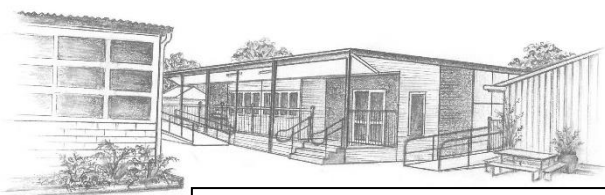

News from the Principal's Desk

Hi everyone

It is hard to believe – but there is only 5 weeks to go until the end of the 2019 school year. We have a busy last month ahead and many of the end of year events are in this edition of the newsletter. These include the end of year excursion to Whittlesea Fun Fields, the Christmas Concert and Grade 6 Graduation Night. We hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to assist us with the latter, in the role of waiters. We have started a tradition with this and a permission form went home last week looking for assistance. Return these ASAP please.

In this edition of the newsletter, we have highlighted some major extra curricula activities such as the Yachting Program and the Colour Run. During these programs, we had many parent helpers and we thank all of these wonderful people for their assistance over the last couple of weeks. We certainly don't take this support for granted and obviously parent involvement allows our children to participate in as many fun and engaging activities as possible.

We have had 3 transition days so far and all of these have been extremely successful with all of our new students for 2020 participating in these days. We tried something different last week, by having Specialist Programs during these visits and by all reports the children involved enjoyed these experiences. This arrangement will happen again on Wednesday 27th November, before the Statewide Orientation Day on Tuesday 10th December.

Last week, information was also sent home in regard to a Kluwell reading trial as well. Parents using this app may replace the reading diaries which we currently use at home – so give this a try and don't hesitate to contact the school if you need any assistance. Usernames and passwords for each child were sent home last week – contact the office if you need copies of these again.

Finally, we have had to address school pick ups in this edition of the newsletter and we recommend that all families return an OSH Care form as a back up in case parents are unable to pick children up after school. We take our duty of care very seriously at school, but school supervision concludes at 3.45pm. No children are able to use OSH Care without an enrolment form being returned, so your assistance with this matter would be appreciated.

A reminder about the grade 1 placements for next year also. In determining whether these children are in the F/1 or 1/2 class, many factors will be looked at. Among these will be the academic and social level of the students in this year level and we will endeavour to do what we think is best for this cohort of children. Please contact me directly if you would like to discuss your child's placement for 2020 – thanks to the families who have done this already.

Finally, planning is going well with the end of year excursion and spots are filling up fast. Please respond to this ASAP to assist with planning and we hope to confirm the buses for this event by the end of the month. Numbers need to be confirmed by Monday 25th November.

I look forward to catching up with parents throughout the week. I will be away on Friday unfortunately and don't forget that Monday is a Curriculum Day (Pupil Free Day).

