

#### Coronavirus (COVID-19) phone advice line

For up to date guidance and advice, the Education Department has a dedicated coronavirus (COVID-19) phone line (9am-5pm Monday to Friday). The advice line is available for school leaders as well as all staff, and parents on 1800 338 663.

No bikes are to be ridden around the school buildings to skid on concrete areas during school hours or while there are after hours school activities. Bikes may only be ridden on the court area once all staff have left the school.

#### Key Changes to COVID-19 Operational Guidelines from DET

COVID safe guidelines & school processes (to assist with contact tracing if needed)

Masks will be mandatory in public indoor spaces (ie: office, classrooms, assemblies). If you have visitors in your home, it is strongly recommended that masks are worn during the visit. Masks must be worn in indoor public spaces apart from when eating or drinking

Welcome back to a new school year. As you may be aware, the Department of Education & Training have COVID safe guidelines for schools, which they regularly update. We will always try and keep you informed of any changes via our Skool Loop app - which we encourage all families to join ASAP. We are all very glad to know that we can welcome parents, grandparents and visitors into school again! We have certainly missed you. However, there are still some extra regulations that we must all adhere to, to keep us all safe.

- Students can arrive at school from 8:30am each day. The bell to come into class is at 8.45am. Hand washing occurs at 8.45am.
- Students can be dropped off at the front of the school or via the car park if dropping and going. Please be aware of the school bus if using the car park.
- At the end of the day there will be no staggered finish time or walking out of classes by staff. Parents/carers can arrange to meet their child in the grounds, at the gates or at their car. Please confirm with your child, where you will be picking them up at 3:25pm.
- We are maintaining an enhanced cleaning schedule at school, with all high touch areas being cleaned.
- Students will still be washing their hands at the start of the day and at the end of morning and afternoon recess
- Drink bottles are still strongly encouraged, but there are bubble taps available along with water in the project space to fill drink bottles.
- Remember that we all need to stay home if unwell- students and staff- and get tested
  if we have any COVID symptoms.

Parents/carers can come into the school grounds, but with restrictions that help to keep us all safe:

- Face masks must be carried at all times and worn indoors.
- Face masks are recommended when 1.5 metres physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- There are limits on the number of visitors that can be inside the buildings at any time, so visits to classrooms are discouraged and must be pre-arranged.
- When visiting the Office only one visitor (family) may be in the Office at a time.
- Where possible, continue to communicate via email, our Skool Loop app or by phone.
   Class teachers can be contacted via Class Dojo info will go home soon.
- Parents who choose to drop their children off within the school grounds are asked to do so outside the classrooms.
- If there is a chance that a parent or visitor will remain within the school grounds for longer than 15 minutes, they must sign it at the office. An alternative is to use the QR codes that are displayed around the school. All visitors are encouraged to sign in when visiting and wear a visitor badge which can be collected at the office.



#### 1. Athletic Sports

A back up day is planned for Friday 23rd April if there is inclement weather. Parents are requested to transport athletes to and from McEwen Reserve. Children will need to be dropped off no later than 9.00am and will report to Mrs Armstrong who will mark the roll. At the conclusion of the sports, parents are to collect them. This should be approximately 3.00pm. If families think they will have difficulty transporting their children to the sports please contact the school. In the event of inclement weather, the wet weather committee will meet at 8.00am. If there is going to be a postponement, this will immediately be announced on 3SR and 96.9FM and the principals of the schools will be contacted. Parents will be contacted via Skool Loop if the sports are cancelled. Students will still be required at school – IF THE SPORTS HAPPEN TO BE CALLED OFF!!

Children are asked to bring their own drink which will travel with them, or a plastic mug labelled with their name. Children may bring their own lunch, or lunches and drinks can be purchased from the canteen, which is being catered for by a school on the day. #### 5. Student Led Conferences

#### 6. Curriculum Days

Last Tuesday, School Council approved two Curriculum Days for the 2021 school year. Families will need to make alternative arrangements for both of these days because there is no school on these days and also no OSH Care. Each year government schools are provided with four **student-free days** for professional development, school planning and administration, **curriculum** development, and student assessment and reporting purposes.

Term 4 – Report Writing on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November.

#### 7. Tutoring Program

We are in the process of implementing our Tutoring Program. We are fortunate to have Bev Montgomery and Melissa Beer be our two tutors for this program which will begin on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> March. This will be held mostly on Tuesday's for a 20 week period for 4 weeks in term 1, all of term 2 and for the first 6 weeks in term 3. Bev will be working with some students in F/1 and 5/6; and Melissa with students in Grades 1/2 and 3/4. Families will be informed if their children are involved in this program but funding provided to our school is only to accommodate approximately 10 students who are in need of extra support. This will be a school decision, but the tutoring model will involve a combination of in-class support and small group and individual withdrawal.

