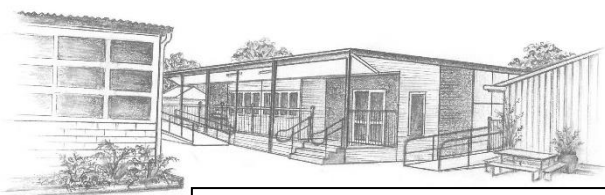

## News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

Last week was an extremely busy one with our second transition day being held at school. It has been terrific so far to see all of our new Foundation students for 2020 attend these sessions and this will hold them in good stead in the new year. We also had our Grade 5/6 Camp to Canberra last week and all of the students who attended thoroughly enjoyed themselves. There was a big emphasis on Australian Government / history during this camp and we look forward to providing our children another opportunity such as this in a couple of years time. Many photos are included in this edition of the newsletter.

Over the last couple of weeks, we have also had some community events which have been generally well attended. These included the Science Night which was organised by Mrs Starbuck and the community BBQ on Halloween Night. Thanks to all of the people who assisted with these events as well.

In this edition of the newsletter, we have announced our classroom staffing for 2020. A big thank you to everyone for being patient with this, but it is terrific that we can retain all of our teaching staff for a further 12 months. Retention has been something we have tried to focus strongly on recently and this is a really positive outcome for our school. It is important to note that these staffing arrangements have been made in the best interests of the whole school and I am sure that families will continue to be supportive of these.

A reminder about the grade structures for next year - we have decided to split the Grade 1s in 2020. This will then allow us to have relative consistent and low class numbers across the whole school - especially in the Junior Unit. In determining whether these children are in the F/1 or 1/2 class, many factors will be looked at. Among these will be the academic and social level of the students in this year level and we will endeavour to do what we think is best for this cohort of children. Please contact me directly if you would like to discuss your child's placement for 2020 - thanks to the families who have done this already.

This Friday is our Colour Run and if you can assist with this in any way - please contact members of the Parents' Club. The day begins at 2pm and a reminder that consent forms need to be returned in order for students to participate. If these are not returned, students will not be able to participate because of health and safety reasons. If you require another consent form - contact the school ASAP. Students using the bus after school, should have a change of clothes which they can put on at the end of the day to keep our bus driver happy!

Finally, planning is going well with the end of year excursion and spots are filling up fast. Please respond to this ASAP to assist with planning and we hope to confirm the buses for this event by the end of the month. Numbers need to be confirmed by Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November.