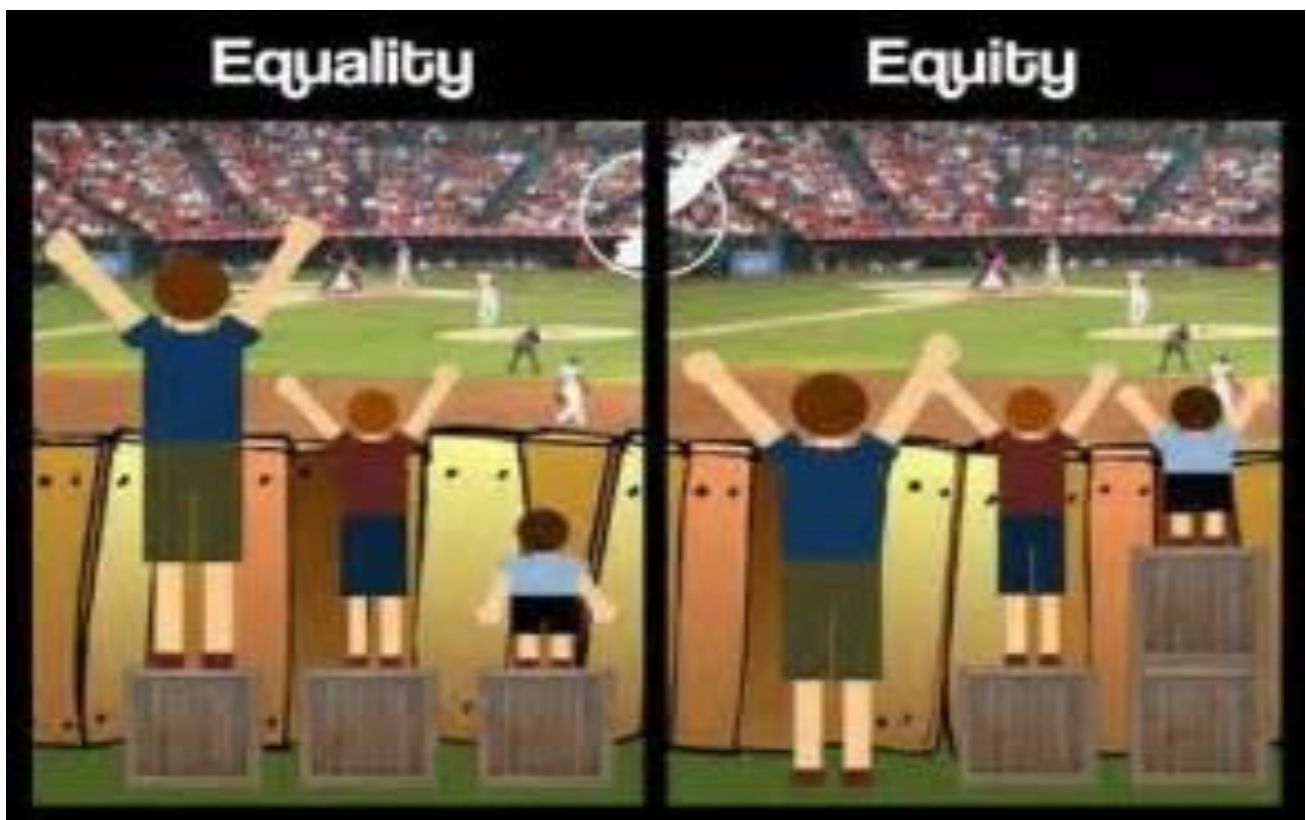

END OF YEAR EXCURSION – TALLYGAROPNA PS

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 6th December. The Parents Club have kindly offered to subsidise some of the entry fee to Fun Fields along with the bus. As a result, tickets will be \$25 per student and \$35 per parent / guardian (same price as 2018). This cost is significantly reduced but no changes in prices will be made to any families choosing to drive down by car. Normal general admission ranges from \$41.50 to \$49.50 per person

This can be paid to the office now. Bus arrangements will cater for 2x 57 seats - **Please book your spot now to avoid disappointment.** The Fun Park is open from 10am until 4.30pm, so we anticipate leaving Tallygaroopna PS at about 7.30am and leaving at 4.30pm. We should arrive back at school by about 6.30pm. Alerts regarding arrival will be updated frequently via Flexibuzz.

This day is strictly for students of the school and parents / guardians. If families wish to bring other siblings other arrangements will need to be made in regard to travel and entry to Fun Fields – but please consult with the School Principal in regard to this. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.

We have scheduled this night for Monday 16th December beginning at 5.30pm with tea if families wish. What's happening in Physical Education?

Well here we are, Term 4 and the year is quickly drawing to an end. We have started this term by looking at some International games. So far, we have played Mollky (Finska or Jenjo all similar game with different names), Spike Ball (America), Hunger Games (Saudia Arabia) and Ultimate Frisbee (America).

Mollky (Finska or Jenjo)

This game originated from Finland, fun for all the family and it is also mathematically educational. The aim of the game is to knock down wooden pins with a large wooden baton. The pins are arranged in a small cluster and are numbered 1-12. The first to score 50 is the winner. Can be played individually or in teams. Pins that are knocked down must be free of any other pins to be counted, if only one pin is knocked over your score is the number on that pin eg. 6. If you knock over more than one pin you count the number of pins knocked over eg 3 pins. The pins are set up where they land and if you go over 50 your score goes back to 25. Good for the beach, river or the backyard. The children have enjoyed playing this different game.



Spike Ball

We have also played a game called Spike Ball, an American sport. The game is a combination of volleyball and four square and can be very competitive and challenging. A small bouncy ball is hit into a net which looks like a miniature trampoline. Teams line up across from each other with the Spike Ball net in between. The serving team hits the ball into the net towards the opposing team in a manner where it cannot be returned to score points. The equipment for this game was borrowed from another school.

1. OSH Enrolment Forms – School Pick Ups (urgent)

We have had some students being picked up late after school during the last couple of weeks. As a result, we would like some more enrolments forms in for OSH Care, so that students can go into this service straight after school if needed. Supervision with staff after school is from 3.25pm to 3.45pm and it is unfair for school staff to supervise children beyond this time because of specific commitments. Staff will not be supervising staff beyond 3.45pm - hence OSH is the preferred service.

We currently have only 24 enrolment forms in and we would prefer to have 81 - for all of the students in the school. A note to all families will be distributed this week - reminding families of this along with OSH Care forms being distributed again (these need to be completed for each student).

After school hours

This table describes how schools should manage a student who is normally collected from school but is still at school beyond normal collection time, particularly primary students.

Stage / Who / Description:

1. School attempts to contact:
 - the parents
 - the emergency contact person identified in the school records
 - other known contacts.
2. School considers contacting the police or Department of Human Services to arrange care and protection if:
 - all reasonable attempts to locate the appropriate responsible adults, as per Stage 1 above, fail
 - it is well beyond reasonable collection time.
3. School leaves details of the student's whereabouts with the school office.
4. School If possible, leave details of the student's whereabouts with friends of the student or next door neighbours.

