SHEPPARTON EDUCATION PLAN - PHASE 4 UPDATE FOR SCHOOL COMMUNITIES

This is an update regarding the Shepparton Education Plan, in particular the secondary school component of this project.

All families with students in years four to ten should have received a copy of the Master Plan for the new secondary school recently. This brochure provides an image of the Master Plan for the school and some information regarding the proposed design.

We understand that families will be seeking regular updates regarding the Shepparton Education Plan and we are committed to providing these.

There are some Frequently Asked Questions on the Engage Victoria website which we will continue to update as the Shepparton Education Plan progresses.

The current Frequently Asked Questions provide information regarding the House model, transition for students, transportation arrangements, and school uniform. We are working hard to progress further with other aspects of the school's design which will incorporate not just the infrastructure; but also the school house model, educational and curriculum design, and an integrated student health, wellbeing and support approach. https://engage.vic.gov.au/SheppartonEducationPlan

The most frequently asked question from the community has been regarding the logistics of managing the students on one campus. With the release of the Master Plan we have been able to represent how this will look more clearly through the House model which will be a number of multi-storey buildings across the site. This model has been used at a number of schools throughout Victoria with great success, particularly at Dandenong High School.

The Shepparton Education Plan is an opportunity for schools, families, education providers and community agencies to be involved in a transformational project to improve educational outcomes for our young people in an inclusive and supportive environment. I am currently teaching a Prep class in Yarrawonga and am looking forward to beginning a new teaching journey closer to home and being involved in a smaller school community.







We will be looking to finalise our Specialist subjects over the next few weeks – stay tuned for more announcements in the near future.

We will be beginning the new year with 84 students which is a great result for our school. Therefore, we will be having a 4th classroom again in 2019 and we are currently working on grade placements which we hope to confirm in the next couple of weeks. The grade structure for 2019 will be the following, but class numbers may change with any future alterations to enrolments.

We are very pleased that we can again offer low classroom sizes across the whole school. This will obviously make our school an attractive learning environment for the future.

2. Policies Endorsed

3. School Fees

These have been approved at School Council and are summarised below – some minor changes have taken place for 2019, with the exception of the Grade 5/6 fees which include the Science Program bus costs which will be implemented at Shepparton High School in terms 1, 3 and 4. With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels. These fees do not include excursions (except for the grade 5/6 Science Program), swimming, camps or bus fees (for applicable families). Excursions are estimated to be \$50 to \$70 for Foundation to Grade 4 and \$60 to \$100 for Grade 5/6.

4. Colour Run

Specific details are again in this edition of the newsletter. Participating students should bring along an old towel, change of clothes and plastic bag (for the trip home). Students who do not wish to participate in the Colour Run are welcome to complete the obstacle course prior to the Colour Run if they wish. A consent form must be returned to allow students to participate and there are some recommendations for eye protection. The school accepts no liability for any injuries, which may occur during this event, which will be this Friday, 9th November. The Grade 3-6 students will be having their run from 2.10-2.40pm, followed by the F-2 students and younger children (ie: Kindergarten) from 2.40pm-3.10pm. We are hopeful that we may have one or two special guests at our day! The Shepparton News will also be out to take photos.

5. Accident Insurance - reminder

Our school does not have an accident insurance policy to cover student injuries or ambulance transport. A reminder to parents and guardians that they are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment and ambulance attendance/transport. We recommend all families arrange ambulance cover in case of emergency. There are also a variety of commercial insurance policies available that would cover accidents at school.

6. End of Year Excursion

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 7th December. Costs for this day will be confirmed soon and we anticipate taking a couple of school buses for this day.

Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment. The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Flexibuzz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings, other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the school group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP. Numbers will need to be confirmed by Monday 26th November.

7. Northerners Cricket

It sounds like cricket will be played at our school most Wednesday and Friday nights, which is fantastic. A reminder to our school community about respecting our school grounds and facilities (i.e. toilets) and for making sure that all rubbish is cleaned up when using the school facilities – bins will be available. Outside School Hours Care is still running until 6pm each day so nobody should be riding bikes in the school grounds while a school program is still being implemented for safety reasons.

We will be aiming to keep the school oval cut as best as possible and will be looking at mowing this every 2 weeks to enable the Northerners Cricket Club to use our facilities. If you can assist with this to keep costs to a minimum – contact Mr Brodie. Mowing the school oval is probably a 2 hour job which would be completed during school hours when the students are inside classrooms.





8. Memorabilia Raffle

The Parents' Club are organising this with thanks to Wayne Bemrose for offering to donate some items to the school again. Raffle tickets will go out soon and this will be drawn at the Christmas Concert on Monday 17th December.

