Aquamoves - Cluster Day
































1. My School Website - http://www.myschool.edu.au/

This information has been updated and parents will be able to quickly locate statistical and contextual information about schools in their community and compare them with statistically similar schools across the country. It also provides parents and students with information on each school – its view of itself and its mission, its staffing, its resources and its students' characteristics and their performances.

Secondly, it provides schools and their communities with comparisons of their students' performances in literacy and numeracy with those of students in other schools, most importantly those in schools that serve similar students. These comparisons provide information to support improvements in schools. Among schools with similar students, those achieving higher student performances can stimulate others to lift expectations of what they and their students can achieve. The schools with higher performing students can be a source of information for others on the policies and practices that produce those higher performances.



2. Annual Report

The Annual Report for 2010 is currently being completed and will be endorsed by School Council on March 23rd. All schools prepare an Annual Report to inform parents and the wider school community of the school's successes, activities and achievements throughout the year. The report also provides an opportunity to communicate and publicise the longer term directions for the school. The annual report should be made available to parents by 30 June each year.

3. School Level Report

Last week we received our School Level Report for 2010. This report is very comprehensive and has a summary of achievements in regard to English Online, VELS, NAPLAN, Attendance, Enrolment and Parent & Staff Opinion Surveys. School Council will spend some time going through this report in a couple of weeks.

Staffing

At present, Miss Bicknell is teaching the Grade 5/6 students four days a week from Tuesday until Friday. This position was only for term 1, but it gives me great pleasure to announce that the Grade 5/6 teaching position will now continue until the rest of the year. Our school will advertise this position this week, before an announcement is made in regard to staffing.

5. School Audit

Our school will be having a financial audit on Wednesday 16th March. As a result, both Karen and David will be unavailable for most of the day. It would be appreciated if minimal disruptions could occur, to enable this day to run smoothly.

6. Athletic Sports

The EGPSSA athletic sports will be held on Monday, 4th April at McEwen Reserve, Shepparton (Little Athletics track beside the Sports Stadium). Parents are requested to transport athletes to and from McEwen Reserve. Children will need to be dropped off no later than 9.00am and will report to Miss Bicknell who will mark the roll. At the conclusion of the sports, parents are to collect them. This should be approximately 3.00pm. If families think they will have difficulty transporting their children to the sports please contact the school. In the event of inclement weather, the wet weather committee will meet at 8.00am, if there is going to be a postponement, this will immediately be announced on 3SR and 96.9FM and the principals of the schools will be contacted. A Back Up Day has been scheduled for Wednesday 6th April.

Children are asked to bring their own drink which will travel with them, or a plastic mug labelled with their name. Cold water will be available at each activity. Children may bring their own lunch or lunches and drinks can be purchased from the Canteen which is being catered by Kialla PS. Children who are not competing in an event must bring along a note signed by a parent.

If any parents can help out in any way on the day of the sports could you contact the office ASAP. This year, we are trying to cut costs by **not** hiring a marquee, so if any families have a shade structure which may be used on the day could they also contact the office.

7. Fosbury Flop Forms

Last week, fosbury flop forms went home for parents to fill out if they are happy for their children to perform this routine (landing on back) when completing the high jump. At present, we are doing a lot of practice with the high jump and are hopeful that the majority of students will be able to perform this routine safely. If students do not bring this form back they will



need to perform the scissors routine (landing on feet). If the form is returned, they will have the option of both routines. Athletic cards will be marked indicating which students are allowed to perform the fosbury flop.

8. Grade 5/6 Camp

Plans have begun for the Grade 5/6 Urban Camp to Melbourne. Our school is responsible for organising this and we need to know definite numbers before the end of March, so that the cost for the camp can be formally set. We are anticipating that this cost will be between \$150 and \$200. The camp begins on Monday 6th June and concludes on Wednesday 8th June. Please return the Expression of Interest form and a deposit before the end of March if your child will be attending the camp.

The Camp will involve some of the following attractions – Aquarium, IMAX, MCG – Sports Museum, Shrine, Aquatic Centre, Museum and Science Works. More details will be available soon. Please contact Karen at the office if you would like to organise a payment plan for the camp.

9. Supervisor – Active After School Communities Program

We are seeking another supervisor for this program. If any other parents are interested in this role could they contact the office ASAP. There is a small financial payment made to school supervisors and their responsibilities can be summarised as:

- Take a roll call and keep records of all participating children
- Provide appropriate supervision until the completion of each session
- Assist with setup of equipment if necessary
- Provide feedback to Program Coordinator [deliverer?] on quality of program delivery
- Ensure the children are provided with afternoon tea
- Report any accidents to the Program Coordinator
- Ensure risk management policies are adhered to
- Ensure child protection policies are adhered to

10. Mosquitoes

In light of the recent floods in Victoria, there has been an increase in the population of mosquitoes and there is a risk that illnesses due to mosquito born viruses will start to occur. Some general advice about protecting children and young people from mosquitoes, particularly in flood affected areas is provided below.

Prevention

There are 2 broad guidelines for prevention:

- Avoid getting bitten by mosquitoes by limiting outdoor activities at dawn and dusk where possible.
- Mosquito control around the home, school or early childhood service:
 - Reduce available breeding areas for mosquitoes, particularly still, shallow water (e.g. in pot plants, car tyres, etc) where possible.
 - Check insect screens on windows and doors.
 - Eliminate mosquitoes found inside buildings.

Health advice – what to look out for and what to do

It is important that school and children's services staff are alert to the possibility of an illness as a result of a mosquito bite in students or children. A child may shows signs of a high temperature, feeling unwell or lethargic and may also experience nausea, vomiting and dizziness. Advise the parent or guardian that they should take the child to a general practitioner for further advice and care.

11. English Online Testing

Staff have finished completing English Online Testing for all Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students. This is very time consuming and the staff at school have done a terrific job at school implementing this with limited disruptions. A big thank you to parents who were able to work around this.

12. Grade 6 Shirts

These should be available next Tuesday 15th March. All uniforms which have been printed should be paid for before they are handed back to families. The cost for this was \$8 a print.

13. Occupational Health & Safety Training

Mrs Armstrong will be away this Thursday, attending this training. Karen will also be away on 17th, 24th & 31st March and 7th April.

14. Sport Shed – new date!

I have been informed that our new sport shed will start to be built on <u>Friday 18th March</u>. 18. Working With Children Checks

WWC Checks are required for all non-teaching school based employees. This includes both current and new employees. It is an offence to engage in child-related work in educational institutions without a current assessment notice. WWC Checks came in to effect in April 2006 and are valid for 5 years. If cardholders intend to continue in 'child-related work', legislation requires them to renew their Checks after 5 years. Legislation also requires card holders to update their details. This should be done as a matter of priority at the cardholder's earliest convenience.

19. School Volunteers

One of the tasks for School Council at the start of the year is to approve the current list of volunteers working in the school and any additions to the list during the year. Therefore, we require any volunteers to leave their name at the Office and let us know if they have a current Working with Children Card. Information about getting a Volunteer's Working with Children Check (which incurs no cost) is available at the Office.