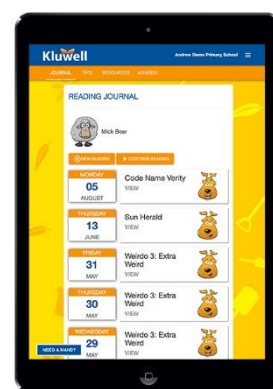
2. Reading App Trial - Kluwell

Last week, every student in the school received information in regard to using Kluwell's new reading app to record your child's reading at home. This is a web based app, no need to download - it can be used on any device anytime, anywhere (just add to home screen).

Specific user notes are available on Flexibuzz - feel free to contact the school if you need any help with this.

We may be utilising this in the future - replacing the reading diaries.

3. Student Borrowing

This has concluded for the 2019 school year. We still have a couple of sessions of the MARC Van left, so could any books outstanding please be returned to school ASAP. Any items that have not been returned by this session will need to be dropped to Congupna PS before the end of the year – this will be the parent's responsibility.

4. Class Teachers - 2020

8. Excursion Policy Reminder

Our Excursion policy is found [here](#) for parents to refer to if needed. Some key points are:

1. Only children who have displayed sensible, reliable behaviour at school will be invited to participate in school excursions. Parents will be notified if a child is in danger of losing their invitation to participate in an excursion due to poor behaviour at school. Excursions are a privilege not a right.

2. Parents experiencing financial difficulty, who wish for their children to attend an excursion, will be required to discuss their individual situation with the Principal. Decisions relating to alternative payment arrangements will be made by the Principal on a case-by-case basis.

9. Christmas Concert

This will be held on Monday 16th December. All families have received a formal letter about this evening – please RSVP to assist with catering by Friday 6th December. We currently don't have the prices that Tally Lions will charge for the BBQ and drinks on the night so please be prepared with change if you wish to partake of this. *Please make sure you also open the special envelope and address the information inside as soon as possible – **this was sent home last week.***



10. Graduation Night

Plans are in place for the Grade 6 Graduation Dinner. We will have this event at school in the Multipurpose Room on Tuesday 17th December and the dinner will involve Grade 6 students and current and long standing staff at Tallygaroopna PS. The tea would be provided by the Parents' Club and would begin at 6pm (lasagne, salad and chips) and we hope that some of the Grade 5 students will be able to come to the evening and act as waiters (white shirt and black pants required). The formal Graduation Ceremony would begin in the Project Room at 7pm and the whole school community is invited to attend. We hope to wrap up the night by 8pm at the latest.

11. Accident Insurance - reminder

Our school does not have an accident insurance policy to cover student injuries or ambulance transport. A reminder to parents and guardians that they are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment and ambulance attendance/transport. We recommend all families arrange ambulance cover in case of emergency. There are also a variety of commercial insurance policies available that would cover accidents at school.

12. Curriculum Day

Our last Curriculum Day for the year will be held on Monday 25th November. This will involve report writing, planning for 2020 and staff health & wellbeing. This is a pupil free day and families will need to make alternative arrangements – there will be no OSH Care on this day.

13. Bus Costs Proposal

Bus travellers will soon receive a formal letter from School Council regarding fees for bus use in 2020 – ineligible families only. Bus fees have been in place for the last few years and School Council has slightly increased fees for next year. The school makes a large financial contribution in supporting families, so some changes were necessary in line with increasing costs. If you do not receive this letter, which will be sent by mail – contact the school and a new letter will be sent home.

If you have not paid fees for bus use for this year – can you contact the school ASAP please.

14. Australian Fitness Education Award

Over the next few PE sessions, students in Grades 5/6 will be participating in some running activities which are part of the AFEA. Good running shoes are required. This program focuses on individual fitness, flexibility and co-ordination. The aim for all students is to improve on their own performance over time. The testing is conducted over a few weeks and will indicate progress in relation to general fitness. If you would like to know more about this program please contact the school. It is now a major part of the Physical Education and Health Assessment for this year and results will be put into student books. All student results will remain confidential.

15. OSH Care Costs

At the last School Council meeting we decided to increase OSH Care fees for 2020. These have been simplified and will be \$25 for a full session and \$15 for a short session (finishing by 4.30pm). These increases were needed in order to make this service financially viable for the future and we hope that this service will be generally well supported by the school community.

16. Chaplaincy – 2020

We can confirm that we will be having Chaplaincy Support (Welfare) in 2020 again after formally accepting an extension of 12 months this week. John Hosking has agreed to stay on in this role for Semester 1, which is terrific. We will be going through an application process to fill this position for Semester 2 in 2020 and more information will be available later in the new year.

17. School Bus Travellers - 2020
