BE YOU FACT SHEET



How does exercise affect mental health and wellbeing?

Physical activity promotes many aspects of child and adolescent development, including social and emotional skills, as well as physical development of motor skills.

It also supports mental wellbeing. We know that high levels of inactivity can lead to a greater risk of both physical and mental health problems.

Physical activity:

- can increase levels of serotonin and endorphins; the neurotransmitters involved in regulating and improving mood
- promotes sleep which also helps regulate moods, increase energy levels and improve memory and learning
- increases the connections between the brain neurons, which improves memory and learning capacity
- pumps blood to the brain to boost mood, concentration and alertness
- promotes relaxation by reducing skeletal muscle tension
- provides children and young people with an outlet for excess energy and frustration, which relieves tension
- provides an opportunity for children and young to socialise and meet new people, reducing loneliness and isolation
- improves motor and cognitive skills, which boosts self-esteem
- distracts children and young people from negative thoughts.

These benefits also serve to improve classroom behaviour and promote a more positive learning environment.



- <u>1. Key Changes to COVID-19 Operational Guidelines from DET –</u> Below are a number of key changes to COVID-19 operational guidelines from DET which begin on Monday 30th November.
 - Arrival and departure: This will return to front of school only. Supervision will begin at 8.30am, with students moving to their classrooms at the 8.45am bell. In the mornings, staff will be preparing the day.
 - Physical distancing: Students and families should not congregate at the school gate before or after school and will be required to maintain 1.5 metres between each other as far as is practicable at the start and end of the school day.
 - **Graduation:** Our Graduation Ceremony on Tuesday 15th December at 7pm at school is now open to family members further information will be communicated early next week.
 - State-wide Orientation Day at Tallygaroopna PS: This will now be all day on Tuesday December 8th.
 - Face masks: These are no longer required outdoors except where 1.5 metres physical distancing cannot be maintained. Individuals over the age of 12 must carry a face mask at all times.
 - Drinking fountains and taps will be reopened for normal use. Taps will be flushed for a number of minutes before use.
 - On-site Access: Parents can be welcomed back on site, for example for school drop-offs and pick-ups. To support contact tracing, we must keep a record of all staff, students and visitors who attend on-site for more than 15 minutes. Please use the visitor book at the office to do this. Parents should continue to schedule appointments with staff when required use Class Dojo for communication.
 - **School tours:** We can now conduct on-site school tours for prospective students and their families during operating hours, in accordance with gathering limits.
 - Illnesses: Students with underlying conditions (such as hay fever or asthma) should still be tested for coronavirus (COVID-19) if they develop symptoms that are different to or worse than their usual symptoms. Parents/carers should also consider getting a medical certificate from the child's treating GP to confirm that it is safe for them to attend school with persistent symptoms that may overlap with some of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) such as cough or runny nose.
 - Assemblies: These will continue via Webex each Friday, with some exceptions communicated via Skool Loop.
- <u>2. End of Year Celebrations</u> As stated previously; our Christmas concert will not go ahead this year but we have started plans for some Christmas songs to be performed by each class along with a whole school performance. These will be available on one of our online platforms there will be more details available soon.
- 3. Grade 6 Students: Orientation Day The state-wide Orientation day is on Tuesday 8th December. Orientation days are being held for 3 out of the 5 schools (GSSC, Num SC, Ace) that our Grade 6 students are attending in 2021. Notre Dame and St. Mary's of the Angels are not having an Orientation Day on Tuesday 8th December. Students going to those 2 schools above will attend Primary School Miss Love will take these students for the day while the rest of the school moves into new classes for 2021 with new teaching and support staff.

4. School Fees

School fees for 2020 are now due. These were itemised in the letter sent home at the start of the year.