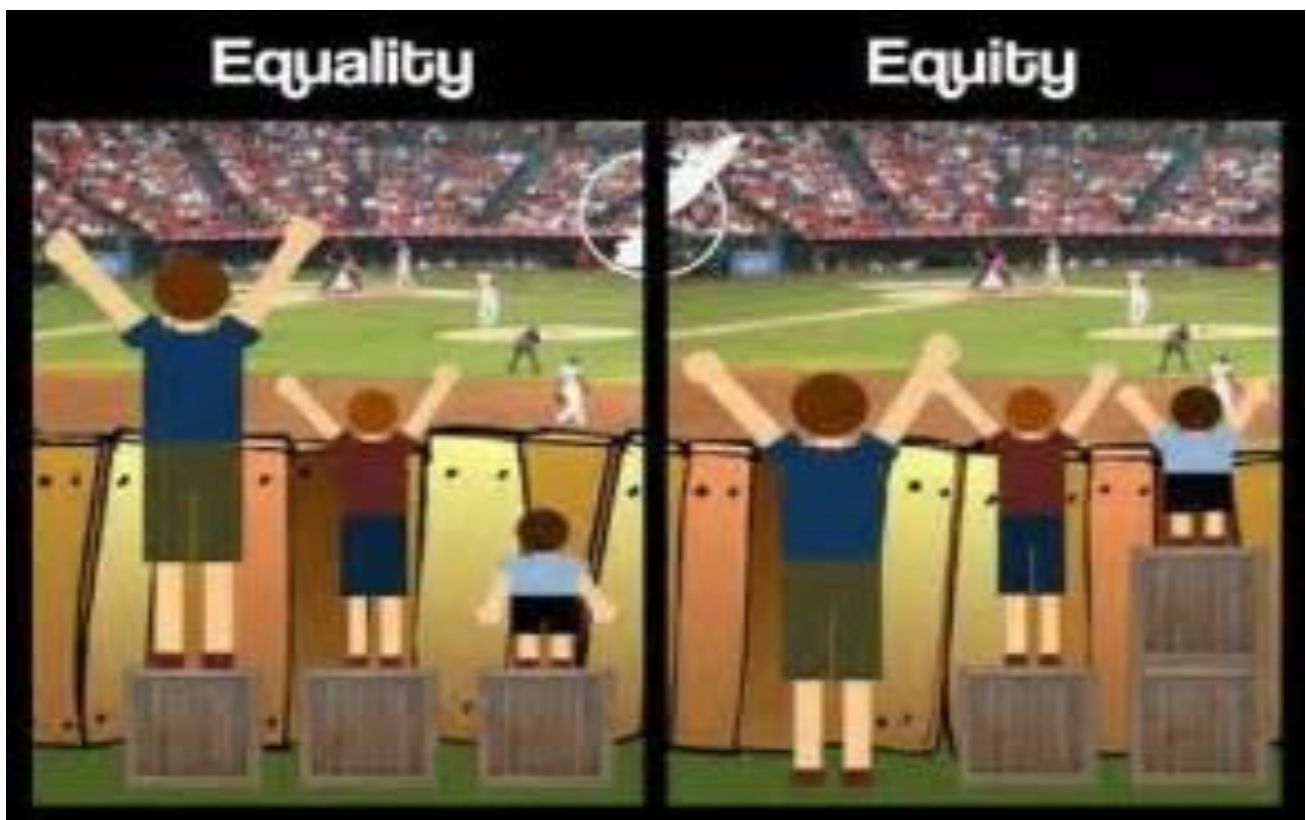

### **END OF YEAR EXCURSION – TALLYGAROPNA PS**

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 6th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$25 per student and \$35 per parent / guardian (same price as 2018). This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$41.50 to \$49.50 per person

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment.** The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Flexibuzz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. ### **Contacting Staff out of School Hours**

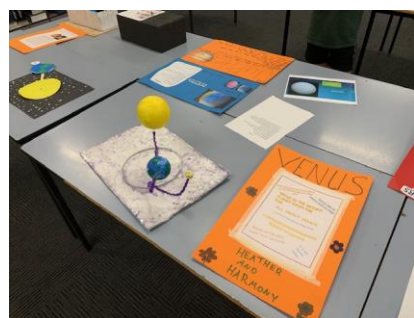
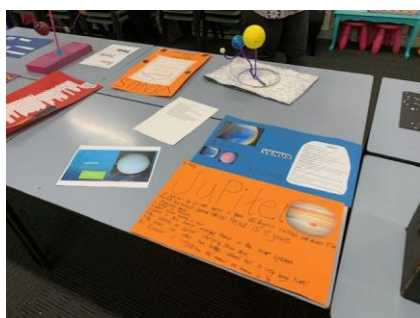
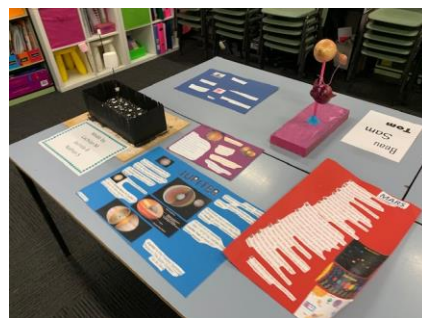
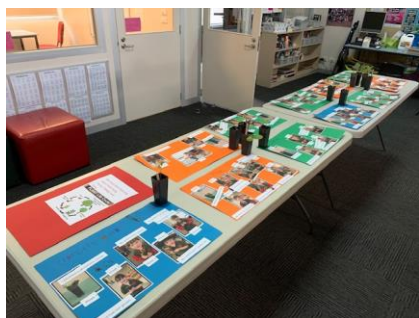

### **1. Class Teachers - 2020**

## **7. Excursion Policy Reminder**

1. Only children who have displayed sensible, reliable behaviour at school will be invited to participate in school excursions. Parents will be notified if a child is in danger of losing their invitation to participate in an excursion due to poor behaviour at school. Excursions are a privilege not a right.
2. Parents experiencing financial difficulty, who wish for their children to attend an excursion, will be required to discuss their individual situation with the Principal. Decisions relating to alternative payment arrangements will be made by the Principal on a case-by-case basis.

