policy, which clearly states that behaviour and attendance will be closely monitored and that Excursions are invitation only. Student do not have a right to attend all excursions, they have to earn this right. We have discussed this course of action with all of the students and they have a clear understanding of how this will work. Reflection sheets will be sent home on the day of the offence and they will be signed by students and teachers and they must be signed by parents and returned the next day. If these are not returned immediately, it will be followed up by me.

If you would like some more information in regard to these processes, feel free to contact me in regard to this. We have a Red Folder which has all of this documentation readily available if needed. I am hopeful that it will have limited use because we have wonderful kids at our school. Students just need to be aware of their responsibilities not just their rights and always make the right choices.

1. T20 Blast Cricket Tournament

Unfortunately, this program was postponed last Friday because of inclement weather. It has been rescheduled for Wednesday 18th November and the same students will be participating in this program (depending on behaviour and attendance). There will be no need for new permission forms – these will carry over to the new date.

2. Yachting Program

The cost for this program is \$27 per student - permission forms went home a couple of weeks ago. It would be appreciated if this payment can be made ASAP. Mr Brodie will be attending because the majority of students are intending to participate in this program (10 students). Chrissie Church will assist with transport as well (boys with Mr B and girls with Chrissie). Students not attending will remain at school and work in Mrs Wallace's grade with some set work. PLEASE NOTE: THE VENUE THIS YEAR IS THE SHEPPARTON LAKE (KNOWN AS LAKE VICTORIA)

ASSEMBLY POINT: We will need to drive around the back of the lake on Tom Collins Drive past Aquamoves to the green sheds.

Our school's date is THURSDAY 12TH NOVEMBER. Our time is: 1.15-2.45PM

Students need to bring:

3. Transition Excursion (Multiculturalism)

Grade 5 and 6 students will travel by bus with Mr Brodie and staff and students from Congupna PS on Friday 20th November to visit the Rumbalara Aboriginal Cooperative, Turkish Mosque in Mooroopna, tour the Iraqi Mosque, visit the Albanian Mosque, Afghani Mosque and Sikh Temple in Shepparton. This day is designed to familiarize students with different cultures in preparation for transitioning to their secondary education in the next few years. It is a fantastic opportunity for everyone in the senior grades and we are hopeful that everyone will embrace this experience which has never been available before. Students will leave school at 9.15am and return at approximately 2.30pm. Cost for the day will be \$12 to cover the bus. Students will need to bring their own snacks, lunch and drinks. Permission forms went home a couple of weeks ago and need to be returned ASAP.

4. Northerners Cricket

Cricket will again be held at the school oval this Friday. Unfortunately, we have had some trees damaged after school during this time so it would be appreciated if all families could keep an eye on the school grounds and monitor their own children as much as possible please.

5. Australian Fitness Education Award - AFEA

This week, students in Grades 5/6 will be participating in some running activities which are part of the AFEA. Good running shoes are required. This program focuses on individual fitness, flexibility and co-ordination. The aim for all students is to improve on their own performance over time. The testing is conducted over a few weeks and will indicate progress in relation to general fitness. If you would like to know more about this program please contact the school. It is now a major part of the Physical Education and Health Assessment for this year and results will be put into Student Books. All student results will remain confidential.

6. Remembrance Day

Wednesday is Remembrance Day and we will be having a very informal ceremony over the speaker at 11am before students go outside for recess. Our school leaders will be responsible for this as a mark of respect for all of the soldiers who have fought for our country.

7. Graduation Night / Christmas Concert

This night has had to be rescheduled to Thursday 17th December. More details will follow soon, but please put this date into your calendars.

8. Curriculum Days

The last curriculum day for the school year will be held on Friday 4th December after the End of Year Excursion in Melbourne. On this day, there will be no Outside School Hours Care (OSH) so families are encouraged to make alternative arrangements ASAP.

9. Sink or Swim Program

This program will be held at school on Wednesday 25h November from 9am until 10am. The focus of this morning is on Water Safety with the summer months fast approaching. No permission forms are needed, because this informal program is held at school. Just contact the school if you would prefer for your child to not participate.

10. End of Year Excursion

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Thursday 3rd December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to fund the costs for buses for all students and parents. They have also agreed to subsidise \$7 off the cost of entry to Fun Fields for students. As a result, tickets will be \$15 for students and \$22 for parents / guardians. This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 57 seats on a large bus and 35 seats of a smaller bus (92 in total). Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment. The Fun Park is open from 10am until 5pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 5pm. We should arrive back at school by about 7pm.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this.

11. Sporting Schools Program

Our Sporting Schools Program continues again this week. As per usual, sessions after school begin at 3.35pm and will finish at 4.35pm. Students receive a healthy snack before the program begins for all school sessions. Students need to be picked up immediately after each session. The Shepparton Ten Pin Bowling sessions will involve students catching a bus from school and then this will return back to school at about 5.20pm. If parents would like to come on the bus contact the school to see if room is available. Students can be picked up from Shepparton if needed – just let the school know ASAP please.
