8. Canberra Camp – This camp is planned for Grade 5/6 students in Term 4 from Monday 23rd October to Thursday 26th October. An expression of interest / itinerary form went home last week and we would like a financial commitment by Friday 17th March. The initial cost for this camp is \$620 per student which is based on 20 students and 2 staff attending. Some extensive fundraising is planned for this camp so with a bit of luck this camp will be reduced to between \$400 - \$500 per student. - 10. Colour Run This is scheduled to be held on Friday 31st March beginning at 2pm on the school oval. This a voluntary event for students consent forms have been sent home and these need to be returned ASAP along with the entry fee of \$10 per family.
- 11. Chocolate Fundraiser All boxes have now been collected thanks to the support of the whole school community with this. All funds will go towards the Canberra Camp (Grade 5/6). There are 60 chocolates in each box valued at \$1 each. Therefore, \$60 needs to be returned to school by Thursday 23rd March no exceptions. Further information was on Skool Loop.
