Labour Day Long Weekend

Dear Parents.

We have a busy and fun week ahead. On Wednesday at 11.30am students will be participating in a number of maths activities to celebrate <u>World Maths Day</u>. Teachers and students will be involved in rotation activities and the session will conclude at 1pm. Parents are welcome to come along and join in on the fun if they wish. On Thursday, the whole school will leave at 9.15am by bus and journey to Aquamoves in Shepparton for a <u>Fun in the Water Cluster Day</u>. Students will be divided into two groups(P-2/3-6) and have a fun day doing water and Games Factory activities out of the water, which involve team work and cooperation. Again, parents are welcome to come along if they wish. To make the day run smoothly, junior students are encouraged to come to school with their bathers under their uniforms. They will be using the pool facilities first so this would assist us on the day.

Last week, I had another visit by Kerri Ford (Hume Region – Welfare Officer). Kerri provides a free service to a number of schools in the region in regard to welfare/discipline so feel free to contact me if you would like to meet Kerri to discuss a few issues. Kerri will be visiting our school again on Wednesday 24th March. I also have made contact with SCOPE; they provide regular support such as speech therapy to schools. Lyn Nicol will be working with our school this year and visiting for the first time this year on Tuesday 9th March to conduct some review sessions. Information has been given to relevant families, but if you have any concerns in regard to your own child, feel free to see me at school. All families should have received a copy of the Schools Engagement Policy by now. Just a reminder, that the last page is the only one which needs to be signed and returned to school. Please make an effort to talk through this with your children at home, so that a consistent approach can be implemented by everyone. I am working on Monday and Tuesday this week, but will be away at a Network Meeting on Friday.

1. Prep Information

Just a reminder, that Prep children have begun their first full week at school this week. We have an extremely busy week at school with a few fun activities, so I recommend a lot of rest and sleep for the children so that they can continue to enjoy their time at school.

2. School Fees

Changes were also made to the Excursion / Voluntary Levy and details are provided below. It is important to note that these are the only fees for the school year as no other fees are associated with the school. These fees are now payable. It has also been a number of years since the last increase and families may pay these in instalments if they wish. Feel free to contact Karen at the office in regard to this.

The following structure was ratified:

- Excursion Levy \$90 per student. This will cover the cost of most school excursions throughout the year. This is a compulsory levy for all students.
- Fundraising Levy (Voluntary) Single child families \$60 / Families with 2 or more children \$90.

3. Art Van / Library Van

A reminder that Children will need an art smock (when the Art MACC Van visits the school every second Friday), with a name on it (most already have one) eg. old shirt, etc to protect their clothes from paint, glue, etc. The Library MARC Van is also visiting the school on a fortnightly basis and children are asked to bring a library bag (either cloth or strong plastic) to protect the library books.

4. Keyboard

Keyboard lessons began last week with Cliff Doornkamp. A big thankyou to the families involved, for being so prompt with the payments for these lessons. These sessions will continue to be held on an individual basis until the end of term and a payment of \$45 will need to be paid to Karen at the office with cheques to be made payable to Cliff Doornkamp.. We are hopeful that this program will continue next term and beyond with more permanent lessons conducted – perhaps 8 to 10 lessons. If parents would like to pay now for lessons in term 2, they can see Karen at the office.

5. Student Information

Attached to the first newsletter of the year was an envelope containing your child/ren details held at school. Could you please check these details to ensure they are accurate, sign, date and return the form with any changes back to the school office as soon as possible. Extra student information forms can be collected from the office.

6. School Council

The Annual General Meeting for School Council will NOW be held on Wednesday 17th March at 7.30pm. Please not the change of date in regard to this. There will be a couple of positions available for parents to be a member of school council. If anyone is interested in being part of School Council for 2010 could you contact David at school.

7. School Volunteers

Thank you to the many parents, who have seen Karen at the office regarding this. Our list of parents with working with children checks is growing fast and this list will continue to be approved at School Council. We still require any volunteers to leave their name at the Office and let us know if they have a current Working with Children Card. Information about getting a Volunteer's Working with Children Check (which incurs no cost) is available at the Office.

