A huge thank you to the families who have paid for the End of Year Excursion. We are trying to finalise this trip by Friday, so please contact us regarding payment or if you are thinking of not going to Whittlesea for the day. This is a school day and students are expected to be at the excursion or at school – just let us know. It would be great if the whole school community attended along with teachers, but we acknowledge that it is a parent choice in regard to this trip.

2. Class Structure for 2012

Next year again promises to be a very exciting one at Tallygaroopna Primary School. We anticipate starting the year with 51 students (increase from 48 in 2011), with the possibility of this being in the mid 50's by the middle of the year - with a couple of families coming to our school later on. We will continue to provide well-structured and resourced literacy and numeracy blocks along with a variety of specialist subjects as well. Art, Library, Information Technology and Physical Education will continue to be implemented and we are excited about the prospect of also implementing LOTE (Italian) and Science one session a week as well – courtesy of our new Science Specialist. As part of our Science Program, Robotics will have a major emphasis in the middle to upper grades.

It greatly disappoints me to announce to everyone that Miss Bicknell will not be staying on as a permanent member of staff next year. Ella has been a pleasure to share a grade with this year and her willingness to take on any role has been greatly appreciated. In my role as Principal, Ella has been extremely flexible and there have been many times when she has been able to swap days to assist me with meetings and other commitments. She has been able to develop a positive relationship with various members of our school community and on behalf of everyone at Tallygaroopna PS, we wish Ella luck in her future endeavours as a school teacher.

Next year, we will be still keeping our 3 grades and I will be teaching in more of a Full Time capacity. With building projects finishing up this year, I look forward to getting back into the classroom and refining my teaching skills.

5. Public Speaking Competition

Last Monday, Stephanie, Brittany and Teagan all presented wonderful speeches to their peers and parents. All of these children were presented with certificates today and will negotiate a small prize with Mr Brodie – along with Rhiannon and Daniel Bagley from last week.

Unfortunately, the Public Speaking Night featuring other schools has been cancelled because schools are obviously busy during this time of the year. As a result, there was no need to announce an overall winner for the Grade 2/3/4 class. Apologies for any inconvenience.

6. School Improvement Program

Last week, we placed an order with Modern Teaching Aids for some terrific Maths and Science resources which will be utilised in classrooms. We have also invested in Robotics which will be a fantastic opportunity for children to design, construct, operate, manufacture and apply robots in the classroom through specific software. We anticipate also purchasing about 6 more netbooks because of anticipated increases in enrolments.

Last week, we also had a visit from Furphy's; about some seating under the concrete undercover area and a new large bin and from GV Carports; and we are currently in discussions with the latter in regard to a new veranda outside the school administration building. More details will be available soon.

We will be having our building opening this Thursday 1st December, so please keep this date free if you can because this will be a celebration of all of the work that has taken place over the last 12 to 18 months. There will be an official ceremony at 10.45am followed by a morning tea at 11am and we look forward to promoting our school on the day with the local media.

7. Phone System

As stated previously, our school phone system has been upgraded and we now have a good signal in the new building and around all of the playground areas. We also have a new answering machine installed, which will be on at all times. As a result, please use this if your call is not received. This system has been set up to enable fewer interruptions as possible with classrooms. A summary of how the phone system works is below:

Any phone calls will first come to the Karen's office phone. Phone calls have 16 seconds to be received (4 rings). After this cordless handsets will ring (in new building) for a further 6 rings before the answering machine answers the call. Answering machine is in David's office.

8. Holiday Programs

There are a number of holiday programs on offer for children during the Christmas holiday period. All of these programs are around the local area and are on the new noticeboard out the front of the Main Entrance of the new building. 10. Religious Education Break Up

Tomorrow morning will be our last R.E. lesson for the year. There will be some brief presentations in the Project Room at 9.30am to thank our wonderful volunteers who continue to implement this program successfully at our school. Special thanks to the Parents Club for the kind donation of gifts for our volunteers. We are hopeful of Religious Education continuing again next year.

11. Christmas Concert / Santa Visit

We have scheduled this night for Wednesday 21st December. This will be a very informal night with some Christmas Carols and presentations to some students leaving our school. BBQ facilities will be available on the night – families may bring their own food and drinks if they wish. Santa will be arriving on the night and we are hoping to invite new children and families who will be at our school next year. **Families will receive a small note this week about the night.**

12. Tally Take Away – Terms 1&4

Tally Take Away has kindly offered to run a canteen for our school in 2012. This has been discussed at School Council and been approved for Terms 1 and 4 next year. 13. Cricket Camps

15. Puberty Session – Grade 5/6

As part of the physical, personal and social learning strand of the VELS Sexuality Education Curriculum, students learn about significant transitions between life stages, particularly the changes associated with puberty. We have again arranged for a session to be held this year on Wednesday 7th December by Chelsea Pohlner who is the Year 12 Coordinator at GV Grammar School. Chelsea has worked in consultation with Irene Crawford (Primary School Nurse, Department of Human Services). There will be two sessions, one for boys and one for girls and each session will go for one hour. Miss Bicknell will accompany the girls during this session and Mr Brodie will be with the boys.

Students will have an anonymous question box available to them which will allow them to submit their concerns prior to the lesson. Specific rules are discussed, such as respect and the correct information will be presented rather than "misinformed tid bits" from peers.

No permission forms will be sent home – if you would not like your child to be involved in this session simply send in a note to Mr Brodie please. Feel free to contact the school if you require any more specific information about the program.

Our stocks of tissues are running a little low. If each family could donate a box of tissues to school before the end of the year it would be greatly appreciated.


23. You Can Do It Awards
