

We continue to rely on parents, carers and families to be aware of the transport arrangements for their child for the coming school year.



### 4. Traffic – follow up

Some members of School Council and the Parent Club had a meeting with Council and Regional Roads Victoria staff on the 11th November to discuss road safety issues in front of Tallygaroopna Primary School. From this meeting, Council will undertake the follow safety improvements:

- 1) Shift red and white posts on south side towards road to make them more conspicuous.
- 2) Shift No Parking signs on both side of the road on the east approach back near the existing time zone signs.
- 3) Shift No Parking signs on both side of the road on the west approach back near the existing time zone signs.
- 4) Install/update repeater signs for school symbol children/school signs.
- 5) Paint centre-of road barrier lines on both approaches to the school crossing.
- 6) Paint zig-zag lines on pavement on school crossing approaches
- 7) Paint "40" on pavement on school crossing approaches
- 8) Re-fresh school crossing lines at school crossing.

It was anticipated that these works will be performed in November / December – we are currently following this up.



### 5. Christmas Concert - Bake Sale

The students have chosen to raise money for recent New South Wales and Queensland bushfire victims through the Vinnies Bushfire Appeal. ### 6. OSH Care - Last family leaving the service

In our Staff Handbook with OSH Care we have a number of Safe Work Practices. One of these focuses on our OSH Educator leaving the program at the end of the day. "The educator must leave the program with the last adult/parent at the same time the last child is collected. It will therefore be necessary for the coordinator to complete any tasks normally done at the conclusion of the program prior to the last child's departure from the program."

### 7. Excursions - 2020

We are looking into a whole school excursion to the Melbourne Aquarium in Term 2. This excursion would complement our Ocean Theme and more details will be available early next year. The Grade 5/6 students will also be attending the BioLab at Belmont (Geelong) on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March.





### 8. Respectful Relationships

As educators we share a common purpose – to provide our students with an education that gives each child the best start to a happy, healthy and prosperous life.

Victoria's Respectful Relationship initiative supports school leaders, educators and our school communities to promote and model respect and equality – and to teach our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence.

The Royal Commission into Family Violence identified the critical role that schools have in creating a culture of respect to change the story of family violence for future generations. In 2016, respectful relationship education became a core component of the Victorian Curriculum from Prep to Year 12, and is being taught in all government and Catholic schools and many independent schools.

We will be a partner school next year with support from our lead school – Shepparton East PS. We look forward to a positive association with this school and I am sure that some

### 10. School Leadership for 2020 (Captains / Vice Captains)

The current Grade 5 students have decided that they would like to present their captains speeches before the end of the year, rather than at the beginning of the year as has been the process in the past. We welcome this change, as student voice is an area we are striving to improve across the school.

The Grade 5s will give their speeches on Wednesday 18th December at 11.55am and all families are welcome to attend if they wish. Miss Lothian will record all speeches for families who are unable to attend.

The current captains will present badges to the new captains at our last assembly on Friday December 20th at 2 pm. Students have started working on their speeches in class.

### 11. Shirt Signing

Only Grade 6 students will have an opportunity to sign some of their school shirts if they have **written permission by their parents. This will need to be handed to Miss Lothian**. This will occur on the last day of school in the morning and all shirts to be signed should be placed in a plastic bag. The last day of the year is a casual day so no school uniforms will be required. Please take into consideration if you would like to use these uniforms into the future. The day gives students the chance to take away a souvenir from their time at Primary School – not compulsory.

### 12. Grade 5/6 Muck Up Day

On Thursday 19th December, the Grade 5/6 students will be having a Muck Up Day in the afternoon. This will involve some water fights and students can bring in water balloons, buckets, water pistols..etc for this. This will begin after lunch beginning at 2pm and conclude at 2.45pm – enough time to dry off at the end of the day. This activity will be closely monitored by Miss Lothian and Mr Brodie and students will be invited to participate – depending on behaviour at school. If you would prefer for your child to not participate contact the school please.

### 13. School Council – meetings for 2020

### 14. Playground Upgrade - Soft fall

We are having some major works on the playgrounds over the holiday break. This area will be roped off and out of bounds for everyone. Works will be on Wednesday 8th and Thursday 9th January. Please stay away from this area - we will be utilising our video cameras to ensure this area is left untouched during this time. Soft fall is being removed and playgrounds will be unsafe during this time.

### 15. Swimming Certificates

Last week, the majority of the students received a swimming certificate. There were about 16 students who did not receive a certificate due to not completing the Beginning level. The Aquamoves Certificates mark completion of levels not participation so Aquamoves is unable to supply some students with one until they go beyond that point. All of these students are currently marked as D1 and will continue in that level for the next swimming program they attend with Aquamoves. Any gueries - feel free to contact Aquamoves directly.