## **8. Christmas Concert**

This will be held on Monday 16th December. All families will receive a formal letter about this evening in the next few weeks – please RSVP to assist with catering by Friday 6th December. We currently don't have the prices that Tally Lions will charge for the BBQ and drinks on the night so please be prepared with change if you wish to partake of this. *Please make sure you also open the special envelope and address the information inside as soon as possible – this is yet to be sent home.*



## **9. Graduation Night**

Plans are in place for the Grade 6 Graduation Dinner. We will have this event at school in the Multipurpose Room on Tuesday 17th December and the dinner will involve Grade 6 students and current and long standing staff at Tallygaroopna PS. The tea would be provided by the Parents' Club and would begin at 6pm (lasagne, salad and chips) and we hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to come to the evening and act as waiters (white shirt and black pants required). The formal Graduation Ceremony would begin in the Project Room at 7pm and the whole school community is invited to attend. We hope to wrap up the night by 8pm at the latest.

## **10. Accident Insurance - reminder**

Our school does not have an accident insurance policy to cover student injuries or ambulance transport. A reminder to parents and guardians that they are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment and ambulance attendance/transport. We recommend all families arrange ambulance cover in case of emergency. There are also a variety of commercial insurance policies available that would cover accidents at school.

### **11. Puberty Talks**

Senior students in Grades 5/6 have an opportunity to participate in two puberty talks with a Sexual Health Nurse (Suzanne Wallis) from GV Health on Monday 11th November and Monday 18th November. Boys and girls will be separated during these sessions and Mr Brodie and Miss Lothian will accompany each group. The sessions begin at 2pm and conclude at 3.15pm. The boy's session will begin at 2pm with the girls program following at 2.40pm. Suzanne Wallis can be contacted by phoning 58323100 / 0427 564512 regarding the program if needed.

**If you would prefer your child to not participate in this program contact the school please.** This program is a component of the curriculum in the Victorian Curriculum. Specific information is provided below:

The Puberty Education information will be delivered over 2 sessions allowing for the opportunity for students to post anonymous questions or issues that they would like answered / addressed in the second session. The sessions are delivered to single gender groups to facilitate student comfort and participation.

#### **Session 1**

- What is puberty and why does it happen?
- Brainstorming activity on what changes occur, with discussion around the butcher's paper led by the students
- Viewing of YouTube educational cartoons on Puberty <https://www.youtube.com/user/watchwellcast>
- Distribute worksheets re: puberty to complete at home and hopefully stimulate conversations with parents

#### **Session 2**

- Review information delivered in Session 1
- Answer any questions / concerns / observations
- Menstruation / Pregnancy
- Be prepared kits (male & female)
- Where to get further information / resources / advice locally (If time permits touch on body image and media portrayal - photo-shop and true images)

### **12. Curriculum Day**

Our last Curriculum Day for the year will held on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November. This will involve report writing, planning for 2020 and staff health & wellbeing. This is a pupil free day and families will need to make alternative arrangements – there will be no OSH Care on this day.

### **13. Bus Costs Proposal**

Bus travellers will soon receive a formal letter from School Council regarding fees for bus use in 2020 – ineligible families only. Bus fees have been in place for the last few years and School Council has slightly increased fees for next year. The school makes a large financial contribution in supporting families, so some changes were necessary in line with increasing costs. If you do not receive this letter, which will be sent by mail – contact the school and a new letter will be sent home.

If you have not paid fees for bus use for this year – can you contact the school ASAP please.

### **14. OSH Care Costs**

At the last School Council meeting we decided to increase OSH Care fees for 2020. These have been simplified and will be \$25 for a full session and \$15 for a short session (finishing by 4.30pm). These increases were needed in order to make this service financially viable for the future and we hope that this service will be generally well supported by the school community.

### **15. Australian Fitness Education Award**

Over the next few PE sessions, students in Grades 5/6 will be participating in some running activities which are part of the AFEA. Good running shoes are required. This program focuses on individual fitness, flexibility and co-ordination. The aim for all students is to improve on their own performance over time. The testing is conducted over a few weeks and will indicate progress in relation to general fitness. If you would like to know more about this program please contact the school. It is now a major part of the Physical Education and Health Assessment for this year and results will be put into student books. All student results will remain confidential.



## **16. Chaplaincy – 2020**

We are still awaiting on specific information in regard to extending the Chaplaincy Program for a further 12 months. We hope to be able to do this in the next week or two and also confirm staffing arrangements for this program as well – stay tuned.
