Frog Bog and Indigenous Garden

This year, Momentum Energy worked with Junior Landcare to provide 200 \$1000 grants to help young people play an active role in ensuring the safe future of their environment.

As a school, we decided to apply for one of these grants with the hope of creating a frog bog and indigenous garden at the front of our school. We felt that our school and community would really get behind this project. A video was submitted with our application that included a number of students sharing what they already knew about frogs and why helping to create an environment for them is important for their survival.

We were successful in our application and throughout Term 3 and 4 a number of activities were undertaken to prepare for the construction of our frog bog. Below are a number of photographs highlighting student involvement in this project and illustrating the development of the frog bog over time.

We would like to thank Momentum Energy and Junior Landcare for this grant, which has enabled us to give our students a meaningful learning experience. We would also like to thank staff, students, parents and the Congupna Tallygaroopna Landcare Group for their effort and support throughout the development and construction of our frog bog. We know that it will be enjoyed for many years to come!

END OF YEAR EXCURSION – TALLYGAROOPNA PS

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 7th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$25 per student and \$35 per parent / guardian. This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$38 to \$46 per person

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment**. 

SHEPPARTON EDUCATION PLAN UPDATE FOR SCHOOL COMMUNITIES

One of our commitments to you is to provide school communities with regular updates regarding the Shepparton Education Plan.

The design for the new secondary school is currently underway. A couple of weeks ago we distributed the Masterplan brochures to families with students in Years 4 to 10. The Masterplan provides an overview and image for the new secondary school. This is the first level of planning.

Further schematic planning is taking place at the moment. Gray Puksand, the Architects, have conducted a series of consultation sessions with students and staff to inform this process. These will continue within the design stage.

Earlier last week a student workshop was held with a cross section of students from the four secondary schools, to gather student input regarding a *sense of belonging and connection* at school. Students were asked questions about culture, space & place, context, and wellbeing; and our Architects commented very positively about the way in which students from the four schools communicated, worked together, and could take a broad view on what a school might look like to achieve a sense of belonging and connection for students.

Staff from the secondary school sector have also been visiting schools, TAFEs and Universities elsewhere in Victoria, to see various contemporary facilities and to gain an understanding about the teaching and learning models in practice at those sites.

We are also progressing with recruitment for an Executive Principal for the new secondary school and I hope to be able to provide you with an update on this appointment soon.

The Department of Education and Training is committed to delivering on the Shepparton Education Plan as we know it's critically important for our young people and our community. We will continue to provide you with updates on the Project as we progress.

1. Changes for 2019

We are thinking of some major changes to some specific processes at school for 2019. This will make classroom time less disruptive and be more beneficial for quality learning time. This may include:

- Breakfast Club being held on a Tuesday in line with our Chaplaincy Program in the mornings. This would be implemented by John Hosking with the support of parents.
- Assembly on Monday afternoons from 2.50pm-3.15pm.

Learning time is more productive first thing in the morning and these changes will be discussed at School Council early in December. We welcome any feedback from the school community – contact the Principal

2. Specialists Programs

We can confirm that we will be having a high quality Specialist Program in 2019 to enable our students to reach their potential in a variety of learning opportunities. We also welcome some new staff to our school and hope their time here at Tallygaroopna PS will be a positive and productive one.

Art (MACC Van servicing small schools in the local area) – Mrs Hack (TBC): sessions fortnightly on a Wednesday Library (MARC Van servicing small schools in the local area) – Mr Boyer (TBC)): sessions fortnightly on a Wednesday Music – Mrs Tucker (NEW): sessions fortnightly on a Friday

P.E. – Mrs Montgomery: sessions weekly on a Wednesday

Science – Mrs Starbuck (NEW): sessions weekly on a Thursday

We are still finalising timetables for 2019 and these will be confirmed in the new year.

3. Farm Excursion

The F/1 class will be visiting Jimmy Pedretti's farm on Monday 26th November. We will aim to leave at 9am and return at approximately 11am. Students will need a drink, fruit (10am) and hat for the morning. Gum boots are recommended also. Parents are welcome to come along and help with supervision - contact the school in regard to this. Mr Brodie and Mr Flood will be in attendance as well.

No permission forms will be sent home because this is a local excursion. If you would prefer for your child to not participate in this day contact the school ASAP.

4. Excursion Policy Reminder

Our Excursion policy is found here for parents to refer to if needed. Some key points are:

- 1. Only children who have displayed sensible, reliable behaviour at school will be invited to participate in school excursions. Parents will be notified if a child is in danger of losing their invitation to participate in an excursion due to poor behaviour at school. Excursions are a privilege not a right.
- 2. Parents experiencing financial difficulty, who wish for their children to attend an excursion, will be required to discuss their individual situation with the Principal. Decisions relating to alternative payment arrangements will be made by the Principal on a case-by-case basis.

5. Bunnings BBQ

Our school is lucky to be allocated a Bunnings BBQ next year with funds raised to be used on maintenance of buildings and grounds for the school. Our date is Sunday 30th June 2019 (first weekend of Term 2 school holidays).

There will is a compulsory information night held on Thursday the 22nd of November at Bunnings in Shepparton starting at 6pm which will be attended by a school representative.