### 16. School Reports

School reports were distributed in sealed envelopes today. If parents would like some more feedback about individual student performance at school feel free to contact class teachers to arrange an informal meeting once reports are distributed to families. Teachers spend a lot of valuable time putting these together so please take the time to read these before the school year ends. Remember that these reports can be placed in the green report folders which every student at school should have.

### The report cards have:

- \* a chart with an A-E rating (Well Above the Expected Standard Well Below the Expected Standard), showing your child's current progress against the expected state-wide standard as well as the progress they have made since the previous year
- \* a chart showing your child's level of effort and class behaviour
- \* details about attendance
- \* easy to understand comments from teachers outlining what your child knows and can do, any areas in which your child needs to be given further help or extended, and how this will be done.

### What exactly do the A-E ratings mean?

A indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting (12 months or more ahead of the standard expected at the time of reporting)

**B** indicates achievement that is **above the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child understands more complex ideas and has a broader range of skills than would normally be expected.

**C** indicates achievement that is **at the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that your child's learning is on track and that they understand and can apply the range of skills and knowledge expected for their year level at the time of reporting.

**D** indicates achievement that is **below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means that there are some skills and knowledge that your child has yet to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

**E** indicates achievement that is **well below the standard expected** for your child's year level at the time of reporting. It means there are significant areas of knowledge and skills your child needs to acquire before they can be said to be achieving at the expected standard.

### Isn't a 'C' a disappointing result?

No it is not at all. It is important to remember that if your child receives a 'C' on the report card it indicates that their *learning* is on track and they are achieving the statewide standard that is expected of them at the time of reporting.

In the past, a 'C' in some schools might have meant that the child was performing below the expected standard. This is no longer the case.

### 17. Students Arriving Early at School

Parents are reminded that grounds supervision does not begin until 8.30am so please do not send students early to school for the sake of it or to play. This is documented in our staff supervision policy. We know there are a handful of families that do make early drop offs but these students are not be allowed outside until 8.30am or until supervision begins. Before 8.30am - these students will remain in the BER room instead of roaming around the school grounds unsupervised. Please reinforce this at home and only have children arrive early to school if absolutely needed (ie: early work commitments).

### 18. Student Borrowing

### 22. School Term Dates

These dates have been confirmed at School Council. Please keep these in a handy spot as you may wish to book your family holidays during the school holidays. All class teachers at Tallygaroopna PS will be involved in CPR training on Tuesday 28th January and will be setting up classrooms in the afternoon. As a result, all students will start on Wednesday 29th January. Foundation students will not be at school on Thursday 30th January and Friday 31st January while English Online Testing is completed – this is mandated with all schools. ### 23. OSH Enrolment Forms – School Pick Ups (urgent)

We have had some students being picked up late after school during the last couple of weeks. As a result, we would like some more enrolments forms in for OSH Care, so that students can go into this service straight after school if needed. Supervision with staff after school is from 3.25pm to 3.45pm and it is unfair for school staff to supervise children beyond this time because of specific commitments. Staff will not be supervising staff beyond 3.45pm - hence OSH is the preferred service.

We currently have only 24 enrolment forms in and we would prefer to have 81 - for all of the students in the school. A note to all families current and future has been distributed - reminding families of this along with OSH Care forms being distributed again (these need to be completed for each student).

### 30. OSH Care Costs

At School Council we decided to increase OSH Care fees for 2020. These have been simplified and will be \$25 for a full session and \$15 for a short session (finishing by 4.30pm). These increases were needed in order to make this service financially viable for the future and we hope that this service will be well supported by the school community.

### 31. Borrowing Agreement – MARC Van (Library)

At the last School Council meeting, we again endorsed a borrowing agreement for 2020 and beyond. This relates to the prompt payment of lost or damaged resources by the required date, or a borrowing suspension will take place. As a result, all families will be asked to sign a borrowing agreement next year.

The MARC service to rural schools in our area provides a valued and important service to children in small schools. The service provides access to a wider range of learning resources than would otherwise be the case to both teachers and students and overcomes some of the disadvantages of size and rural isolation. Teaching sessions focus upon literature, information skills and technologies with access to a large school library.

Participating schools pay a per capita levy to the MARC Service for the purchase and maintenance of stock. The Committee of Management of the Congupna based MARC Van requires that individual schools take responsibility for the cost of books and materials that are lost or damaged.

This cost will be passed on to the families of students who have lost or damaged books.

School fees for 2020 have been approved at School Council. These will be itemised in a letter to be sent home early next year and will be due by the end of February, 2020. They are as follows:


