- <u>1. Welcome</u> Welcome to Ace (Foundation), Zayne (Grade 2) and Lilly (Grade 4) and their families to our school. We hope your time at our school is a rewarding one.
- **2. English Online Interview** No testing this week but this resumes on Wed 8<sup>th</sup> March and Tuesday 14th March (Grade 1 students). Reminders will continue to be sent out on these days.
- 3. Grade 3/4 Camp We had our camp induction today and there are lots of excited kids at the moment. Our camp officially begins tomorrow with our campers leaving school at 8am please arrive by 7.45am if possible. We anticipate returning to school on Friday by 2pm, but updates in regard to our arrival time will be on Skool Loop. We have 22 students and 3 staff attending and we are looking forward to a fun packed week at 15 Mile Creek. The cost for the camp is \$200 (payment is due now please).
- **4. Pool Day** Permission forms went home last Friday we are planning a fun swimming day at the Mooroopna Pool for Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March from 11am to 2pm and we will be travelling to this venue by bus. The cost for this day is \$10 and students are encouraged to wear their bathers under the uniform to assist with changing on this day.
- <u>5. School Council Meetings</u> We are mandated to have 8 meetings a year. There are a couple of openings this year if anyone would like to join School Council feel free to contact David for any specific details (nominations will close on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March). The 1<sup>st</sup> meeting is set for Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February for current School Councillors. The new School Council for 2023 will meet late in March.
- <u>6. Covid: Positive Test Results</u> A reminder to families to complete information on the <u>Student COVID-19 COVID Test Portal</u> if a student tests positive to COVID-19 (PCR or rapid antigen test).

- **7. Athletic Sports** This will be held at McEwen Reserve at Shepparton on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> March for all students. Staff will be running triple jump and also supervising a couple of age groups throughout the day. Further details will be available closer to the day.
- **8. Easter Raffle** Raffle books will need to be returned by Thursday 30th of March. Members of the Parents' Club will put together prizes and prepare the Easter Raffle draw if you can assist let Renee Scott know please. The Easter Raffle will be drawn at assembly at 2pm on the last day of Term 1 on Thursday 6th April at 1.45pm. Families are asked to donate Easter eggs, etc to go towards the raffle.
- **9. Clean Up Australia Day** On Sunday 5th March, the "Congupna Tallygaroopna Landcare Group" will be hosting a site, commencing at 9.30am at Station Park (former Railway Station Site) next to the GV Hwy, see signs on the day. Anyone is welcome. Please bring a water bottle, wear hi-vis vests if you have them, sun smart clothing and enclosed shoes. Gloves and bags will be available, you may like to bring buckets to put your rubbish in and pick up tools if you have them.
- 10. Ambulance Cover Just a reminder to families that schools are not required to pay any ambulance costs for any school activities (ie: camps, excursions...etc). Families are recommended to pursue their own Ambulance membership which is relatively cheap each year about \$100 for a family membership. If families are required to use an ambulance these costs could be in the \$1,000's.

- 12. NAPLAN This annual assessment for students in Grades 3 and 5 will be held from 15<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> March. Please contact the school if you have any queries. A draft timetable is included below:

- 14. Colour Run This is scheduled to be held on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March beginning at 2pm on the school oval. This a voluntary event for students consent forms will be sent home this week.
- 15. Grade 6 shirts A proof was sent home last week for any Grade 6 student wishing to have a print on the back of their school uniforms. The cost for each print is \$14 and uniforms need to be at the office in a plastic bag by Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March.
- 16. Parents' Club Thanks to the families who were able to attend the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting your ongoing support is greatly appreciated. The next meeting will involve the Annual General Meeting on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March straight after school all are welcome as per normal.
- 17. Absence Notes The preferred method to notify the school is via Skool Loop. A written note will also be accepted, so that we have something in writing

- 18. School Uniform Reminder A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. A reminder to all families to reinforce this please.
- 19. Late Arrivals / Early Departures There is a Late Arrivals/Early Departures book at the office, which needs to be signed for late arriving or early departing students. This needs to be signed by parents (or whoever is dropping off or picking up your child). There is also a Visitor's Book to be signed by all visitors to the school (this includes parents who stay for Parents' Club activities, etc). This will aid our emergency management.
- **20. Parent Payment Arrangements** These are set at \$140 per student to cover stationery, online subscriptions and MACC & MARC costs. These were sent home last year and have been reduced by \$10 from 2022. Payment would be appreciated by the end of term 1, 2023. Further information is found here.
