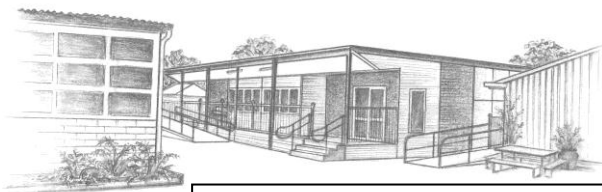

1. Grade 6 Scholarship

Spade Computers has kindly offered a Scholarship for a Grade 6 student to the value of \$500. All students are encouraged to submit an application which will need to be given to Mr Brodie by Friday 13th December. The Scholarship will be awarded to the student on Tuesday 17th December at the Christmas Concert / Graduation Night and presented by David Steigenberger from Spade Computers. A lot of consideration has been made in regard to making this process fair for everyone, but to make it meaningful only one award will be given. Staff at school will have the hard task of selecting the recipient of this scholarship and Spade Computers will be involved in the decision process as well. We hope this partnership may continue for years to come.



The application should be between 250 and 500 words and typed up. The application should be completed at home and students will need to follow the guidelines below:

Application:

1. Comment on your time at Tallygaroopna Primary School.
2. Comment on what have been your highlights at Tallygaroopna Primary School.
3. Comment on what makes Tallygaroopna Primary School unique.
4. Comment on how you have demonstrated behaviour and a work ethic that reflects our school values of Respect, Honesty and Inclusion.

All grade 6 students received a formal letter in relation to this last Friday.

2. Bounce Back Program

During our Curriculum Day which focused on Component 2 of Kidsmatter, we were able to look at a number of resources which could be implemented in to the classroom. As a result, we will be implementing a new program called Bounce Back in 2014. Bounce Back is an award-winning wellbeing and resilience class-based program for children and young people from Kindergarten to Middle School.

Bounce Back! offers practical strategies to help children and young people function well at school and in life. It is also a whole school social and emotional learning curriculum program which promotes positive mental health, wellbeing and resilience for students and teachers plus safe and supportive class and school learning environments.



Each Teacher Resource has 9 Curriculum Units

1. Core Values – developing positive and pro social values
2. People Bouncing Back – developing strategies for coping and bouncing back
3. Courage – finding courage in both everyday life and difficult circumstances
4. Looking on the Bright Side – teaching optimistic thinking
5. Emotions – amplifying positive emotions and managing negative emotions
6. Relationships – skills for building and maintaining friendships
7. Humour – as a coping skill
8. No Bullying – skills for countering bullying
9. Success – (STAR, CHAMP, WINNERS) – skills and attitudes for being successful

We are also in the process of purchasing some new story / picture books which will complement the program and we look forward to using this program and all staff and students being rejuvenated with the teaching of Social Skills.

3. Senior Playground

Today at assembly, we discussed safe play on the school playgrounds. During the last few weeks, some children have been playing inappropriately on both the senior and junior playgrounds so this was discussed at length. As a result, to ensure everyone is safe at school students from Prep – Year 2 will not be allowed to use the yellow slide, platform, climbing wall and red curled entry to the platform. They are strongly encouraged to use the Junior Playground area which is next to the cubby house. This is in line with the Guidelines for School Playgrounds so could this be reinforced at home please. We are in the process of getting some signage in regard to this as well.

Guidelines for School Playgrounds - 3.5 Height of fall

The 'height of fall' is the greatest distance between a part of the equipment to which a child has reasonably foreseeable access and the playing surface of equipment beneath. This should not exceed 2.5 metres. It is appropriate to reduce the distance, particularly when younger children may be involved. A separate play area for students in Prep to Year 2 may be desirable where a maximum fall height of 1.5m is considered preferable.

4. Sharing Passwords – Safe Use

It has come to our attention, that some students have been sharing passwords or using mobile devices at school inappropriately either in or out of the classroom. This is bad practice and is not in line with E Smart Policy which is signed by all students. Could this agreement be reinforced at home please.

Part B - Student Agreement

- not interfere with network security, the data of another user or attempt to log into the network with a user name or password of another student
- **not reveal my password to anyone except the system administrator or the teacher**
- not bring or download unauthorised programs, including games, to the school or run them on school computers

On Tuesday 10th December, it is the State-wide Orientation Day. Students will be in their new grades for 2014 for the whole day – including new Preps for 2014. Good luck to our current Grade 6 students who will attend Wanganui Park SC for the whole day and utilise the bus for transport as well.

Bev Montgomery, our Uniform Coordinator will be at school on Orientation Day, 10th December to help our 2014 Prep student parents with uniforms. An order will be put through after this day so if anyone wishes to order uniforms could they please place an order before this date.

6. Bus Service for 2014

I am currently in the process of organizing the new bus route for the start of 2014. This takes some time to organize and I will be contacting families over the holiday period to inform them of specific times and drop off and pick up points. 8. Outside School Hours Care

At our last School Council meeting, it was decided that we would look at implementing Outside Hours School Care next year. We are still in the planning stages at present, but we are looking at supporting families from 3.30pm until 6pm from Wednesday until Friday for the 2014 school year. Further details will be available in the next few weeks – all staff went to Guthrie St. PS a couple of weeks ago after school to observe their OSH Care Program, which will assist with implementation between now and the end of the year. **This announcement is a fantastic one for our school and we hope that it will be a success next year and hopefully financially viable for years to come.** If anyone can help out in any way with this program feel free to contact David Brodie at school.

9. T20 Blast Cricket Tournament

Students in Grades 2/3/4 will have an opportunity to participate in the next T20 Blast Cricket Tournament tomorrow. **We have entered 2 teams and Andrea Walker has kindly offered to coach the boys team.** As always, behaviour and attendance will be closely monitored leading up to these events. Excursions are a privilege not a right at Tallygaroopna Primary School. All Grade 2/3/4 students participated in a clinic last Wednesday afternoon. **Permission forms went home last week and transport arrangements were indicated on this form – Mr Brodie and 3 parents.**



10. Water Safety Week Excursion

Schools are invited to send students to participate in a variety of activities aimed at creating a greater awareness of the importance of water safety. Students will experience in and on water activities they may not have tried before at an open water venue. The students will be given strategies on how to react to emergency situations with self-preservation as the paramount consideration. They will experience situations where they need to implement survival strategies in a challenging situation. The emphasis will be on safety in and around water in all activities.

Permission forms went home last week and 7 students in Grades 5/6 qualify for this program. Students who don't meet the qualifications below will remain at school with Mrs Haberfield. The session will be held on Wednesday 4th December from 12.30pm until 2.30pm and travel will be provided by Mr Brodie and Mrs Armstrong if needed.

STUDENT QUALIFICATIONS

Grade 5 & 6 students who have completed Level 4 or higher or have obtained the Victorian Water Safety Certificate.

The students will participate in a 2 hour session which will encompass the following.

1. Survival swimming techniques
2. Canoeing
2. Boogie Boards/Surf Skis
3. Simulated night swimming
4. Buoyancy to assist in survival swimming

11. Term Dates - 2014
