1. Grade 6 Scholarship Applications – DUE FRIDAY

A lot of consideration has been made in regard to making this process fair for everyone, but to make it meaningful only one award will be Computers & Office Machines



given. Staff at school will have the hard task of selecting the recipient of this scholarship and Spade Computers will be involved in the decision process as well. We hope this partnership may continue for years to come.

The application should be between 250 and 500 words and typed up. The application should be completed at home and students will need to follow the guidelines below:

- 4. Comment on how you have demonstrated behaviour and a work ethic that reflects our school values of Respect, Honesty and Inclusion.

All grade 6 students received a formal letter in relation to this.

2. Class Structures for 2014

Next year again promises to be a very exciting one at Tallygaroopna Primary School. We anticipate starting the year with 47 students, with the aim of building on this for the future. We will continue to provide well-structured and resourced literacy and numeracy blocks along with a variety of specialist subjects as well. Art, Library, LOTE (Italian), Science, Information Technology and Physical Education will continue to be implemented.

Next year, we will be still keeping our 3 grades and I will continue teaching in a Full Time capacity.

Science – taught by all class teachers Bounce Back - taught by all class teachers Information Technology – Mr Brodie / Mrs Haberfield Physical Education – Mr Brodie / Mrs Wallace

We hope Library will continue to be held on a Thursday, with Art also on a Friday – to be confirmed. These days will alternate each week.

3. School Reports

As stated previously, school reports will be distributed in sealed envelopes next Monday. If parents would like some more feedback about individual student performance at school feel free to contact class teachers to arrange an informal meeting once reports are distributed to families. Teachers spend a lot of valuable time putting these together so please take the time to read these before the school year ends. Remember that these reports can be placed in the green report folders which every student at school should have.

The report cards have:

- a chart with an A-E rating, showing your child's current progress against the expected state-wide standard as well as the progress they have made since the previous year
- a chart showing your child's level of effort and class behaviour
- details about attendance
- easy to understand comments from teachers outlining what your child knows and can do, any areas in which your child needs to be given further help or extended, and how this will be done
- suggestions for how you can help at home

4. End of Year Excursion

A huge thank you to the many families who attended the Echuca excursion and helped with supervision. This was an enjoyable day considering the fluctuating weather. Consultation will take place early next year in regard to the 2014 excursion, but at this stage we hope to perhaps do something different. Feel free to give the staff any feedback in regard to the day and we will take this on board when we begin planning next year.

5. Shirt Signing - Grade 6

Only Grade 6 students will have an opportunity to sign some of their school shirts if they have written permission by their parents. This will need to be handed into Mr Brodie. This will occur on the last day of school in the morning and all shirts to be signed should be placed in a plastic bag. The last day of the year is a Causal Day so no school uniforms will be required on this day. Please take into consideration if you would like to use these uniforms into the future. The day gives students the chance to take away a souvenir from their time at Primary School – not compulsory.

6. Grade 5/6 Class

Grade 5/6 students have decided to participate in Kris Kringle for Christmas. These will be handed out to students on the last day of school – Friday 20th December. Details are below:

- Presents can be things you have at home, which you don't use but are wrapped and not opened. The other
 choice is to buy something.
- Minimum limit of about \$10. You can spend more if you wish personal choice.
- Try and get something suitable for the person you have drawn Mr Brodie has details about this.
- Who you draw out should remain secret to add a little bit of fun.
- You can tell them if you like when they receive their present.
- You can add your own flavour to this poem, photos, stories, funny moments
- To make if fun as well you can over the next couple of weeks give them little treats (small lollies, toys, treats). You will need to be sneaky and clever with this.

Our Final Spelling and Tables Test was held today. The Big Spelling Test will be held on Wednesday 11th December. There will be no homework and tests for the last week of school. Home Reading is still strongly encouraged. Next week we will have our Class Party on Thursday 19th of December (a movie will be included – either G or PG) and Grade 6's will have an opportunity to sign shirts for souvenirs on the Friday – last day of school.

7. 2014 Preps

During the month of February, students in Preps will not attend school on Wednesdays. The first full week will begin in the week starting Monday 3rd March. All students will be required to attend school on Thursday 30th January.

8. Senior Playground

Last week at assembly, we discussed safe play on the school playgrounds. During the last few weeks, some children have been playing inappropriately on both the senior and junior playgrounds so this was discussed at length. As a result, to ensure everyone is safe at school students from Prep - Year 2 will not be allowed to use the yellow slide, platform, climbing wall and red curled entry to the platform. They are strongly encouraged to use the Junior Playground area which is next to the cubby house. This is in line with the Guidelines for School Playgrounds so could this be reinforced at home please. We are in the process of getting some signage in regard to this as well.

Guidelines for School Playgrounds - 3.5 Height of fall

The 'height of fall' is the greatest distance between a part of the equipment to which a child has reasonably foreseeable access and the playing surface of equipment beneath. This should not exceed 2.5 metres. It is appropriate to reduce the distance, particularly when younger children may be involved. A separate play area for students in Prep to Year 2 may be desirable where a maximum fall height of 1.5m is considered preferable.

9. Orientation Day

On Tuesday 10th December, it is the State-wide Orientation Day. Students will be in their new grades for 2014 for the whole day – including new Preps for 2014. Good luck to our current Grade 6 students who will attend Wanganui Park SC for the whole day and utilise the bus for transport as well.

Bev Montgomery, our Uniform Coordinator will be at school on Orientation Day, 10th December to help our 2014 Prep student parents with uniforms. An order will be put through after this day so if anyone wishes to order uniforms could they please place an order before this date.

10. Bus Service for 2014

I am currently in the process of organizing the new bus route for the start of 2014. This takes some time to organize and I will be contacting families over the holiday period to inform them of specific times and drop off and pick up points. Currently, I have the following students wishing to use the bus for the beginning of 2014. Unfortunately, we are unable to get a larger bus for next year, so I will be discussing this issue with some families this week because there are only 21 available seats on our school bus.
