

1. Future Directions - DEECD

Last week, Mr Brodie attended a 2 day conference at Mulwala which focused on the new directions for the Department of Education. Major focus was on a position paper titled: Towards Victoria as a Learning Community and the Compact. Specific information in regard to both is below:

In 2011, the Minister for Education, the Hon. Martin Dixon, MP delivered a special lecture at the Melbourne Graduate School of Education, The University of Melbourne. The special lecture, titled *Victoria* as a *Learning Community*, laid out the Government's broad vision for school education reform, with a focus on autonomy, professional trust and partnerships.

The *Towards Victoria as a Learning Community* (TVLC) position paper was released on 15 November 2012 and sets out a range of strategic, school-based reforms that will be pursued to support achievement of the Victorian Government's education goals. These reforms include new expectations for professional practice, increased autonomy for schools, rigorous accountability arrangements, enhanced support for schools, and a commitment to strengthening partnerships.

TVLC builds on the teaching and leadership reform propositions presented in the *New Directions for School Leadership* and the *Teaching Profession* discussion paper released in June 2012.

A consultation draft of the Compact, which provides greater detail about the respective roles and responsibilities of government schools, regions and the central office of the Department in the context of school autonomy and professional trust, has been released as a companion document to *Towards Victoria as a Learning Community*. This draft will be open for input from stakeholders across the learning community for the remainder of the 2012, with a final version of this document to be released at the beginning of the 2013 school year.

Special thanks to all of the parents who assisted with transport and helped with the school marquee and barracked hard and supported the teams throughout the day. Thanks to Mitch Brett who kindly offered to assist with umpiring for the whole day as well – your help is really appreciated.

The boys team will leave school tomorrow at 9am and return at approximately 2pm, depending on the outcome of games throughout the day. Permission forms went home last week and need to be returned by tomorrow with transport being provided by Mr Brodie, Mrs Bagley and Mrs O'Brien.

3. Pupil Free Days

At School Council last week, we were able to approve some Pupil Free Days for the 2013 School Year and finalise a starting day for the school year. A summary is included below:

Teachers First Day of School – Tuesday 29th January (Pupil Free Day 1)

All Students First Day of School (P-6) – Wednesday 30th January (Preps will remain at home on Wednesday's in Feb).

Parent Teacher Interviews – Wednesday 26th June (Pupil Free Day 2)

Report Writing Day – Friday 6th December (Pupil Free Day 3) – day after the End of Year Excursion

All Schools have 4 Pupil Free Days for the school year and currently we have one floating day which will be confirmed next year. We hope to utilise this day perhaps in the first semester if possible.

4. School Council

Last week, was our last School Council for the year and I would like to publically acknowledge all of the school councillors for their support, guidance and work throughout the school year. Our school is very fortunate to have such a hard working team of wonderful parents and I am sure that this will continue into the future. I would also like to acknowledge David Bagley's work throughout his many years at Tallygaroopna PS as we say goodbye to the Bagley family at the end of the year. David has been on School Council as a School Council President, Vice President and councillor for many years and has seen the school develop in many ways throughout his families' time here.

5. School Fees for 2013

Next year, school fees will increase by \$10 to \$150 for the school year. This is in line with the ongoing cost increases with many things in society at present. This includes subsidizing school supplies along with many programs which are implemented at school including MACC Van, MARC Van, Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Ziptales, Skoodle, etc. Again, there will be no Excursion Levy included next year. As a result, families will have 2 options – either to pay for excursions throughout the year as they occur or, pay an amount upfront which will be allocated to excursions as they occur. This system allows families to be able to track what excursions are held and paid for.

6. Stop Bullying Campaign

Facebook has partnered with Headspace and Project ROCKIT to launch their national bullying prevention campaign. The campaign aims to ignite a national conversation about the small, yet powerful, steps that everyone can take to stop bullying and promote safe online behaviour. The campaign was launched on Friday 2 November with a video message delivered by the Prime Minister, the Honourable Julia Gillard: "Our goal is to raise awareness of the simple, yet powerful actions that parents, young people and educators can take to prevent bullying. And Facebook is a great place to do it. Almost one in two Australians are active on Facebook, so Facebook's Be Bold, Stop Bullying campaign can have a big impact."

Information for Parents

Safety is a conversation between young people, teachers, the community and most importantly, you – as a parent – with your child.

Many young people won't tell their parents if they are being bullied. If you suspect or know that bullying is taking place, don't ignore it. The consequences can be serious. Ask your child how they are, and listen and take their feelings and fears seriously

Help by:

- Normalising any feelings of embarrassment, hurt or fear
- Reassuring them that bullying is not their fault and that they are not responsible for what is happening to them
- Making sure they are safe. Sometimes this may require taking action that they
 are not happy with. Have a conversation if this is the case
- Trying to give them as many options as possible to find solutions so they feel
 more in control. This is really important as many young people stay quiet about
 being bullied because they are worried that speaking up will make matters worse.
 Solving problems with your support, can increase self-esteem and ensure that you
 achieve their desired outcome
- Working on improving the young person's confidence by building on the things they do well
- · Helping them feel good about other things in their lives
- Reassuring them that they are not alone, it shouldn't be the responsibility of your child to do something about the situation by themselves

Information for Young People

Giving it fuel can cause more damage

Ever laughed at a hurtful post online, such as on Facebook, and commented? Or forwarded on a hurtful email about someone to your friends? Although people often think, "it's not my fault if I didn't start it," these actions can cause even more damage in the long run.

Doing nothing is not the answer

One of the most common reasons people bully others online is to gain the attention of an audience. So when we see bullying happen, rather than just ignoring it, we have a massive opportunity to limit or stop the bullying. It only takes one person to speak up for others to do the same.

Speaking up means:

- Recognising when someone is being bullied.
- Limiting the encouragement given to somebody who bullies by not clicking "like" and encouraging your friends to do the same.
- Uniting with other bystanders to let someone who bullies know what they're doing is not okay. Sometimes this can be as simple as typing "dislike".
- Reporting the bullying to someone you trust and to Facebook using the social reporting tool.
- Encouraging the person being bullied to "block" or unfriend the person.
- Reaching out to the person who has been bullied to support and comfort them. This could
 also mean encouraging them to seek help and support from a professional. Nobody should
 have to face cyber bullying alone.

Bullying can happen to anyone

If you're being bullied, remember that it's the result of someone else's behaviour, attitude or beliefs. It is not because of who you are.

It can be upsetting and stressful, impacting on different areas of your life, including: self-esteem, relationships, work or study. But there is help available. Talking to someone you trust is a good starting point, particularly if you're feeling unsafe or frightened.



COUNCIL PLAN 2013-2017 - DATA COLLECTION

Greater Shepparton City Council would like to thank you for your contribution to the community consultation process held in July and August 2012. Your input is helping shape the development of the new four year Council Plan 2013-1017.

Council was thrilled to receive over 2,400 completed surveys and has consulted personally with over 10,000 members of our diverse community from across our municipality.
