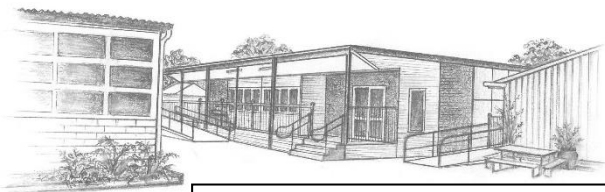

Hi everyone,

This is the last full edition of the school newsletter for 2016. 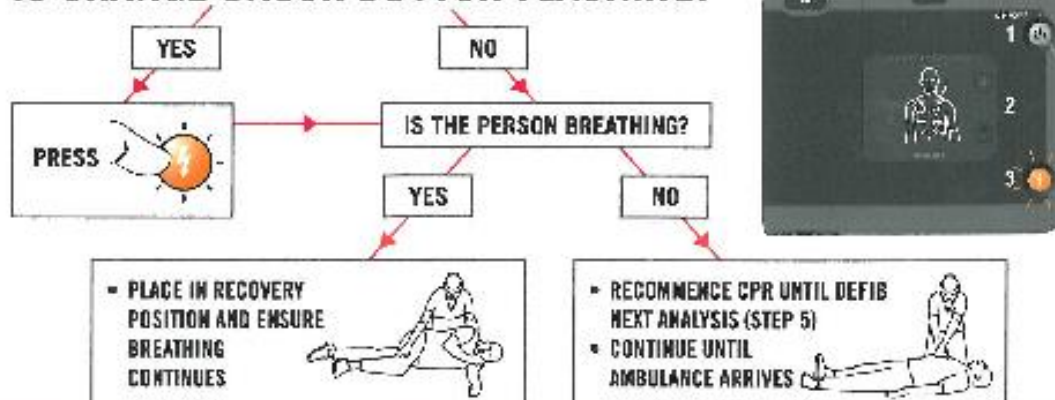

Start CPR - 30 compressions : 2 breaths

If unwilling or unable to perform breaths, perform chest compressions only (100/min)

D DEFIBRILLATION

Apply defibrillator (AED) as soon as available

Follow the voice prompts

Continue CPR until —

- The patient shows responsiveness and normal breathing
- More qualified help arrives
- You are physically unable to continue
