

#### 2. Cluster MACC / MARC Day

Our whole school will participate in the Cluster Literacy Day at Strathmerton PS on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November. Permission forms went home last week and we will leave school at 9am and anticipate returning by 3pm. We will have a guest author (Matt Porter) and Artist (Jodie Newlan) and both are excited to deliver exciting workshops for both the students and the staff at our cluster day.

The theme for the MARC/MACC Cluster day is: Everything Australian: Our Country, Our Land, Our Community. So children are encouraged and advised to dress up in anything that has an Australian feel to it or a community vibe. At present the agenda and timetable for the day is as follows:

Day Concludes at 2:30pm allowing time for schools to return home.

#### 3. School Chaplain

As you would know, our school has been selected to continue on with our School Chaplaincy Program which addresses welfare and support for our students, staff and community. We look forward to continuing with this program for the next 2 years. Unfortunately, Jade Forman has indicated that she will not be able to continue with her role going into next year because of family / business circumstances. As a result, we will be working with Access Ministries (provider) to advertise this position and then select a suitable applicant who will fill this position for 2017 and 2018. Our aim is to have this process completed before the end of the school year. On behalf of the whole school, I would like to sincerely thank Mrs Forman for the contribution that she has made to our school through this program and we wish her luck in the future. We will no doubt, send Jade off on a positive note at the Christmas Concert.

#### 4. Defibrillator

We anticipate that our new Defibrillator will arrive at school sometime this week. We will endeavour to give information to staff, students and the school community about its use ASAP. We have been informed that the case will not actually be locked but is alarmed when opened. Therefore, there will be some very strict guidelines about its use and it will be under video surveillance 24 hours a day / 7 days a week.

A big thank you to all Northerners U12s kids, parents and supporters for helping raise funds towards the Tally school deliberator by buying a sausage and drink at the game a couple of weeks ago. You managed to raise \$174!

#### 5. Science Works Excursion

Final details for this excursion on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> November have now been finalised. The cost for this excursion is \$15 per student and permission forms must be returned by Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> November. We have 11 students who have decided to decline this invitation because of busy events around the same time, so we now will be taking 1 bus (57 seater) along with Mr Brodie's car. As a result, 55 students will be attending along with 5 staff members from school.

We will be leaving Tallygaroopna PS at 7.00am sharp (travel time of 2 hours 20 minutes), so that we can arrive for our first session at the Science Works by 10am. We will have a quick stop on the way down and on the way back – mainly for toilets. All students, will need to bring a snack, some lunch and a drink and money can be taken as well – not compulsory. Students will be responsible for their own money and this is only to be spent at the Science Works. Uniforms will be required on the day, but no hats will be necessary.

We will be departing Science Works at 3pm and we anticipate arriving back at Tallygaroopna PS by 6pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Tiqbiz. Again thanks to the Parents Club who are subsidising \$10 for each student attending this excursion.

#### 6. End of Year Excursion

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 16th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$20 for students and \$35 for parents / guardians – travelling by bus. Parents travelling in their own cars will be charged \$22 each. This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment. The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Tiqbiz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.

#### 7. Yachting Program

Any students from Grades 4/5/6 who would like to participate in the Yachting Program must have their permission forms in tomorrow with full payment (\$27) so that travel arrangements can be confirmed – <u>any assistance with cars would be appreciated</u>. Students not attending will remain at school and work in the other 2 classes with some set work.

PLEASE NOTE: THE VENUE THIS YEAR IS THE SHEPPARTON LAKE (KNOWN AS LAKE VICTORIA)

ASSEMBLY POINT: We will need to drive around the back of the lake on Tom Collins Drive past Aquamoves to the green sheds.

This was a great opportunity to give our children some information about local history before our 125 Year Celebrations on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November. #### 9. Parents Club Meeting

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November (tomorrow) in the Project Room at 3.35pm. All members of the school community are invited to attend – as always there are some important items to discuss.

#### 10. Multicultural Excursion

Grade 4/5/6 students will travel by bus with Miss Triffett and staff and students from Congupna PS on Friday 18th November to visit the Turkish Mosque in Mooroopna, the Aboriginal Flats in Mooroopna, Victoria's oldest purpose build Mosque – The Albanian Mosque, The Afghani Mosque and the Sikh Temple in Shepparton. This day is designed to familiarize students with different cultures in preparation for transitioning to their secondary education in the next few years. It is a fantastic opportunity for everyone in the senior grades and we are hopeful that everyone will embrace this experience which was implemented for the first time in 2015. Students will leave school at 9.00am and return at approximately 2.30pm. Cost for the day will be only \$5 to cover the bus. Students will need to bring their own snacks, lunch and drinks. **Permission forms will go home this week and need to be returned ASAP.** 

#### 11. No Late Lunch Orders

We have been informed by the Servo that they will no longer accept late lunch orders because it is disrupting the smooth ordering process. Therefore, all lunch orders must be at school by 3.30pm on Wednesday's so that they can be delivered to school on Thursday. Families are not permitted to take any lunch orders down to the Servo – effective immediately.

We made some inroads to the grounds in preparation for our big day on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November (125 Year Celebrations). Obviously, this afternoon didn't suit many families but if you can help out on any other day drop in and see Karen at the office. At present, Karen is doing a lot of extra bits of pieces out in the yard and some extra hands would be helpful. Our next Friday afternoon working bee is planned for Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November – I'll be coming back from a Network Meeting to help out on this day. Thanks in anticipation

#### 15. Australian Fitness Education Award

This week, students in Grades 4/5/6 will be participating in some running activities which are part of the AFEA. Good running shoes are required. This program focuses on individual fitness, flexibility and co-ordination. The aim for all students is to improve on their own performance over time. The testing is conducted over a few weeks and will indicate progress in relation to general fitness. If you would like to know more about this program please contact the school. It is now a major part of the Physical Education and Health Assessment for this year and results will be put into Student Books. All student results will remain confidential.

#### 16. Head Lice

As with all schools, head lice is an ongoing problem with children. We have had some incidents of head lice at our school this year, but unfortunately there have been some families that have been affected more than others. This has resulted in some repeat incidents of head lice, which is very frustrating for the families concerned.

Therefore, all families who have children with head lice must obviously treat their children but aim to remove all live eggs. To remove the live eggs it is imperative to apply a conditioner to dry hair and use a nit comb (from the chemist) and comb through every inch of hair until all live eggs are removed. Families will continually be phoned to pick up their children if live eggs are still visible at school. This will hopefully eliminate repeated incidents. Please return children to school only if no live eggs are visible. They will need to go straight to the office upon arrival to confirm the removal of lice / live eggs. This will hopefully result in less repeat incidents.

#### 17. Northerners Cricket

This year, cricket will be held most Friday nights at our school because there are 2 junior teams. We look forward to having Northerners utilise our facilities during this time and remind all members of our school community to keep a look out for any inappropriate behaviour. Obviously, some staff will be present during some of this time supervising our OSH Care Program.



As you are hopefully aware, this year we are celebrating 125 years of Education in Tallygaroopna.


