2. Graduation Night / Christmas Concert

During the month of February, students in Foundation (Preps) will not attend school on Wednesdays. Their first full week for Foundation students may begin in the week starting Monday 6th March.

6. Canberra Camp - 2017

We have had a great response from our school in regard to a possible camp at Canberra for the senior students for next year. We are in need of at least 40 students going to this camp and families will be constantly informed if any further progress eventuates.

7. Shirt Signing – Grade 6

Only Grade 6 students will have an opportunity to sign some of their school shirts if they have **written permission by their parents. This will need to be handed into Miss Triffett.** This will occur on the last day of school in the morning and all shirts to be signed should be placed in a plastic bag. The last day of the year is a Casual Day so no school uniforms will be required on this day. Please take into consideration if you would like to use these uniforms into the future. The day gives students the chance to take away a souvenir from their time at Primary School – not compulsory.

8. School Reports

As stated previously, school reports will be distributed in sealed envelopes next Thursday 15th December. If parents would like some more feedback about individual student performance at school feel free to contact class teachers to arrange an informal meeting once reports are distributed to families. Teachers spend a lot of valuable time putting these together so please take the time to read these before the school year ends. Remember that these reports can be placed in the green report folders which every student at school should have.

The report cards have:

- * a chart with an A-E rating (Well Above the Expected Standard – Well Below the Expected Standard), showing your child's current progress against the expected state-wide standard as well as the progress they have made since the previous year
- * a chart showing your child's level of effort and class behaviour
- * details about attendance
- * easy to understand comments from teachers outlining what your child knows and can do, any areas in which your child needs to be given further help or extended, and how this will be done.

11. Term Dates for 2017

These dates have now been confirmed at School Council. Please keep these in a handy spot as you may wish to book your family holidays during the school holidays. All class teachers at Tallygaroopna PS will be involved in First Aid / CPR Training on Monday 30th January all day and be involved in a Planning Day for the start of the School Year on the Tuesday. As a result, all students will start on the Wednesday.

Term 1 – January 30th until 31st March (all students from F-6 to start on Wednesday 1st February)

* The first day of Term 1 is a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students. Each year government schools are provided with four student-free days for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development, and student assessment and reporting purposes. We are obviously taking 2 of these at the start of the year - the remaining two student-free days are determined by each individual school, so contact your school for details.

15. End of Year Excursion

Planning for the trip to Whittlesea Fun Fields is progressing well and we can confirm that this day will be held on Friday 16th December. As a result, tickets will be \$20 for students and \$35 for parents / guardians – travelling by bus. Parents travelling in their own cars will be charged \$22 each. This can be paid to the office now. If anyone is attending but is not part of the School Group – normal gate prices will apply. Students can be supervised by staff on the day if needed as well if parents / guardians are unable to attend – please let us know ASAP.