6. Christmas Concert

This will be held on Monday 17th December. All families will receive a formal letter about this evening this week – please RSVP to assist with catering by Friday 7th December. We currently don't have the prices that Tally Lions will charge for the BBQ and drinks on the night so please be prepared with change if you wish to partake of this. *Please make sure you also open the special envelope and address the information inside as soon as possible.*

7. Graduation Night

Plans are in place for the Grade 6 Graduation Dinner. We will have this event at school in the Multipurpose Room on Tuesday 18th December and the dinner will involve Grade 6 students and current and long standing staff at Tallygaroopna PS. The tea would be provided by the Parents' Club and would begin at 6pm (lasagne, salad and chips) and we hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to come to the evening and act as waiters (white shirt and black pants required). The formal Graduation Ceremony would begin in the Project Room at 7pm and the whole school community is invited to the night. We hope to wrap up the night by 8pm at the latest.

8. School Term Dates

These dates will be confirmed at School Council in December. Please keep these in a handy spot as you may wish to book your family holidays during the school holidays. All class teachers at Tallygaroopna PS will be involved in CPR training on Tuesday 29th January in the morning and will be setting up classrooms in the afternoon. As a result, all students will start on Wednesday 30th January. Foundation students will have a rest day on Wednesdays for the month of February (or longer if necessary) as they become accustomed to normal school life at Tallygaroopna PS.

Term 1 – January 29th until 5th April (all students from F-6 to start on Wednesday 30th January)

Term 2 – 23rd April until 28th June

Term 3 – 15th July until 20th September

Term 4 – 7th October until 20th December

Foundation – Rest Days (Wednesdays) – further Wednesday rest days can be negotiated if needed.

Week 2 – Wednesday 6th February
Week 3 – Wednesday 13th February
Week 4 – Wednesday 20th February
Week 5 – Wednesday 27th February

The first full week for Foundation students may begin on Monday 4th March – depending on required testing.

* The first day of Term 1 is a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students. Each year government schools are provided with four student-free days for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development, and student assessment and reporting purposes. We are obviously taking one of these at the start of the year - the remaining three student-free days are determined by each individual school, so contact your school for details.

If your plans for next year have changed or if you know of anyone moving into the area and considering enrolling at our school, please let the office know.

9. Teaching Staff - 2019

We have finalised classroom staffing for 2019 and these appointments are made in the best interests of our whole school. Families of Grade 3 students are now encouraged to speak to Mr Brodie if needed in regard to specific placements for next year. Student grades will be finalised by Monday 3rd December. We will begin the new year with 87 students which is a great result for our school. We are currently working on grade placements which we hope to confirm in the next couple of weeks. 10. School Fees

These have been approved at School Council and are summarised below – some minor changes have taken place for 2019, with the exception of the Grade 5/6 fees which include the Science Program bus costs which will be implemented at Shepparton High School (the current advised fee of \$234 is based on a Science lesson at Shepparton High once a

week for 3 terms. However, since we successfully filled the Science teaching position, this has been reduced to 2 terms only and the fee will be reduced. This will be advised in the newsletter as soon as it has been minuted at School Council). With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels. These fees do not include excursions (except for the grade 5/6 Science Program), swimming, camps or bus fees (for applicable families). Excursions are estimated to be \$50 to \$70 for Foundation to Grade 4 and \$60 to \$100 for Grade 5/6.

11. Memorabilia Raffle

The Parents' Club are organising this with thanks to Wayne Bemrose for offering to donate some items to the school again. Raffle tickets will go out soon and this will be drawn at the Christmas Concert on Monday 17th December.

12. State Election

Our school will be used as a voting centre on Saturday 24th November. Voting opens at 8am on election day and we anticipate that the Multipurpose Room will be used for this day.

13. Student Placements – Speech Therapy and Occupational Therapy

We are currently discussing some options in regard to extra support for some of our students in need. This would be in partnership with the Goulburn Region Preschool Association and the University of Melbourne. This would involve university students who are training to be Speech and Occupational Therapists working with some of our students. These people would be closely monitored by their supervisors. This could potentially be for a couple of days a week for up to 9 weeks.

14. Northerners Cricket

It sounds like cricket will be played at our school most Wednesday and Friday nights, which is fantastic. A reminder to our school community about respecting our school grounds and facilities (i.e. toilets) and for making sure that all rubbish is cleaned up when using the school facilities – bins will be available. Outside School Hours Care is still running until 6pm each day so nobody should be riding bikes in the school grounds while a school program is still being implemented for safety reasons.

We will be aiming to keep the school oval cut as best as possible and will be looking at mowing this every 2 weeks to enable the Northerners Cricket Club to use our facilities. If you can assist with this to keep costs to a minimum – contact Mr Brodie. Mowing the school oval is probably a 2 hour job which would be completed during school hours when the students are inside classrooms.

15. Bus Costs Proposal

All bus travellers for 2019 should have received a formal letter from School Council in regard to fees for bus use for next year – ineligible families only. This was introduced for the first time this year and School Council has endorsed the same costs for the new year. The school currently makes a large financial contribution in supporting families, so some changes were necessary in line with increasing costs. If you did not receive this letter, which was sent by mail – contact the school and a new letter will be sent home immediately.

If you have not paid fees for bus use for this year – can you contact the school ASAP please.

16. Contacting Staff out of School Hours

Please be mindful of contacting staff outside of school hours (beyond 5pm). This may involve text messaging, phone calls, Class Dojo and Flexibuzz. There has been a big push from the Department of Education in regard to staff and principal health & wellbeing and it is important that we all have lives away from the busy school day. We will also make an extra effort to do the same for our families, so that after work time can be devoted to families.
