



















#### Parents' Club. The way forward.

#### **MUSIC UPDATE**

Lots to share about music this term. The students have made a fabulous start to the year in music and I am delighted to see students participating in all our activities in class. The F/1 and 1/2 class have been singing songs and moving in time to music; today we were even keeping beat to some music by Michael Jackson! The Grade 3/4 class have been having fun on the recorder and are progressively working their way through songs at different levels. When they reach the next level they are rewarded with a coloured loom band to display on the bell of their recorder. The Grade 5/6



class are also learning songs at different levels, but they are playing on the ukuleles. I am really enjoying seeing the students work hard and perform music!

We have also started a choir this term, and I am really enjoying seeing the students grow in confidence with their singing. There is always room for more, so if your child would like to sing with a group please encourage them to come along!

#### **SCIENCE UPDATE**

This term in Science students have been exploring several different study areas. The Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students have been exploring light and sound. They have learnt that sound and light travel in different ways. Sound can move through the air but can also travel through different materials to reach our ears. Light however moves in a direct path from the light source to our eyes. Unless it is reflected off something first.

Grade 3 and 4 students have explored the important role that insects have in the life cycle of plants and the different methods that plants use to disperse their seeds. Student undertook an investigation into which food source was most popular with ants by testing brown sugar, wheat and dry dog food.

Grade 5 and 6 students have explored the adaptations that animals have to survive in different environments focusing on desert animals. Students undertook several investigations looking at adaptions such as surface area of body parts and fur colour.

During Term 2 all students will be undertaking units on Earth and Space Sciences.

We have been directed by the Department of Education to close the school as of Tuesday March 24<sup>th</sup> because of the current situation with the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

We have hard copy packs (resources and classroom worksheets) ready for each student and these will be sent home today. If your child/children will not be attending school today, we ask that you please come into school to collect these items. The resources for each class will vary slightly and each teacher will post a list on Class Dojo so that you can keep track of what has been sent home. Please keep these items together so that they can be returned when school reopens. We have been trialling our transition to remote learning and in the event that school does not commence after the Easter break, we will be continuing to run school programs as best as we can via Class Dojo. We will also be using an online tool called Zoom, which enables all class teachers along with myself to continue to interact with our children. We believe that this will be crucial in maintaining positivity and relationships during this difficult time. More information about Zoom will be posted on Class Dojo in the future if needed.

#### Aguarium Excursion

At this stage we will be holding a whole school excursion to the Melbourne Aquarium on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May. Permission forms will go home early in Term 2 and the cost for this program will be \$20 per student. Our guided program on Ocean Kids – Habitats begins at 11.30am and concludes at 1.30pm. Therefore, we will be aiming to leave at 8am and return at 5pm. Students will need to wear school uniform on this day and bring a morning snack, lunch and a drink. No hats will be needed on this day. We will be aiming to have a morning snack at 11am and then lunch at the conclusion of this program at 1.30pm. More specific details will be available soon.

#### Responsible Pet Program

Our whole school will be participating in this program on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April. The Responsible Pet Ownership Primary School Program is aimed at 5-12 year olds and has been delivered to over 1 million Victorian primary school children. It visits over 800 primary schools each year across the state. The Program includes a dog visit, multimedia tools, role play, song and story time.

The Program focuses on teaching students about dog safety:

- \* when dogs should be left alone
- \* things we should not do to dogs
- \* how can you tell if a dog is happy, frightened or angry
- \* a safe way to approach and greet a dog
- \* what to do if approached by an unknown or aggressive dog.

#### 7. School Fees

School fees for 2020 have been approved at School Council. These were itemised in the letter sent home and are now due. They are as follows:


Foundation - \$217 Grade 1/2 - \$170 Grade 3/4 - \$150, Grade 5/6 - \$155