#### 8. Grade 6 Shirts

If grade 6 students would like to have the back of their green school uniform tops printed (shirts, jumpers), could they please have all of these named and placed in a plastic bag (also named) and given to Mrs Armstrong at the office by Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March. They will then be delivered to Spectrum in Shepparton. The cost for each print will be \$12. Hence, two prints would be \$24. Contact the office on 58298264 if you need to discuss payment options. This is not compulsory – students will still need to wear school uniform while the prints are being completed – please bring in a note if school shirts are not worn during this time.

#### 9. Census Day

This will be held this Friday 26th February – it would be appreciated if all children are at school on this day.

#### 10. Parents' Club Meeting

Thanks to the many parents who returned the letter in regard to a specific date for the first Parents' Club meeting of the year. The vast majority thought a Monday at 3.30pm would be suitable so the first meeting for the year will be held next Monday 1st March at 3.30pm. All are welcome – we look forward to seeing some new members and some new ideas to support our children and our school.

#### 11. Shade Sail

Some major damage has been made to the junior playground shade sail near the cubby house. We are looking into a replacement for this in the near future – please ensure no further damage is made to this asset please.

#### 12. Bravehearts

Students in Grades F-2 will be participating in a Bravehearts Personal Safety Show on Tuesday 4th March at midday in the Computer Lab / Library. The purpose of 'Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show' is to teach children protective behaviours in a non-confrontational, fun and engaging fashion. Bravehearts' Education teams deliver the show's messages into schools, day care centres, shopping centres, sporting clubs and other facilities (relating to the care of children) to provide students, parents, teachers, carers and the general community with specialised child sexual assault awareness and education.

'Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure' Education Program aims to continue communicating essential personal safety messages and works tirelessly to reach children across Australia. Since reaching the 200,000 safer kids milestone in March 2012, the amount of children that have seen Ditto continues to grow.

The show's main contents address:

\* Yes and No Feelings

- \* Warning Signs
- \* Scared and Yucky Feelings

- \* Private Parts and Privacy
- \* It's OK to say NO if you don't feel safe
- \* What to do if you feel unsafe or unsure

No permission forms will be sent home for this show – please contact the office if you would prefer your children to not participate in this performance.

#### 13. Aquamoves Day

Our whole school excursion at Aquamoves on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February (tomorrow) is confirmed as per Skool Loop last week. The Aquamoves activities will be free play in the olympic pool, wading pool and splash park – strict supervision for junior students. We are only anticipating 23 degrees on the day, so we will be taking some sports and sand pit equipment for the day as well. All parents are encouraged to apply sun cream to students before arriving at school, but this will be applied and re-applied at Aquamoves by school staff. Some parental assistance with this would be appreciated because this is very time consuming and parents are welcome to attend to assist with supervision. We will leave school by bus at 9.45am at the latest and assemble at Aquamoves at 10am for an introduction to the day and provide further information to students as to how the day will unfold. The day will finish up at around 1:30pm and we anticipate returning to school by 2pm. Permission forms will need to be returned ASAP – if your child is not attending they are still required at school for the day and a staff member will be in attendance at school to assist with supervision. Please contact the school if your child is not participating and whether they will attend school for the day please.

# No students are to buy things from the canteen and parents are discouraged from buying things for their children from the canteen.

#### 15. Fosbury Flop Forms

The Fosbury Flop technique with high jump is appropriate if the teacher/instructor is experienced in this technique and if students have had instructions in, and lead up activities on the run up, take off, flight and landing phases of the jump.

Children will need parental permission to use this technique. Due to the regulations with regard to high jump, we are seeking your permission to allow or not allow your child to perform the Fosbury Flop technique of high jumping. We ask that you only grant permission if you know that your child is proficient at the skills needed. Eg. learnt at little athletics **OR during P.E. lessons with Mrs Montgomery**. A permission form has been sent home in regard to this and we ask that parents sign this where applicable as this technique will be carefully monitored and safety will be paramount (students landing on their back).

#### 16. Production

We have started working on our school production which will be held in term 3 this year. As you could appreciate, a lot of time and effort goes into this program and we look forward to our students leading from the front again. We ask that all students and their families accept any position that they are given and do their best with this opportunity.

The cast list with speaking parts and the props list is published in this newsletter – if you can assist with any of this let us know please.

#### 17. Conveyance

The Conveyance Allowance Program (CAP) is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school or campus.

Depending on how a student travels to school, an eligible student may be granted a conveyance allowance based on:

- the least expensive public transport fares and/or
- a distance based allowance when travel is by private car or private bus.

Parents applying for the allowance are required to complete an application form – contact Karen if needed.

#### 18. Foundation Student Information

Throughout February children in Foundation will NOT attend school on Wednesdays. Their last day to remain at home will be on 24<sup>th</sup> of February. There may be some Wednesdays where Mrs Haberfield may require your child to attend a certain time for specific testing, but she will inform parents of this if there is a need.

The first full week for Foundation students will begin on Monday 1st March – extra rest days can be negotiated if needed.

#### 19. Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families. Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 5829 8264 and ask for an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.
