#### 10. School Reports

If parents would like some more feedback about individual student performance at school feel free to contact class teachers to arrange an informal meeting once reports are distributed to families on Monday 17th December. Teachers spend a lot of valuable time putting these together so please take the time to read these before the school year ends. Remember that these reports can be placed in the green report folders which every student at school should have.

The report cards have:

- a chart with an A-E rating, showing your child's current progress against the expected state-wide standard as well as the progress they have made since the previous year
- a chart showing your child's level of effort and class behaviour
- details about attendance
- easy to understand comments from teachers outlining what your child knows and can do, any areas in which your child needs to be given further help or extended, and how this will be done
- suggestions for how you can help at home

If this eventuates, all parents will be notified by phone early in the new year.

#### 15. School Fees for 2013

Next year, school fees will increase by \$10 to \$150 for the school year. This is in line with the ongoing cost increases with many things in society at present. This includes subsidizing school supplies along with many programs which are implemented at school including MACC Van, MARC Van, Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Ziptales, Skoodle, etc. Again, there will be no set Excursion Levy included next year. As a result, families will have 2 options – either to pay for excursions throughout the year as they occur or, pay an amount upfront which will be allocated to excursions as they occur. This system allows families to be able to track what excursions are held and paid for.

#### 16. 2013 Preps

During the month of February, students in Preps will not attend school on Wednesdays. The first full week will begin in the week starting Monday 4th March. All students will be required to attend school on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> January.



# Prep for Parents: Preparing For Next Year

Your child is almost at the end of their first year of school. If you think back to the start of the year and everything that you and your child have been through – all the things they have learnt and the way they have developed and changed – it may feel like no time at all.

#### But what's next?

Apart from all the activities your child's school may have to celebrate the end of a year of learning, developing, finding friends and getting to know a whole brand new environment, there are the summer holidays to look forward to before your child starts another year of school.

## Preparing for the summer holidays

Remember, your child needs some downtime just like you do. Giving them time to just be themselves is as important as giving them good food and lots of love.

The summer holidays are an opportunity to allow your child some space to just be themselves. This may help them work through their feelings about going to school and should help your child to imbed all the learning they've done during the year and help make sense of their lessons.

Celebrating Christmas is also a time to encourage family and friends to give your child books and activities that will support their learning. Choose things your child is interested in and look for presents that will keep them busy and occupied during the heat of the day.

# What your child will be learning at school next year

During their first year of school your child's teacher focused on developing reading, writing, spelling, maths and problem-solving skills. Your child explored the world around them and developed physical, creative and technical skills. And hopefully they had a wonderful time meeting and making new friends and settling into a whole new environment.

Next year, your child's new teacher will add to and extend your child's reading and writing skills. They will encourage your child to continue to develop good relationships with others in their class and in their school and to understand themselves as well.

Your child's teacher will continue to develop your child's co-ordination skills by encouraging them to play, run, jump, catch, balance, skip, and extend their physical activity through dance, gymnastics and games.

Your child will also add to their mathematics and science learning by describing things that are similar, using things like size, shape, colour and weight; using everyday objects to identify and describe points, lines, edges and surfaces; and comparing objects using terms such as longer, heavier, fuller and hotter.

And your child will continue to explore their creative side, discussing the things they are creating and describing their, and others' work, and how they feel about it.

### What you can do at home

There will be many opportunities to continue to take an active part in your child's learning next year.

Keep talking to your child about the things they did and enjoyed at school each day. Talk to your child about the things they had concerns about as well.

There is a lot you can continue to do at home that will support your child's learning through everyday experiences.

- Have problems they can help solve, like a jigsaw puzzle or helping you sort the laundry (especially the socks!) These are great ways to tap into their problem-solving abilities.
- Do things that interest them, like an existing hobby or activity they love. For example, if your child likes helping you cook you can introduce a lot of learning – like reading, maths and science – while you cook together.
- Enjoying spontaneous activities in response to your child's questions can go a long way to encouraging their curiosity.
- Help them find answers or solutions to problems themselves. Show your child how to look things up in a book, in an encyclopaedia or on the computer, and let them find the answers themselves.
- When talking to your child, ask reflective questions like 'how' 'why' or 'what if...' as this helps them to think deeply about their responses.

# Beyond Primary: Preparing For Next Year

The end of primary school marks a major transition in your child's life. It's a time for reflection on what your child has experienced and learnt during their primary school years – perhaps wondering where the years have gone.

Many parents have concerns about the changes that the next year will bring. After all, your child may be entering a new environment, with new and greater expectations, especially academically.

You may already have visited your child's new school and met or spoken to their new teachers.

You'll have probably looked at purchasing new school uniforms, books and equipment, including calculators, laptops and other items your child will need for their schooling next year.

So what more can you do to prepare your child for this next big step in their lives?

### What you can do

At secondary school there will be many opportunities for you to continue to take an active part in what your child is learning at school.

Show your child that you are there to help and support them by listening and offering suggestions.

One way to help is by building your child's confidence. You can do this by openly acknowledging the things they do well. They don't have to have done anything particularly special; telling your child that you value them and appreciate their qualities – like how well they help around the house or how thoughtful they are – will go a long way to building and maintaining your child's confidence.

Talk to your child about going to secondary school as often as you think is needed over the summer holidays. Ask your child what they think it will be like. Do they expect they'll have more homework? Will they learn more things? Are they expecting to enjoy themselves? Feel safe and at ease? What do they think their teachers will be like? What do they think the other kids in the classes will be like? What are they most looking forward to? Listening to your child talk may give you some indication of their concerns. If they have concerns, discuss their options. Let them know that you take these seriously and are there to help.

Ask your child's primary school about things you can do at home over the coming school break to help make this step easier for your child.


