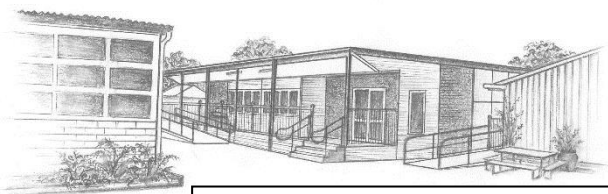

Physical Education Program – PMP program

Hi my name is Bev Montgomery and I have been involved at Tallygaroopna for the past ten years primarily as a parent and also as a C.R.T (Casual Relief Teacher). My son Kyle graduated last year, but I am lucky enough to be employed on a fortnightly basis as this year's Physical Education Specialist. Phys Ed. has always been a favourite of mine – studying it at High School and then at College as a Major and then Outdoor Education components in my Bachelor year. I played netball for a long time when I was younger and I still play tennis competitively for St. Brendan's in the summer. I love watching my children play sport and I believe it is an important part of the School Curriculum.

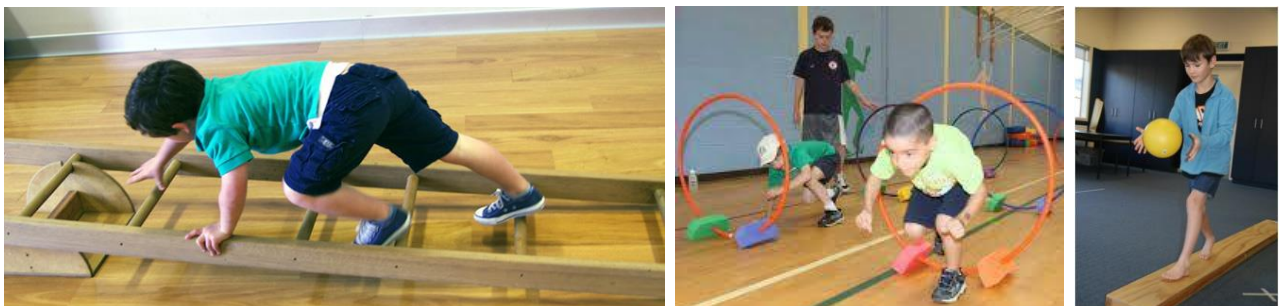
This year as part of the Phys Ed. program we have introduced a program called P.M.P (Perceptual Motor Program). Perceptual deals with obtaining information and Motor refers to outcome of movement. Thus children are using brain and body together to accomplish a task. Participation in Perceptual Motor activities enables students to develop greater levels of body control and encourages greater effort in all areas of the curriculum. Participation in P.M.P helps students with co- ordination, body awareness, intellectual skills and positive self –image. P.M.P also shows development in brain pathways that cross the right and left hemispheres and builds a strong base to support future academic learning.

Junior School (F-2) this term will focus on P.M.P and Athletics.

Middle School (3-4) this term will focus on P.M.P and Athletics.

Senior School (5-6) this term will focus on the Australian Fitness Award and Athletics.

CAR PARK SAFETY

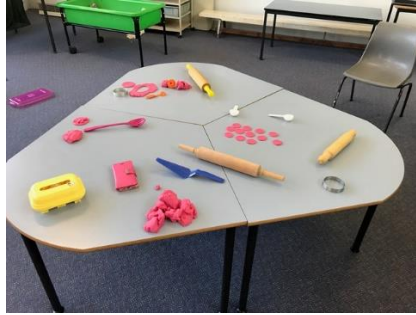

The Puberty Education information will be delivered over 2 sessions allowing for the opportunity for students to post anonymous questions or issues that they would like answered / addressed in the second session. The sessions are delivered to single gender groups to facilitate student comfort and participation.

