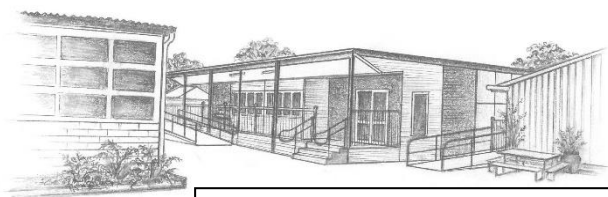

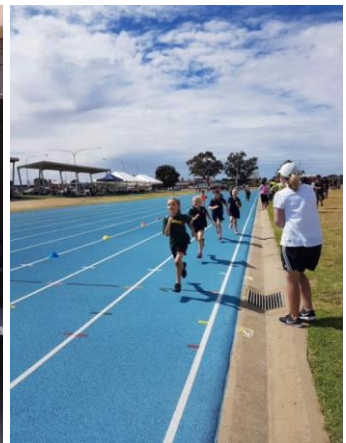

2. ANZAC Day

On Wednesday 25th April, our school will participate in the ANZAC Day Memorial Service which will be held at Welsford Street in Shepparton at 11am. Students attending will need to be at Welsford Street by 10.20am. All students, parents and teachers are welcome to attend this ceremony to remember and acknowledge the ultimate sacrifice our diggers have made during wartime.

Students in Grades 3-6 will be making Anzac Biscuits for the whole school on the Monday morning from 9.30am until 11am. Any students interested in making a wreath for the ANZAC Day ceremony can participate in this session which is being organised by Philippa Collins. These sessions will begin on Monday 23rd April at 11am and conclude at 11.30am.

3. School Council

The AGM will be held on Tuesday 27th March beginning at 7.30pm. This will be followed by our normal School Council meeting at 8pm where the new School Council will meet for the first time. The Finance Committee will meet as per normal at 6.30pm on this night.

4. Easter Munch & Crunch

This will be held on Thursday 29th March. Order forms went home last week and need to be returned with payment by Tuesday 27th March.

5. Smart Spelling Approach

All staff are really enthusiastic, motivated and better equipped to teach spelling more effectively across the school after completing our curriculum day a couple of weeks ago. We have started specific processes in regard to this approach and we look forward to full implementation beginning in Term 2.

6. Reading Proposal

We are looking at altering our reading times each morning to have a major focus from 8.45am until 9am. This will enable us to have more focus on classroom learning directed by the teachers without students going in and out for the first 2 hours to do reading. Students on the late bus will complete their reading on arrival if possible. We have had mostly positive feedback in regard to this and more specific details have been sent out via Flexibuzz. This proposal will be discussed further at School Council tomorrow night

7. Tree Planting Day

This will be held for the whole school on Thursday 26th April with each grade participating down at the silo area near the railway line. No permission forms will go home for this event – it is covered in the local excursion section of the Green form. Parents are welcome to come along and help if they wish and suitable clothing depending on the weather should be worn on this day. Timetable at present is: 9-10am (Grade 5/6), 10-11am (Grade 2/3), 11.30–12.15pm (Grade 3/4) and 12.15–1pm (Grade F/1). Contact the school, if you would prefer for your child to not participate.

8. Beginning Teachers Conference

Miss Love will be away on the first day back next term. She will be attending a conference in Bendigo with other new Graduate teachers and I know this day will be very beneficial for her in her 1st year of teaching. Mrs Montgomery will be teaching the Grade 5/6 students on this day.

9. School Photo Day

This is scheduled for Thursday 3rd May. Photo envelopes will go home to families as soon as they arrive at school. All payments along with envelopes need to be returned before the photo day. More details will be available early next term.

10. Somers Camp

We have had 5 students in Grades 5/6 express interest in this camp. All of these students have received relevant information for this camp and it would be appreciated if the Application and Medical form is handed in this week. The cost for the camp is \$250 – contact the school if you need to set up a Payment Plan. The Somers Camp begins on Tuesday 19th June and concludes on Wednesday 27th June. All families should have received the 1st Parent Circular form and more details regarding groupings and travel arrangements will be available in the future.

11. Attendance Awards

Students with 95% or above attendance will receive attendance awards at the first assembly back after the holidays. At Tallygaroopna PS, we like to acknowledge good attendance, but we do accept that there will be times when children may not be able to attend school for a multitude of reasons.

12. School Hats

Please remember to pack school hats when your children return to school next term. As a Sun-Smart School we wear hats until the end of April.

13. End of Term 1

The last day of Term 1 will be on Thursday 29th March and dismissal will be an hour earlier at 2.25pm. Outside School Hours Care is still available on this day. School resumes on Monday 16th April.

14. Colder Months - Tissues

We would be very appreciative if each family could please supply a box of tissues for the school in anticipation of colder weather (and possibly running noses and coughs!). We remind families to please encourage their children to dress appropriately for the weather.

15. Pie Warmers / Lunch Orders

During second and third terms, students are able to bring along pies, sausage rolls, pizzas, etc to be heated in the pie heater. Food must be wrapped in foil and labelled with the child's name using a permanent marker. This will begin first day back after the holidays. No lunch orders are available in Terms 2 and 3 from the Tally Servo.

