- 1. Staffing Class teachers for 2024 were announced last week. Further exciting announcements in regard to our wonderful Education Support and Specialist Staff will be communicated to the school community during the next few weeks. Again, we thank everyone for their patience with this matter.
- 2. Enrolments for 2024 If your child will not be at our school for 2024, can families please contact the office. This will assist with planning for the new year. Thanks to the families who have done this already confidentiality will be respected.
- 3. Swimming Program Extra swimming days will be held this Thursday 9th and Friday 10th November. The Grade 4/5/6 group will swim first from 12.45pm to 1.30pm followed by the Grade F/1/2/3 group from 1.30pm to 2.15pm. Buses will leave at 12.15pm and 1pm for each group and students will be encouraged to get changed at school as per normal.
- 4. Yachting Program The Grade 5/6 students have an opportunity to attend this activity at the Shepparton Lake on Tuesday 14th November (invitation only). We will travel by bus from school at 12.30pm and the program will begin at 1pm and conclude at 2.30pm. We anticipate arriving back at school by 3pm. Mr Brodie and Stacey will be attending this day and permission forms are due now. There is no cost funded from Wellbeing Boost Funding. Students will get changed for this program at school.

<u>5. Grade Structures</u> – Next year, we will again have 4 classrooms which is pleasing for us and will ensure relatively low numbers in each class. At present we are planning for the following:

Grade F/1 – Hayley McDonald (20 students)

Grade 2/3 – Tori Puetz (21 students)

Grade 4/5 – Josh Dickson (19 students)

Grade 5/6 – Lauren Ash (19 students)

These are subject to change depending on enrolment numbers. We are anticipating similar placements with our Grade 5 students as per this year's Grade 4 students.

- 6. Parent Payment Arrangements for 2024 These were approved at school council on 16th October, 2023 and are set at \$200 per student for 2024 to cover student supplies, online subscriptions and MACC & MARC costs. Payment can be made in 2024 by direct bank transfer, cash or cheque. Further details will be available on the school website soon.
- 7. OSH Care 2024 At the last School Council meeting we discussed OSH Care fees for 2024. These will remain unchanged and be reviewed in the first half of next year. Currently, there is a flat rate charge of \$25 per session for each student in the service. We are still obliged to pay 3 hours of wages per session and we hope that our service will continue to be supported going into the future. We anticipate that most of the cost for families will continue to be taken up by the CCS.
- **8. School Bus 2024** At the last School Council meeting we discussed bus costs for next year. As bus costs were increased for this year (50% of the DET rate) it was decided that no further increase will apply for 2024. Further information will go out to families as per usual in the middle of January, however costs per student will continue to be \$250 for 2024.

Camps & Excursions Policy

Behaviour expectations

Students participating in camps and excursions are required to cooperate and display appropriate behaviour to ensure the camp or excursion is a safe, positive and educational experience for all students involved. Camps are a privilege and not an entitlement for all students.

Parents/carers will be notified if their child is in danger of losing the privilege to participate in an excursion or camp due to behaviour that does not meet the standards of behaviour set out in the school's Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy. The decision to exclude a student will be made by the Principal in consultation with the Organising Teacher. Both the parent/carer and the student will be informed of this decision prior to the camp or excursion.

If on a camp or excursion the Teacher in Charge considers an individual student's behaviour does not meet required standards, then the Principal or their nominee may determine that a student should return home during the camp or excursion. In these circumstances the parent/carer is responsible for the collection of the student and any costs associated with this.

Disciplinary measures apply to students on camps and excursions consistent with our school's Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, Student Code of Conduct and Bullying Prevention Policy.

Here's some tips to ensure you receive notices and push notifications

- When you download the Skool Loop App you will be asked if you would like notifications
 please tap yes. Some devices don't ask this question and automatically tick yes for you.
 This can be changed in your settings
- If your notifications are turned off in your device settings, some phones apply that to all apps
 when downloading. In the phone settings please make sure your notifications are turned on
- · Check your App Store or Google Play regularly for any outstanding updates
- There are 2 different notices school will send out: push notification (banner and ding) or a notice (visual alert only)
- You will only receive a push notification if you are not using the app at the time
- If your volume is off you will not hear an alert
- You will see a visual alert if a notice has been posted. You will not hear a ding
- You will only hear a ding if the school sends a push notification.