- * Distribute worksheets re puberty to complete at home and hopefully stimulate conversations with parents

- * Answer any questions / concerns / observations
- * Menstruation / Pregnancy
- * Be prepared kits (male & female)
- * Where to get further information / resources / advice locally
- * (If time permits touch on body image and media portrayal - photo-shop and true images)

2. Head Lice – Consent Forms

A couple of weeks ago, consent forms for Head Lice were sent home – could these be returned ASAP please. Head lice infection can be a sensitive issue for parents and your children and can be difficult to manage, so your support with this would be appreciated.

3. Breakfast Helpers

We are still seeking some more helpers for our Breakfast program. Obviously, with our enrolments increasing there is more of a need to support these students on Monday and Thursday mornings. If you can help from 8.30am on these two mornings please contact the office.

4. Speech Therapy - Impact

This has been rescheduled for Wednesday 22nd March with IMPACT. Could consent forms be returned ASAP please. Information was sent home last Thursday to families who were involved in the last session.

5. School Council

The AGM will be held on Wednesday 29th March beginning at 7.30pm. This will be followed by our normal School Council meeting at 8pm. The Finance Committee will meet as per normal at 6.45pm on this night.

6. School Photo Day

This is scheduled for Thursday 27th April. Photo envelopes will go home to families as soon as they arrive at school. All payments along with envelopes need to be returned before the photo day. More details will be available early next term.

7. School Production Auditions

All grade 4/5/6 students will receive scripts soon for the School Production which is planned for Wednesday 6th September. The production this year is titled "The Adventures of Super Stan" and there are a large number of speaking parts. All of the characters are in this edition of the newsletter and we are planning to audition early next term. Therefore, any students wishing to try out for specific parts should read their scripts as much as possible in anticipation of auditions and the finalisation of parts.

8. Attendance Awards

Students with 95% or above attendance will receive attendance awards at the first assembly back after the holidays. At Tallygaroopna PS, we like to acknowledge good attendance, but we do accept that there will be times when children may not be able to attend school for a multitude of reasons.

9. Pie Warmers / Lunch Orders

During second and third terms, students are able to bring along pies, sausage rolls, pizzas, etc to be heated in the pie heater. Food must be wrapped in foil and labelled with the child's name using a permanent marker. This will begin first day back after the holidays. No lunch orders are available in Terms 2 and 3 from the Tally Servo.

10. Money at School

12. Sporting Schools Program

Students need to be picked up immediately after each session.

16. Athletic Sports

The EGPSSA athletic sports will be held on Tuesday, 2nd May at McEwen Reserve, Shepparton (Little Athletics track beside the Sports Stadium). A back up day is planned for Wednesday 17th May if there is inclement weather. Parents are requested to transport athletes to and from McEwen Reserve. Children will need to be dropped off no later than 9.00am and will report to Mrs Haberfield who will mark the roll. At the conclusion of the sports, parents are to collect them. This should be approximately 3.00pm. If families think they will have difficulty transporting their children to the sports please contact the school. In the event of inclement weather, the wet weather committee will meet at 8.00am, if there is going to be a postponement, this will immediately be announced on 3SR and 96.9FM and the principals of the schools will be contacted. **Parents will be contacted via Tiqbiz if the sports are cancelled.** Students will still be required at school – IF THE SPORTS HAPPEN TO BE CALLED OFF!!

Children are asked to bring their own drink which will travel with them, or a plastic mug labelled with their name. Children may bring their own lunch or lunches and drinks can be purchased from the Canteen which is being catered for by a school on the day. Children who are not competing in an event must bring along a note signed by a parent.

17. Parent Payments – Policies

In previous years, we have mentioned the price of school fees at the beginning of the year in the first newsletter. 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18. Medicine at School

For those students required to have medication whilst at school, a Medication Request Form is required to be filled out, signed and returned to the school office prior to the student being administered medication. Further copies are available at the Office. This does not apply to children with asthma with their puffer, although the office must be informed of the child's needs in this regard. Any change to the child's medical condition should be relayed to the office ASAP.

19. Outside School Hours Care

OSH Care is available on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday only – we are only licenced for these 3 days at present. **A reminder to all families that a new enrolment form for 2017 must be filled in for any children utilising this service. This form is available on our School Website.**