16. Breakfast Helpers

We are still seeking some more helpers for our Breakfast program. Obviously, with our enrolments increasing there is more of a need to support these students on each Monday morning. If you can help from 8.30am on Monday mornings please contact the office.

17. School Production Auditions

All grade 5/6 students have received scripts for the school production which is planned for Thursday 13th September (matinee) and Friday 14th September (night performance). The production this year is titled "Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits" and there are a large number of speaking parts. All of the characters are listed in this edition of the newsletter and we are planning to audition early next term. Therefore, any students wishing to try out for specific parts should read their scripts as much as possible in anticipation of auditions and the finalisation of parts. All students are involved in the school production.

18. Leadership Conference

20. Absence Notes

Absence notes are required for all absences. Please use the school absence note or submit an absence on Flexibuzz. Both of these are the preferred methods because they are completed immediately. If either of these are not convenient - please ring the school. Formal notes are needed for audit records and your support would be appreciated. We would prefer no text messages.

What happens if absences continue – 7 days a term turns into 28 days a year, which turns into 196 days over 7 years. This results in a child missing 1 whole year of their Primary School years – something for all of us to think about.

Details in regard to the Grade 5/6 Camp are still to be confirmed. This camp is being coordinated by Dookie PS.

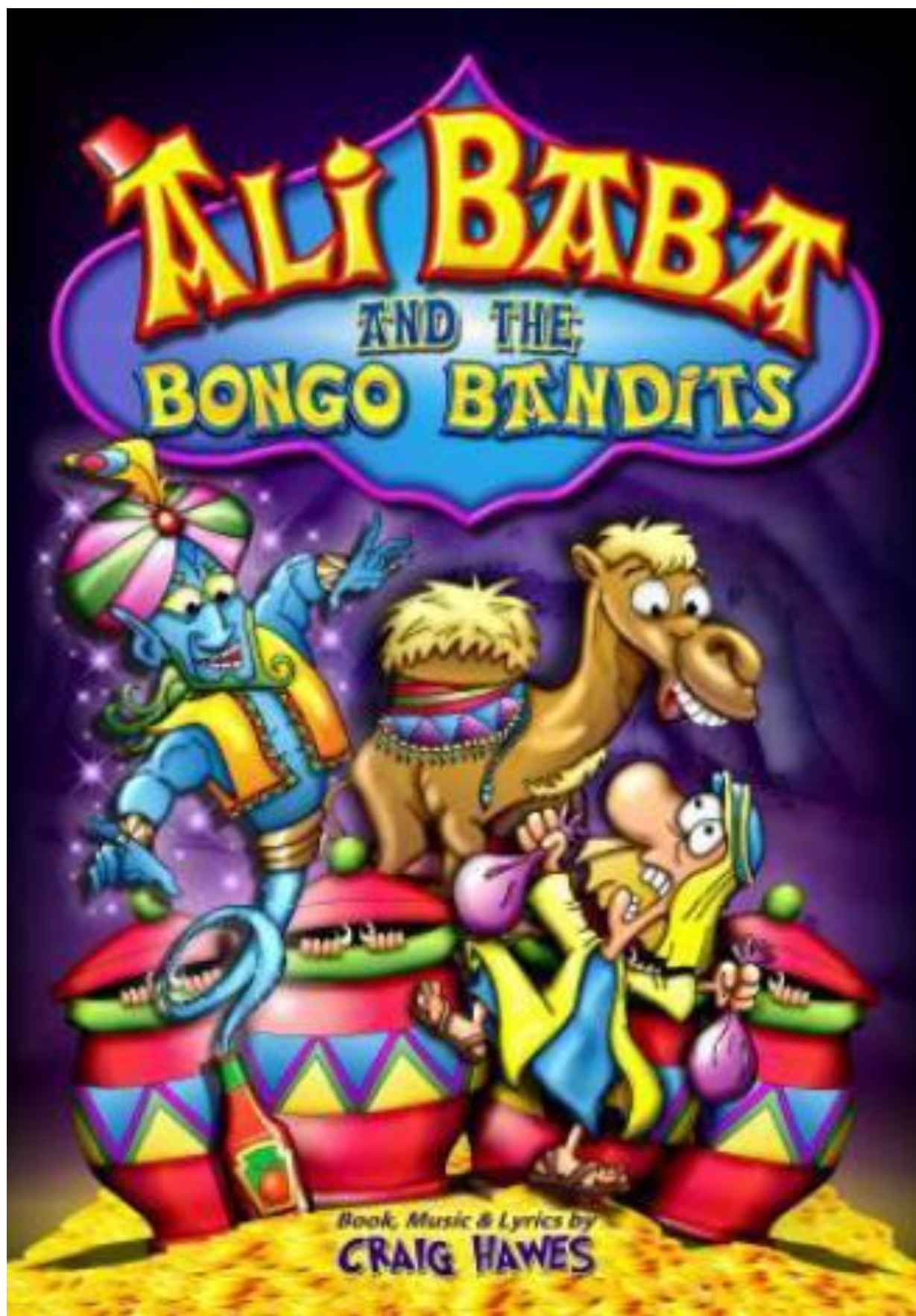
Somers Camp is from Tuesday 19th June until Wednesday 27th June