9. Yachting Program

Information was sent home with the Grade 5/6 students a couple of weeks ago. Permission forms have now been sent home and need to returned with payment by this Friday, 9th November – we will be aiming to confirm transport details on Friday also. Mr Brodie will be attending this program.

Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's) will be supplied by Yachting Victoria.

10. School Chaplaincy

Our school has been successful with funding for the 2019 Chaplaincy Program. We are currently finalising details for this program for next year, but we look forward to having John Hosking work at our school for another 12 months focusing on health and wellbeing for our whole school community – students, staff and families.

11. Bug Blitz Excursion

Mrs Haberfield's class will participate in an environmental education day at Loch Garry on **Friday 16th November**. The day will consist of a "bug blitz" session where the students will discover the local bugs. They will then break into smaller groups and rotate through some quick activities. The day will commence at 10.00am and conclude around 2.00pm. Permission forms will go home this week and there is no cost for this program as it is funded by the Goulburn Murray Landcare Network.

12. State Election

Our school will be used as a voting centre on Saturday 24th November. Voting opens at 8am on election day and we anticipate that the Multipurpose Room will be used for this day. Toilet facilities will be available on this day as well if needed.

13. Student Placements – Speech Therapy and Occupational Therapy

We are currently discussing some options in regard to extra support for some of our students in need. This would be in partnership with the Goulburn Region Preschool Association and the University of Melbourne. This would involve university students who are training to be Speech and Occupational Therapists working with some of our students. These people would be closely monitored by their supervisors. This could potentially be for a couple of days a week for up to 9 weeks.

14. Graduation Dinner / Grade 6 Cluster Lunch

Planning is taking place for the Grade 6 Graduation Dinner. We look like having this event at school in the Multipurpose Room on Tuesday 18th December. The dinner will involve Grade 6 students plus current and long standing staff at Tallygaroopna PS. The tea would be provided by the Parents' Club and would begin at 6pm (lasagne, salad and chips) and we hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to come to the evening and act as waiters (white shirt and black pants required). The whole school community is invited to the formal Graduation Ceremony which would begin in the Project Room at 7pm. We hope to wrap up the night by 8pm at the latest. More details will follow soon.

15. Bus Costs Proposal

All bus travellers for 2019, will soon receive a formal letter from School Council in regard to fees for bus use for next year – ineligible families only. This was introduced for the first time this year and School Council has endorsed the same costs for the new year. The school currently makes a large financial contribution in supporting families, so some changes are necessary in line with increasing costs. If you did not receive this letter, which will be sent by mail – contact the school and a new letter will be sent home immediately.

16. Australian Fitness Education Award

Over the next few PE sessions, students in Grades 5/6 will be participating in some running activities which are part of the AFEA. Good running shoes are required. This program focuses on individual fitness, flexibility and co-ordination. The aim for all students is to improve on their own performance over time. The testing is conducted over a few weeks and will indicate progress in relation to general fitness. If you would like to know more about this program please contact the school. It is now a major part of the Physical Education and Health Assessment for this year and results will be put into student books. All student results will remain confidential.

17. Contacting Staff out of School Hours

Please be mindful of contacting staff outside of school hours (beyond 5pm). This may involve text messaging, phone calls, Class Dojo and Flexibuzz. There has been a big push from the Department of Education in regard to staff and principal health & wellbeing and it is important that we all have lives away from the busy school day. We will also make an extra effort to do the same for our families, so that after work time can be devoted to families.

18. Grade 5/6 PowerPoints

The senior students will work on these a lot over the next few weeks. We will utilise many photos that are on the school server, but students new to our school are encouraged to bring in any previous school photos so that these can be scanned and then returned home. These PowerPoint presentations are an important component of the Grade 6 Graduation Night at the end of the year and reflect their time at Primary School, not just TPS.

RE: Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run - Parent Consent

Thank you for your support with the Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run. The event is only weeks away which is very exciting.

It is our responsibility to seek permission for your child to participate in the *Tallygaroopna Primary School Colour Fun Run*. All measures have been taken to ensure that this event is safe for all students.

There will be various colour powder stations throughout the course with two designated lanes – one for colour powder, the other with no powder. Your child can still participate in the event should you not wish for them to be sprayed with colour powder.

The staff will do their best to throw the powder at the torso, however wind and other factors can cause the powder to protrude on the face. We recommend that your child bring their own eye protection such as sunglasses or goggles.

The colour powder used in the event is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly consisting of 98% corn starch and 2% food colouring. It will likely wash out of your child's clothing, however we recommend that your child wears a plain white shirt that you don't mind being coloured. That's what the event is all about!

Based on the toxicology profiles of the powders used, their concentrations in the formulation and the mode of use, the colour powder is considered safe for use. Students with lung issues such as asthma or have allergies are advised to be careful in their decision to participate.


