Article of the Week – News Report (Tayla Robertson) Shepparton News – Nov 16th 2017

Tayla Robertson and Cooper Bromley are on their way to race in the biggest competition in the world. The Shepparton BMX Club riders will fly to the United States next week and take to the track at the BMX Grand Nationals. Both are supreme talents with Robertson, 11, having already competed in Belgium aged nine, while Bromley,16, has lined up in A-men races.

Shepparton BMX Club spokesman Levi Collins said there was no bigger stage than the Grand Nationals in Oklahoma, which begin next Wednesday. "It's the greatest race on earth, it's pretty much the biggest race, it's even bigger than the worlds (World Championships), it's over four or five days — that's how big it is," he said. "If you win, it's nearly more valued than a world title as such, if you're the best that's where you go."

Shepparton riders have raced in the US in the past, with Gian Renato this year crowned world champion in the 13 years boys' event in South Carolina. But it is the first time Shepparton talents will head to the BMX Grand Nationals. With thousands of riders from across the world attending, Cooper's father Luke said experiencing one of the pinnacles of the sport had been on his son's radar for a while. "For Cooper it's been something that he's been wanting to do for a long time," he said. "He sets goals and he's been setting this for probably two years now and one of Tayla's friends is going, so she decided she'd go as well."

As many riders make the most of their opportunities to head interstate and overseas, Collins said it was fantastic to have another pair jet off. "It's definitely good to see local riders getting out of Shepp and representing their club and country and going overseas," he said. "It's good to see local riders making the most of what the council has done here (with the track)." Bromley and Robertson will have an ideal lead-up into the event, testing themselves against the best in the state when they contest the Victorian State Titles in Melbourne this weekend.



2. Graduation Dinner / Grade 6 Cluster Lunch

Plans are in place for the first ever Grade 6 Graduation Dinner. We look like having this event at school in the Multi Purpose Room on Wednesday 20th December and the dinner will involve Grade 6 students and current and long standing staff at Tallygaroopna PS. The tea would be provided by the Parents Club and would begin at 6pm (lasagne, salad and chips) and we hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to come to the evening and act as waiters (white shirt and black pants required). The formal Graduation Ceremony would begin in the Project Room at 7pm and the whole school community is invited to the night. We hope to wrap up the night by 8pm at the latest. 3. Communication with staff - Reminder

At Tallygaroopna PS, we value the two-way link between home and school and it essential that positive communication occurs always. This is vital and our parents and staff generally do a great job with this. However, at times teachers or parents receive messages in a variety of forms (text messages, class dojo..etc) where sometimes the tone of the message is not really clear. It is also important for the School Community to respect the personal time of others also outside of school hours and always contact the school first if possible.

Therefore, it is better for everyone to communicate personally by either phone or at school so that all communication is clear and concise and no mixed messages occur. If some time to discuss an issue is needed as well, please make an appointment because we are all busy people in our workplace and in our private lives – especially during this time of the year. We are always looking to do this better - this is just one thing for all of us to work on.

4. Absence Notes

Could the attached form be used for Absences please - this went home again today. The other alternative is to do an absence on Flexibuzz. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about!

7. Christmas Concert - date change

All families will have received a formal letter about this evening last week – please RSVP to assist with catering by Friday 1st December. Please make sure you also open the Special envelope and address this information ASAP.

8. OSH Care Fees for 2018

At School Council we decided to increase OSH Care slightly, beginning for the 2018 school year. This is the first increase of fees since the beginning of OSH Care in 2014. These will be \$22 for Casual places, \$20 for Permanent places and \$12 for places which conclude before 4.30pm. There has been some interest in the full time position for 2018 and we are enquiring in regard to qualifications and suitability at present.

9. Bus Costs Proposal

All bus travellers for 2018 should have received a formal letter from School Council last week in regard to a proposal to introduce and increase some fees in regard to bus use for next year. The school currently makes a large financial contribution in supporting families, so some changes are necessary in line with increasing costs. We welcome any feedback before this proposal is reviewed and endorsed at School Council in early December. If you did not receive this letter, which was sent by mail – contact the school and a new letter will be sent home immediately.

10. End of Year Excursion

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Thursday 7th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$20 per student and \$35 per parent / guardian. This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$37 to \$45 per person.

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment**. The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Flexibuzz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.

Enviro Kids Sustainable Classroom of the Week

A new student-led initiative called the Enviro Kids started a couple of weeks ago. This group consists of some volunteers from the grade 3 and 4 classroom. It is being trialled this year and will become an ongoing endeavour in the future with volunteers across the school. Chantelle, Sam, Jake and Aden are our Enviro Kids for this year.

This group has been started as part of our ResourceSmart Schools Program and aims to encourage all students to think about:

- 1. the way electricity, paper and water are used in the classroom/grounds
- 2. how much waste is produced in the classroom and how this could be minimised or disposed of in an environmentally-friendly way

The role of the Enviro Kids is to assess each classroom (and office) once a week using a checklist. This checklist rates things such as:

- 1. lights are only on if necessary (should blinds be open or closed?)
- 2. split systems are set at appropriate settings
- 3. lights and splits are not left on over recess or lunch unnecessarily
- 4. windows opened to catch a breeze or closed if split system is on
- 5. students bring Nude Food lunches as much as possible
- 6. waste is correctly separated in the appropriate bin landfill, recyclable, food/compostable or soft plastic recyclable
- 7. making sure paper is used efficiently ie. Double-sided where possible, can other media be used?

The Enviro Kids record the results of the Checklist onto the Enviro Kids Class Dojo using an iPad so that they don't waste paper! They also announce the winning classroom at assembly each week and offer an environmentally friendly tip which is published in the newsletter.

Teachers may also award Class Dojo points to students who remember to pick up rubbish, turn off or report dripping taps, mulch or weed gardens, etc.

Points accumulate each week and the class with the highest points at the end of the year is acknowledged as the most sustainable classroom.