8. Athletic Sports

As mentioned in last weeks newsletters, the EGPSSA athletic sports will be held on Monday, 22nd March at McEwen Reserve, Shepparton (Little Athletics track beside the Sports Stadium). Parents are requested to transport athletes to and from McEwen Reserve. Children will need to be dropped off no later than 9.00am and will report to Mrs Sidebottom who will mark the roll. At the conclusion of the sports, parents are to collect them. This should be approximately 3.00pm. If families think they will have difficulty transporting their children to the sports please contact the school. In the event of inclement weather, the wet weather committee will meet at 8.00am, if there is going to be a postponement, this will immediately be announced on 3SR and 96.9FM and the principals of the schools will be contacted. A Back Up Day has been scheduled for Tuesday 20th April (Term 2 – week 2).

Children are asked to bring their own drink which will travel with them, or a plastic mug labelled with their name. Cold water will be available at each activity. Children may bring their own lunch or lunches and drinks can be

purchased from the Canteen which is being catered by Dookie PS. Children who are not competing in an event must bring along a note signed by a parent.

9. Aquamoves Day

Students from Prep – Grade 6 will be participating in a cluster day with other district small schools on Thursday 4th March. The day has a fun in the water theme and will begin at about 10am and conclude at noon. Students will be split into groups and two one hour sessions will be held. One hour will be in the water and the other hour will be out of the water. Permission notes were sent home last week. These need to be signed and returned to school by Wednesday if families have not already done so. Specific details are listed below:

- Groups will be P-2 and 3 -6
- P-2 students will do pool activities first followed by Games Factory activities out of the pool
- Grade 3-6 students will do Games Factory activities activities out of the pool first followed by pool activities
- Pool activities include tarzan swing, rapid river and water slide (students will be closely monitored)
- Games Factory activities will be conducted by Zeerust and Congupna PS staff
- Students will need to bring a small snack for the morning break. **Students will not be using the canteen so no money is required.**
- Lunch will be back at school when we return

11. World Maths Day

World Maths Day is on again! After our students enjoying the day so much last year we will be having it again this year! The date is Wednesday 3rd of March and we will be running a Mathlympics from 11.30 - 1. Parents are more then welcome to come along and have some Maths fun!

12. Religious Instruction

This will begin next Thursday 11th of March. There is an expectation that students will participate in these sessions unless they have parental approval to be excluded. Deb Bagley will be running sessions from 9-9.30am with the Grade 2/3/4 students and Janet Pascal (P/1) and Rhonda Crozier (5/6) will be taking R.E. from 2-2.30pm. Each session will be 30 minutes.

13. Absences

It is DEECD policy that the school is notified when a student is absent from school. This can be done by phone or by written note.

14. Head Lice

This week there was an incident of Head Lice at school. There is a requirement that parents/guardians refrain from sending their children to school with untreated head lice. It should be noted that students may be treated one evening and return to school the next day and that the presence of eggs in the hair is not cause for exclusion. Parents/guardians need to be aware that one treatment is not sufficient to manage the problem. If a student reattends school with live head lice the school may again exclude the student until the live insects have been removed.

15. Student Accident Insurance

Families are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. These costs may be recoverable where an injury is caused by the negligence (carelessness) of the Department, a school council or their employees or volunteers. Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or private health insurance. They can be obtained by school councils on a whole-of-school basis, or by parents/guardians for individual students.

16. Teddy Bears Picnic (P/1)

The students in the junior grades had a fun morning last week at the Teddy Bears Picnic organised by Mrs Wallace. Thankyou to the parents for having their children ready for this and as you can see by the photos below, it was a great day.







17. Easter Raffle





Draft K-10 Australian Curriculum in English, mathematics, science and history

On Monday 1 March 2010, the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) published draft K-10 Australian Curriculum in English, mathematics, science and history for a period of national consultation. The consultation period closes on 23 May 2010.

This is a significant event in Australian education.

The draft curriculum and all the resources required to provide feedback are published at: www.australiancurriculum.edu.au. At this address, you will find the draft curriculum which you can comment on, a survey which you can complete and other resources such as videos, information sheets and frequently asked questions.

On visiting the website, you will need to register your details in a simple process that will provide you with an ongoing login and password and ensures you the opportunity to save and return to your feedback over time and as often as you wish.

This is a unique opportunity for you to express your views and comment on the draft curriculum materials. Take the opportunity over the next few months to contribute to making this the best possible curriculum for all teachers and students in Australia.

The draft curriculum in the same four learning areas, for the senior secondary years, will be published online and available for public consultation between April and June 2010. More details on consultation on the senior years' curriculum will be provided in March.

ACARA will refine the draft curriculum in response to the feedback from both the K-10 and senior years' national consultation, and will publish a final version of the K-12 Australian Curriculum in English, mathematics, science and history in September 2010.
