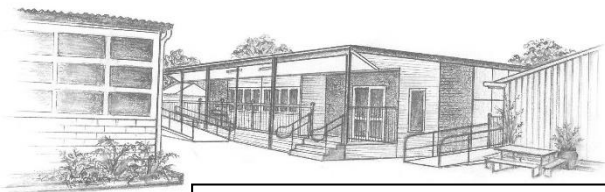

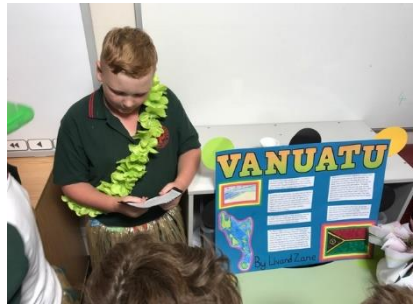

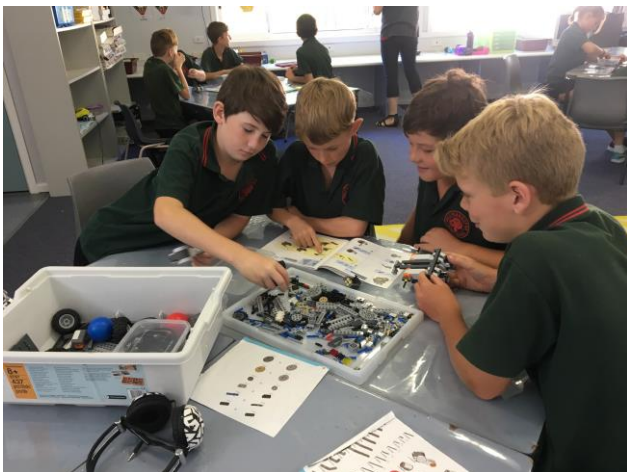
SCIENCE AT TALLYGAROPNA PRIMARY SCHOOL

During S.T.E.M lessons this term, we have had a focus on technology and students have been learning the basics of Computer Science. The older classes have been working using a program called Scratch and the younger students have been exploring coding concepts using the Kodable and Code.org programs. The students have been working hard to understand the basics of writing computer code and have been using coding blocks to create algorithms. All of the programs we have been using in STEM are web based and you can access them with your child at home. I am sure they would love to share with you the work they have been doing and the programs they have created.

Next term the 5/6 students will embark on a unit of Lego Robotics, and the younger students will look at simple engineering concepts. In preparation for their unit next term, the 5/6 Students built their Lego Robots. They worked very well as a team and there was a definite hum of excitement as groups finished building their bots and tried coding their first set of commands. Students are looking forward to setting some challenges for the robots next term.

- 2. At the end of the day, children are only to enter the Car Park once they have been collected by their parents. Children will assemble in the Senior Playground area and be monitored by staff.**





9. Responsible Pet Program

Our whole school will be participating in this program on Thursday 4th May. The Responsible Pet Ownership Primary School Program is aimed at 5-12 year olds and has been delivered to over 1 million Victorian primary school children. It visits over 800 primary schools each year across the state. The Program includes a dog visit, multimedia tools, role play, song and story time.

The Program focuses on teaching students about dog safety:

- * when dogs should be left alone
- * things we should not do to dogs
- * how can you tell if a dog is happy, frightened or angry
- * a safe way to approach and greet a dog
- * what to do if approached by an unknown or aggressive dog.

The Program also introduces and develops the following concepts:

- * choosing an appropriate pet general welfare and husbandry
- * the importance of identification and registration
- * confinement and housing, exercise and training.

There are a range of presentations designed to target the specific audiences in relation to grade level, prior knowledge and learning modes. All dogs used in the program are carefully tested and under the control of a pet educator at all times. Below is a summary of specific times for our program:

11. Athletic Sports

A back up day is planned for Wednesday 17th May if there is inclement weather. Parents are requested to transport athletes to and from McEwen Reserve. Children will need to be dropped off no later than 9.00am and will report to Mrs Haberfield who will mark the roll. At the conclusion of the sports, parents are to collect them. This should be approximately 3.00pm. If families think they will have difficulty transporting their children to the sports please contact the school. In the event of inclement weather, the wet weather committee will meet at 8.00am, if there is going to be a postponement, this will immediately be announced on 3SR and 96.9FM and the principals of the schools will be contacted. **Parents will be contacted via Tiqbiz if the sports are cancelled.** Students will still be required at school – IF THE SPORTS HAPPEN TO BE CALLED OFF!!

Children are asked to bring their own drink which will travel with them, or a plastic mug labelled with their name. Children may bring their own lunch or lunches and drinks can be purchased from the Canteen which is being catered for by a school on the day. 14. NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008. On Tuesday 9th, Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th May, students will undertake the 2017 NAPLAN tests. A back up day will be made available on the Friday.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how individual students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children.

All students are encouraged to participate in the tests. Students with disability may qualify for special provisions that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom. An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers. Class Teachers will be conducting most of the NAPLAN tests with Grade 3 and 5 students this year.
