FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:


- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.



PicCollage EDU is downloaded onto BYO iPads, rather than PicCollage. This is a paid app (\$2.99).


Students will not be permitted to use PicCollage at school, as it has been removed from our App List. We are leaving it up to

There is a Late Arrivals/Early Departures book at the office, which needs to be signed for late arriving or early departing students. This needs to be signed by parents (or whoever is dropping off or picking up your child). There is also a Visitor's Book to be signed by all visitors to the school (this includes parents who stay for reading/Parents' Club activities, etc). This will aid our emergency management of the school.

Supervision – before and after school hours

Parents are reminded that grounds supervision does not begin until 8.30am so please do not send students early to school for the sake of it or to play. This is documented in our staff supervision policy. We know there are a handful of families that do make early drop offs (contact the school if this is needed), but these students will not be allowed outside until 8.30am or until supervision begins. Before 8.30am - these students will remain in the BER room instead of roaming around the school grounds unsupervised. Please reinforce this at home and only have children arrive early to school if needed (ie: early work commitments). We begin whole school reading at 8.45am and encourage all students to participate in this program. The whole school reading program concludes at 9am and we welcome any helpers for this.





OSH Care for 2019 – 5 days

This service has continued to build over the last 5 years. Staff from Tallygaroopna PS implemented this service from 2015 -2017 and last year we were able to extend this service to 5 days a week while employing a full time OSH Care Coordinator.

In 2019, we will continue to provide for families and their children. OSH Care will again be available for 5 days a week (excluding term holidays, public holidays and curriculum days). We are pleased to announce that Toni-Marie Arnold has agreed to stay on as our OSH Care coordinator for a further 12 months and we look forward to Toni-Marie continuing to make a valuable contribution to our school and continuing to develop this service for our families from 3.25pm to 6pm. A reminder to all families that a new enrolment form for 2019 must be filled in for any children utilising this service. This form is available at our school office and also on our school website. Please support this service, so that it can be financially viable for the school into the future – we aim to have 25 students enrolled for the week.

1. Aquamoves Day

This is scheduled for tomorrow, Tuesday 26th February. The Aquamoves activities will be free play in the Olympic pool, wading pool and splash park – strict supervision for junior students. We hope that the Rapid River, Tarzan rope and slide will be in operation from 11:00am to 1:00pm. All parents are encouraged to apply sun cream before arriving at school, but this will be applied and re-applied at Aquamoves by staff. Some parental assistance with this would be appreciated because this is very time consuming. We will leave school by bus at 9.45am at the latest and assemble at Aquamoves at 10am for an introduction to the day and provide further information to students and teachers as to how the day will unfold. The day will finish up at around 2:00 -2:30pm. Permission forms are now due along with the charge for the day.

No students are to buy things from the canteen and parents are discouraged from buying things for their children from the canteen.

2. Professional Learning Communities Initiative

Staff will be involved in this opportunity in Terms 1 and 2. Professional learning communities (PLCs) are an approach to school improvement where groups of teachers work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes. Staff involved will be Mr Brodie, Mrs Haberfield and Miss Lothian. There will be 8 days out of the classroom during this time and we will be having consistent teacher replacements with Bev Montgomery and Melissa Beer. Specific dates are:

3. Professional Practice Days

In the Education State, we achieve excellence by consistently focusing on improving the achievements of learners across Victoria, whether it is through improving the quality of educational services or changing the way we teach. The most important thing we can do to improve student outcomes is to develop and improve the skills of our teachers.

The Victorian Government will continue to provide opportunities to develop professional, passionate teachers and principals and equip them with the right knowledge and skills to meet the needs of their students. To ensure we support the learning and development of not only our students, but our teachers too; we are committed to providing professional development opportunities for our teacher workforce. Teachers will spend four days per year further developing their skills in areas that are aligned to the school priorities. Students will directly benefit from these improvements in their daily learning.

The following is organised for Term 1.

Mrs Haberfield – Wednesday 20th March Miss Love and Mrs Fitzpatrick – Wednesday 27th March Miss Lothian – Friday 29th March Casual Relief teachers will be provided on these days.

The professional practice days are part of the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2017. Each full time teacher is entitled to one day per term (four days per year), to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning. We know children sometimes find it challenging when their teacher is away from the classroom. Equally, it's important that teachers take the time to focus on improving their professional practice because their learning directly impacts on your child's learning experience. There is a learning plan in place to ensure that your child's education continues as usual. We are scheduling the days ahead of time and have planned these days so that there is minimal impact. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I would also like to let people know of teacher commitments after school hours as well to aid communication between home and school. These can be summarised as:

Monday & Tuesday - Professional Learning straight after school for staff until about 5pm. Wednesday and Thursday - planning for staff

Friday - Staff Health & Wellbeing

Please be conscious of especially a Monday and Tuesday night where we like to get straight into core business. We would also appreciate if any meetings needed with staff are coordinated beforehand in person or via Classdojo or by phone. We are all busy people and unfortunately, we cannot just have spontaneous meetings with parents because this effects the time we have put aside for all staff to get together. If meetings are needed in the morning - these are best at 8.30am if possible before our formal reading program begins at 8.45am. This enables staff to get set up for the day and still address any issues if needed. If families could also keep messaging via Class Dojo limited this would help also - especially after 5pm.

We value the relationship we have with families and we look forward to this being a positive one into the future. Also please be aware of specific events and permission forms which need to be returned. As we grow with more enrolments this is becoming more of an issue and unfortunately we cannot keep reminding families of this.

On a personal note, I have taken on an assistant coaching role for my son's footy team so I will need to leave school by 3.45pm on Thursday's.

7. Conveyance

12. School Fees

With the new Education Department Guidelines specific items need to be itemised hence some minor differences between fees for different year levels. These fees do not include excursions (except for the grade 5/6 Science Program at Shepparton High), swimming, camps or bus fees (for applicable families). Excursions are estimated to be \$50 to \$70 for Foundation to Grade 4 and \$60 to \$100 for Grade 5/6. These fees are now due. Please see Karen in the office if you have any queries.
